Pastor's Page


Today we conclude the Christmas Season with the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord and tomorrow we begin Ordinary Time. Jesus did not need baptism but said to John the Baptist that it was necessary for him to be baptized. Theologians say the Lord did it to show us the path that is necessary for us. In this great event the Trinity is manifested by the voice of God the Father and the descent of Holy Spirit upon Jesus in the form of a dove.

Baptism is necessary for our salvation. (The New Testament makes it clear it is necessary for us to have eternal life in heaven). By this great sacrament we are made children of God and members of the Church. We also receive sanctifying grace, become temples of the Holy Spirit, and are cleansed of original sin. The Church sees the sacrament as so important that even infants who do not understand the sacrament should be baptized as soon as possible after their birth. You will not find baptism of infants spoken of in the Scriptures, but we know it was being done in the early Church (one of the oldest documents in the Church, The Apostolic Tradition from approximately 215 A.D., speaks about baptizing infants). The parents make that act of faith on their baby's behalf, and as their child receives the great gift of faith, the parents promise to the Lord they will do all they can to foster the child's faith. The parent must show there is a reasonable hope the child will be raised in the faith.

This is also why we have godparents. The godparents represent the Catholic Church and testify that they will do all they can to help the parents raise their child in the practice of the faith. Because they are representing the Church, in the Code of Canon Law the Catholic Church says there must be certain qualifications for a godparent: they must have received the full initi-

ation of the faith (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation); they must be living their lives in accordance with the teachings of the Church (for example: they are faithfully practicing their Catholic faith with Mass every Sunday and holy day; if married, they are married sacramentally in the Church, they are not living in any immoral situation, etc.); and they are at least 16 years old (this deals with the question of maturity). The Church does allow for one godparent and another witness called a Christian Witness, who is not a godparent but is recorded as an official witness of the baptism. The Christian Witness is someone who was baptized as a Christian, but cannot be a Catholic who doesn't qualify as a godparent, or a Catholic who joined some other Christian denomination later.

At Our Lady of Mount Carmel, if you are looking to baptize your baby (it is best to try to line these things up before one's child is born) then you should talk to someone about being a godparent. You need at least one godparent but you can have two godparents (if there are two, one must be male and the other female). The people you ask to be godparents will need to talk to the priest in the parish to which they currently belong about having the priest sign a sponsor form that says they qualify as a godparent. Please do not ask someone to be a godparent who may not qualify, because it ends up putting the priest or deacon in a bad position of telling them they don't qualify. Even though they may be a very nice person, and a great friend or relative, please remember this is about having someone who models the faith for you and your child. Once you have the sponsor form from the godparent or godparents, then contact the office about scheduling the baptism, which we offer every Sunday at noon. If you need a sponsor form signed because you have

been asked about being a godparent or sponsor for confirmation, please contact our parish office.

Time of the Thursday evening Mass

Every Thursday we have Mass at 6:30 p.m. The attendance is low, so I would like to have feedback about whether there is another time in the evening that parishioners would prefer. So if you think you would attend daily Mass on Thursday evenings if it was at a different time, please let me know. If there are many that do request a time different than 6:30 I will make a change.

Need For Adorers

One of the greatest gifts we have here is the continuous access to spend time before Our Lord present in the Blessed Sacrament. But for perpetual adoration to continue we need many people committed to coming each week. The night time is our greatest challenge (some parishioners cover for several hours straight). When Our Lord is exposed in the Blessed Sacrament there should always be someone present. If you are not a committed Adorer, please consider covering for others when they cannot make it, or, even more helpful, committing to a weekly time to come. With the night shift, I ask men in particular to consider helping out, because some women are covering for several hours during the night.




