**Reception for Father Ryan Healy next Sunday**

He will celebrate the 10:45 a.m. Mass at Our Lady of Mount Carmel on Sunday, June 23. Immediately after, we will have a light reception in the lower church so that parishioners may congratulate Father Ryan and receive his first blessing.

**Corpus Christi procession, altars next Sunday**

On Sunday, June 23, there will be a Corpus Christi Eucharistic Procession at 2 p.m. The procession will go around to four altars around the parking lot, stopping at each one to reflect on the gift of Jesus Christ in Eucharist, singing songs in honor of the Lord, and praying for different intentions. It is my hope each altar will be decorated by parishioners and at each altar, one set of prayers we will be for the intentions of that individual or family (or group of people who team up to set up the altar). If you are interested in decorating an altar, please contact Father Kevin. The procession, concluding with Benediction, usually takes 45 minutes. In case of bad weather, the prayers will take place in the church with the Eucharist Exposed and conclude with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

## Pastor's Page

As the summer approaches, it will be wonderful to be able to be out in the sun and enjoy the beautiful outdoors. We often get into the mindset of relaxation and rest and taking things a little easier (which we need ... we are not machines and rest and recreation is renewing for us). But, let us also remember that resting and being renewed is not just a physical thing, but even more it is something needed for the soul. Though physical rest may help us feel at peace and less anxious or worried, ultimately real rest and renewal is brought about by resting in the love of the Lord.

This is why we need to make that conscious effort throughout the summer, no matter what we are carrying out (whether it is our usual routine or we are on vacation), to rest in Christ in the Mass and in our personal prayer. If you are travelling this summer, make sure you prepare your trip by looking into where and when masses are offered and make it a priority. Wherever you are going, search on your computer where the closest Catholic churches are and then check their websites for their Mass times, or visit [mass.times.org](http://mass.times.org).

While taking it easier during the summer, maybe you can make more time for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in our perpetual adoration chapel on the left side of the church. The chapel is open 7 days a week, 24 hours a day, and it is a beautiful chapel (the altar and stained-glass windows are from the original Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church). St. Joseph's Chapel is such a wonderful quiet place to pray and be in the presence of Our Lord (and as a perk ... it is air conditioned).


But, also think about if you are traveling there are so many chances to enjoy your summer and increase that joy by fostering your love for the Lord and one another. Think about your travel time. As you are in the car, maybe you can pray the Rosary with the family (it only takes 15-20 minutes). I can remember as a kid we would often pray the Rosary

in the car, and whenever my mother or father first suggested it, there was that awkward lack of response or subtle groan by us, but once we did it I always found there was a little more joy or peace in the car and in my heart. It helps foster your faith and your children's faith while going on some adventure.

Maybe when you are relaxing and you have some down time, think about reading a good Catholic book for spiritual reading. Here is a simple practical thing: read for only 10 minutes a day from a good Catholic book (maybe one of those that are considered spiritual classics). If you foster that every day, you will be surprised how much you learn over time and it nourishes your personal prayer. Also, read 5 minutes from the New Testament each day (which is usually a chapter) and in time you will have a much deeper awareness of the Scriptures and the life of Christ.

Another simple thing while relaxing is going on Formed (the parish paid for a subscription for everyone, so check in the bulletin for directions on how to register) and watching some of the videos. Sometimes just those few minutes can stir many thoughts of our faith that can inspire, challenge, or uplift our hearts.

If you are traveling to new places you have never been before, check if there are any Catholic shrines to visit where you can experience the beauty of what our brothers and sisters have built, or maybe you will find out some fascinating history about the Church in that area. For example, if traveling in northern New York, stop by the Shrine of the North American Martyrs; if going to Washington, D.C., go to the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception; if near Philadelphia, maybe visit the Shrine of St. John Neumann; in New York City, go to St. Patrick's Cathedral or St. Vincent Ferrer Church; maybe a day trip to the newly renovated Holy Cross Cathedral in Boston; if near Gettysburg, go to the town of Emmits-

burg, Md., where there is the Basilica of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton and you can tour where she lived; if in Montreal visit the Shrine of St. Anne; and other day trips are to the Shrine of St. Therese in Nasonville, R.I., and the Divine Mercy Shrine in Stockbridge. There are so many wonderful things to experience to help us grow in the awareness of the mystery and love of God.

### **Rosaries Available**


In the Adoration Chapel there is a basket with plastic rosaries for anyone to take. But, though the most important thing is praying the Rosary, sometimes people want to have a rosary that may be a little nicer quality than the plastic ones we give out. One of the parishioners, when reading about some of the rosaries being taken from the statue of Our Lady, wanted to offer rosaries and single decade rosaries for anyone who is looking for rosaries that may be of a higher quality. He has made many rosaries and single decade rosaries (it is a chain with only one decade on it) and would like people to have them if they are looking for ones that aren't plastic. If you would like one, just ask Fr. Kevin and he will give you one.
