Stations of the Cross


This year, Stations of the Cross and the Divine Mercy will be recorded and uploaded to our website each Friday.

Parish Phone Ministry

Our Erie Tri-county Family of Catholic Parishes has organized a team of over 50 parishioners who have, with the blessing of Fr. Ben and Fr. Thomas, accepted the opportunity of forming the **Parish Phone Ministry**. During lent this year, they will phone most of the regular church attendees and have a phone visit with them. The phone visit will end with an offer of saying a prayer to St. Joseph, the patron of the Catholic Church.

The Phone Ministry Volunteers have taken an oath of confidentiality to keep confidential any personal information which they acquire while carrying out a phone visit. They will only share this information with the pastoral team if that is agreed to by the parishioners that they have called. We trust that God will bless this parish effort to grow together as members of the parishes of St. Michael's, Sacred Heart and St. Mary's.

Phone Ministry Prayer

Members of our **Parish Phone Ministry** ask to say a prayer with each of the parishioners that they call. That prayer is particularly appropriate and Deacon Andre hopes that it will become a prayer for many people in our family of Catholic Parishes. It is called **"The Memorare to St. Joseph"** we pray it for the restoration of our parish life.

To the parishioners of Sacred Heart/St. Michael's and the Erie Tri-County Catholic Family of Parishes:

While I know what I am about to write would not be deemed necessary or even wanted for the person for which is about; however, I believe it very important to offer these words of gratitude for our retiring Cemetery Manager and Caretaker at Sacred Heat Langton, and St. Michael's Walsh; Alton Hayek.

Alton has been a pillar for Sacred Heart for nearly 23 years now. He has responded to every need and matter with the upmost of care and dedication. He has been there whenever needed, and has given his all in caring and serving the needs of the families at Sacred Heart and St. Michael's in recent years.

I was blessed to get to know Alton when I was a Seminarian, and never thought I would be there as the Pastor of the Family of Parishes for his retirement. Alton has always been for me the ideal of a church caretaker.

There is great comfort in knowing that Alton was around to see to the necessary maintenance and cleanliness of our churches. Many resources were saved over the years, because of Alton's ability to keep things in order, and even construct things that have been necessary over the years. I never knew the possibilities for a Farmall 140 until I witnessed what Alton did with the one that is used at Sacred Heart.

Alton responded even in these past months with great wisdom and ability to see that everything is in place for maintaining our protocols and safety during the pandemic. His gifts and talents even allowed us to get the small loft at St. Michael's open again, by building and forming a proper railing to meet the safety codes for its use. Every spot we can find for our people to be safely situated in our churches counts, and Alton continually found the way for us to do so.

His leadership, knowledge and on-call flexibility for the Sacred Heart Cemetery is unmatched.

His retirement will form a gap that will be difficult for us to adjust to, but at the same time we are supportive and congratulate him on a well-deserved retirement. February 27th, will be Alton's last day working with us.

The Cemetery Board, under the leadership of Mary DeCloet, has found someone to care for the cemetery as far as preparing the plots for burials and maintaining its aesthetics (cutting and trimming the grass, etc.). The gentleman's name is Teunis Penning and he comes highly recommended by those who are responsible for St. Ladislaus Cemetery. He will be working on contract directly with the Cemetery Board, and I thank the Board for putting into place a smooth transition. Teunis has already been doing some training with Alton before his departure.

The administrative needs of Sacred Heart Cemetery such as the sale of plots, and other business will be handled by Teena Stetler-Mendonca the Business Administrator for our Family of Parishes.

The indoor cleaning of the churches themselves will be handled by Pierre Doneff who is the current custodian at St. Mary's in Tillsonburg. He will now split his time between all three of our church buildings during the week to clean.

I want to thank Bryan Cairns for agreeing to maintain the lawn around Sacred Heart Church and its specific property as separate from the Cemetery.

We have other matters to address, and I will not deny I am sure that some will be identified once Alton departs that we have not properly accounted for. These next months, like so many of the months that have passed since September, remain transition months. For example, we still have to address snow removal around Sacred Heart for the next winter season (whatever snow fall we get in March that requires the Sacred Heart's parking lot to be cleaned, has already been looked after). We will find solutions, and given the situation we are in the pandemic, we are trying to ensure that those solutions are the most economic as possible at the same time wanting the job done right.

One of the things I was looking forward to when I was named Pastor of what is now the Erie Tri-County Catholic Family of Parishes was to be serving and working with Alton. While that time was shorter than I expected, I am thankful for these last months, and took such comfort in knowing whatever was asked would be done, and done beyond our expectations. Alton, to say your presence will be missed is an understatement which exceeds the full meaning of the word understatement itself.

Alton, as I mentioned at the start of these words, you do not believe them necessary, and I know you made clear that you do not want any undue attention drawn to this change and transition that we are all experiencing. Like many a hero in an old Western movie, you want to "fade into the sunset." I, and the many who know you, understand that. However, the things you created, built, and repaired over the years at Sacred Heart/St. Michael's are so much the better for what you have done. We have been blessed to harvest the fruits of your gifts, talents, and toil. Know from the depth of our hearts our gratitude for them, and ultimately our gratitude for yourself.

God's Blessings be upon you Alton, and your family. Know always the home you have with us, and we know that what transpires now is not a goodbye, but simply a "so long".

I ask the parishioners of the Erie Tri-County Catholic Family of Parishes to pray for Alton and his family as he begins his retirement from Sacred Heart/St.Michael's, but we know he will still keep busy doing other things!
