## Pastor's Page

Two weeks ago I explained before the Masses some of the different religious vessels and items we use at Mass. First is the altar itself, which is at the center of the sacrifice of the Mass, where our offerings are placed and united to the perfect offering of Jesus. It is usually made of marble, granite, wood, or some other solid material. Because the altar is the center of worship, once Mass has started, whenever we are passing by the altar during Mass, we bow (outside of Mass, our focus is on the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist in the tabernacle, so we genuflect when we are passing it).


On the altar, or beside the altar, there are at least two candles. The lighted candles show our devotion to Jesus, who is the light of the world. In some churches you may see up to six candles on the altar. Also, the candle that is always lit and stands or hangs next to the tabernacle where Jesus remains in the Eucharist is called a sanctuary lamp. Here at Mount Carmel, it is on a gold stand, and the candle is within a red globe to the left of the tabernacle.

The readings from the Scriptures are proclaimed from the lectern or ambo (similar to a pulpit), and the lay person who reads the readings from the Scriptures is called the lector.

At the time of the offertory, different sacred vessels are used. First is the chalice. This is a cup into which we pour the wine and a few drops of water which will become the Blood of Christ. The chalice must be made of a precious metal since it will hold within it the King of Kings. Also, it should be of a precious metal that is not porous, nor something that could break easily. There is also the ciborium which many times looks like a chalice but has a metal lid on it. This contains all the bread that will become the Eucharist.

You will notice that when the chalice is brought up, it is covered with several things. First you will see the chalice

veil, which is the color of the vestment the priest is wearing for the Mass. In writing about the chalice veil, Fr. Jerry Pokorsky of [www.adoremus.org](http://www.adoremus.org) wrote: "The veiled chalice can highlight both the relationship and the distinction between the two main parts of the Mass, the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Just as the Gospel book which contains God's Word is adorned and dignified with beautiful covers, so the vessels that will contain the Body and Blood of the Lord should be adorned and dignified with the veil. Also, since the chalice is the visible sign of the Eucharist, it seems appropriate that it should be veiled during the first part of the Mass, the Liturgy of the Word. The source of a deeper symbolic meaning of the chalice veil is found in the Scriptures. As prescribed in Exodus and described in Hebrews, a veil or curtain separated the Holy of Holies from the rest of the Temple: 'For a tent was prepared, the outer one, in which were the lampstand and the table and the bread of the Presence; it is called the Holy Place. Behind the second curtain stood a tent called the Holy of Holies, having the golden altar of incense and the ark of the covenant covered on all sides with gold, which contained a golden urn holding the manna, and Aaron's rod that budded, and the tables of the covenant' (Hebrews 9:2-4). The chalice veil reminds us of the curtain setting apart the Holy of Holies, and prompts us to approach the altar aware of our unworthiness to enter into union with God. The removal of the chalice veil is one of the first liturgical actions at the Offertory in preparation for the reception of the gifts of bread and wine from the congregation. The removal of the veil following the Liturgy of the Word signifies that the sacred mysteries are about to be revealed. Despite the barrier of our unworthiness, the unveiling of the chalice invites us to enter into the celebration of the sacred mysteries. When the veil is removed, the splendor of the chalice is exposed."

On top of the chalice veil is the burse. This is a square piece which matches the chalice veil and it holds the corporal. The corporal is a white square linen cloth which is placed on the altar and those hosts which are to be consecrated will be placed on it. Practically, it is also used to help catch any small particles of the Eucharist that may break off.

There is also a white linen cloth called the purificator that is used for wiping any drops of the Precious Blood of Christ and to purify or cleanse the chalice and ciborium so there will not be left any remains of the particles of the Eucharist and Precious Blood of Christ. Lastly, there is a small gold or silver dish that the main Eucharist is placed on, and it is called the paten.

### **First Saturday Anointing of the Sick**


On Saturday, April 6, we will have our regular daily Mass at 9 a.m. At that Mass we will also have the Anointing of the Sick. The Anointing is for those who are facing any danger of death due to illness, who are facing surgery which will entail anesthesia, or for those who are elderly and frail.

### **Day of Recollection for Women**

On Saturday, April 13, we will have our monthly Day of Recollection for Women in the church at 9 a.m. It will consist of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, two preached meditations, a talk by a lay woman on some practical aspect of living the faith, an opportunity for the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and Benediction. All women are welcome. Prior to the Day of Recollection, there is Mass at 8 a.m., open to everyone.
