### *Fr. Lance's Letter*

You see signs informing the public that schools are closed, and we need to watch out for children. We need to stop and give them the right of way. Our children are very precious and most important to us. We live, work and do everything for their good and happiness.

As a church we understand that all of us are called “children of God”, and this we are because our loving God has created us and fondly impressed His own Image and Likeness into us. St. Virgil is always open to let us know of the importance and preciousness of who we are to God and to each other. I like to thank all parents and grandparents for coming to church on the weekends as a family of faith, of love and of commitment to God, to our parish and to each other.

During this past week we (Parish Pastoral Council and the Senior Leadership Team) have been meeting to look into our Mission and Vision as a community of faith. A Mission statement drives our parish. It expresses what we do, the reason for our existence. Our Mission states how we like to exercise our faith and beliefs, the ways in which we like to achieve our common goal. Things that we value most are part of this Mission Statement.

It has been more than twenty years since our current Mission Statement was crafted. We do not want to lose or discard our past. We need to start from where we are and work together to move on and forward.

Words are important as they give significance and direction to our Mission. First, we call ourselves a “parish”. The origin is from the Greek: *para* = near; and *oikos* = house which points to “neighborhood” or community, or a gathering of neighbors. [The other option is to use the word: “Church” which has a stronger connotation of a structure rather than of an assembly]. Being a Parish would lead us to know one another, recognize each other even by name, support each other especially through prayer, enjoy welcoming each other; “greet one another with the sign of peace”. To be part of St. Virgil Parish requires a lot of effort. It means that each of us must reach out and cordially invite others into our faith community. Hospitality has to become the way of each member of St. Virgil Parish. Being friendly, warm, inviting, congenial; favorable, pleasant, complaisant, sympathetic; expressing through our words and gestures that we are family and appreciate each other are the basic ingredients of being “parish”.

This Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time proclaims the Gospel event of Jesus’ visit to his home town of Nazareth. That was his home parish. The attitudes displayed did not foster a healthy parish. Actually, the Gospel states that “there was a lack of faith”. The folks of Nazareth did not appreciate Jesus. They were critical. They questioned. They closed their minds and hearts. They were disagreeable. Yet, there were some who did invite, welcome and embrace Jesus. To those who did the “miracles”, blessings, healings, and the joys of being “neighbors”, of being a parish were felt and experienced. Having a positive stance was most helpful, even then.

For this week, let us consider what it means to be a “parish”. Talk about it at home, among your circle of friends, in your bible study and prayer groups. If you arrive at something you like to share, send it over to me and we shall be happy to let our parishioners know about it.

May we all feel welcome and important at St. Vigil Parish - *Fr. Lance*

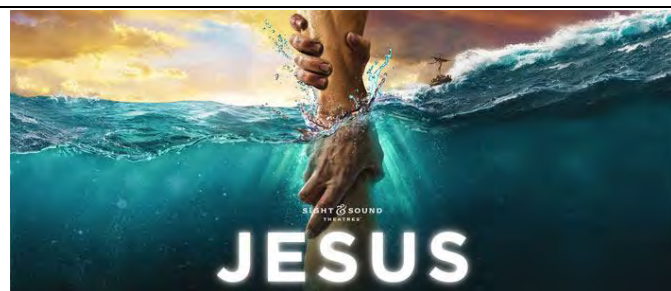

### OPERATION CHILLOUT - SUMMER OUTREACH

*Serving homeless veterans since December 21, 2000*

Throughout the summer months, volunteers from Operation Chillout deliver lightweight clothing, hats and bottled water to the homeless, many of who are veterans. These items are regularly delivered to places where the homeless congregate for lunch, their one substantial meal per day, and other essential services (*e.g.*, Community Soup Kitchen and Our Promise, both in Morristown). Last summer, over 32,000 bottles of water plus 1,500 new tee shirts and caps were delivered to 35 separate locations in New Jersey.

Since there is a considerable inventory of bottled water already, St. Virgil's has been asked to provide only the following items:

- **NEW** tee shirts (men and women, sizes M, L and XL)
- **NEW** baseball caps
- cash or checks payable to either Operation Chillout, Inc. or St. Virgil's Church
- gift cards (Walmart\*, Costco or ShopRite only, please)

\* \$25 Walmart gift cards are available in the parish office

Hats and tee shirts may be deposited in the carton near the altar. Please place monetary donations in an envelope marked "Operation Chillout" and place in the collection basket. We will purchase additional clothing with the cash and checks payable to St. Virgil's. Operation Chillout, Inc. is a registered 501(c)3 not-for-profit charitable organization. Your donations are tax deductible to the amount permitted by law. The organization does not solicit by either mail or telemarketing.

## Weekly Reflections

### **Fourteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time** **Mark 6:1-6**

In today's Gospel Mark continues his emphasis on faith. Christ returns to His hometown and, again, the town folks seemed incapable of having the faith in Christ that the synagogue official and the woman had demonstrated in last week's Gospel. Being Christ's kin, or neighbor, or Church official does not matter to Him; only faith in Him is needed. And with that faith Christ can heal us; without it He shall do nothing.

Mark recounts many miracles of Christ. This was the first Gospel written, and Mark demonstrates that it was very important to chronicle these miracles of Christ for those who would be reading his Gospel in the future, as a source of their faith in Him. It was very important to Mark that we get the message that Christ was not just a wonder-worker, but One Who could look into the hearts of those who came to Him to be cured of their troubles. His miracles were not the important thing. Again, and again, it was the faith that mattered. Those whom He helped did not have to be what we would see as a "good" person, or an "important" person. Those things mean nothing to Christ. All He needs from us is faith in Him to receive His mercy.

***Lord, help not to judge others!***



#### **EVANGELIZATION CORNER**

In last week's column we wrote that, *"To evangelize in today's modern world, one must become an agent of Christ in our daily lives."* That is, we must reflect and integrate Jesus's teachings into our daily lives and be able to clearly articulate why you believe that Christ is the Messiah, the Son of God, what Jesus has done for you, what he means to you, and why you see that he is the answer to the world's problems.

In the opening of his encyclical *Deus*, Pope Benedict states, *"We have come to believe in God's*

*love: in these words, the Christian can express the fundamental decision of his life. Being Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction."*

Christ calls each of us to become a saint; he calls each of us to holiness. Our journey to holiness is a process that starts with an inner conversion; something that through the power of the Holy Spirit changes our lives and sets our lives on a different course. The Gospel is our invitation to discipleship.

Many of us are "born Catholics". That is, we were born into Catholic families. But, unless we undergo conversion, we have not truly accepted the Gospel. In accepting the Gospel, we reject sin and become more faithful disciples in Christ's Church. Those who are active in parish life and celebrate the Eucharist have heard and accepted the Gospel message and have had their lives impacted in a significant way.

As we make an effort to grow in holiness, evangelization becomes a natural expression of our love for Christ, and our witness is exactly what is needed in today's secular world. Having a specific Catholic identity is a powerful evangelization tool. To evangelize means to show others, as Jesus did, the art of living, the path toward happiness, the path toward holiness.

May His grace be with each of us as we continue on our journey with Jesus.
