Pastor's Page

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany. In some countries, this is always celebrated on Jan. 6, but in others, such as ours, it is celebrated on the Sunday after the celebration of the Holy Family. This year the Epiphany happens to fall on Jan. 6. As the Catechism describes, "The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God, and Savior of the world. The great feast of Epiphany celebrates the adoration of Jesus by the wise men (Magi) from the East, together with his Baptism in the Jordan, and the first miracle at the Wedding Feast at Cana in Galilee."

The scene of the Magi is one we are all familiar with, but maybe we are not always familiar with some of the facts of the story. The Magi were from the East, possibly from Persia or Chaldea (they were known to have worshipped a star as a god). Some Church Fathers held they were descendants of Balaam, because that is whom the prophecy "there shall rise a star out of Jacob" came from (Numbers 24:17). In the tradition, the names applied to the three Magi are Balthazar, Gaspar, and Melchior. Though we often sing of them as "three kings," they were most likely astrologers. The practice of referring to them as kings most likely comes from the wealth of the gifts they presented to the Christ child. Some scholars hold that there were more than the three magi who came and they could possibly have some princely status because they had large caravans. Though these men were astrologers, God uses what they were familiar with to lead them to the truth (it is not God giving approval of astrology). Most likely, though they were not Israelites, they would have been familiar with some of the Messianic prophecies of the Israelites.


The gifts they brought were gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Gold is a gift of wealth and a symbol of royalty, so whether or not the Magi realized it, they were honoring the kingship of Christ. Frankincense is a powdered perfume that is burned at the altar as a symbol of hope in

the Messiah. As it burns, the smoke rises from it and gives off a pleasant smell. It symbolizes our prayers being lifted up to God. Therefore the Magi, whether they knew it or not, were honoring Jesus' divinity.

We use incense in the sacred liturgy (we can use it at the beginning of Mass, at the proclamation of the Gospel, at the Offertory, and during funerals at the Final Commendation) and in Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Today, we place incense in a gold or silver "thurible" (a metal case which has a cover and is usually connected to a chain) in which we light a piece of burning charcoal. The incense is usually in some type of powdered or pebbled form (there are many different types). When we put the incense on the charcoal it begins to burn and gives off the smoke and aroma. The container we use which holds in the incense is referred to as the "boat."

The third gift is myrrh, an oil which is used for anointing the body. This particular oil is used to anoint the body at the time of death as a way to honoring it. Here, the Magi were honoring Jesus' humanity, and also, most likely not realizing, honoring his mission, which is to die for us on the cross so as to redeem humanity.

We hear in the gospel at the time of Our Lord's burial that the women would return Easter morning to apply ointments to the body of Jesus as a way of honoring him, for they did not have time on Good Friday because of the approaching Sabbath. Some in the tradition of the Church have held that the women brought the myrrh that was given to the Christ child by the Magi. Often, the Church uses oils in blessings (such as giving a person a blessing with St. Joseph's oil) and in the sacraments (the Oil of the Catechumen for Baptism; the Oil of Chrism for Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Orders; and the Oil of the Sick for the Anointing of the Sick).

Women's Day of Recollection

On Saturday, Jan. 12, there will be a Women's Day of Recollection in the church beginning at 9 a.m. and concluding with Benediction at 10:30 a.m. It includes Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, two preached meditations, and Confessions. Prior to the Day of Recollection, there is Mass at 8 a.m., and a brief reception in the lower church before Exposition.

Time of the Thursday evening Mass

Every Thursday we have Mass at 6:30 p.m. The attendance is low, so I would like to have feedback about whether there is another time in the evening that parishioners would prefer. So if you think you would attend daily Mass on Thursday evenings if it was at a different time, please let me know. If there are many that do request a time different than 6:30 I will make a change.

Need For Adorers

One of the greatest gifts we have here is the continuous access to spend time before Our Lord present in the Blessed Sacrament. But for perpetual adoration to continue we need many people committed to coming each week. The night time is our greatest challenge (some parishioners cover for several hours straight). When Our Lord is exposed in the Blessed Sacrament there should always be someone present. If you are not a committed Adorer, please consider covering for others when they cannot make it, or, even more helpful, committing to a weekly time to come. With the night shift, I ask men in particular to consider helping out, because some women are covering for several hours during the night.




