Holy Hour on Friday for diocesan planning success

Bishop Edgar M. da Cunha, S.D.V., is asking that Friday, July 26, the feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, be a special Day of Prayer for the success of the work of the Planning Commissions now underway in the Fall River Diocese as part of the overall Rebuilding in Faith and Hope initiative.

All are encouraged to pray that the Holy Spirit will continue to guide and inspire the members of the Planning Commissions as they now work to bring their months-long efforts to a fruitful conclusion.

In the evening of that day a Holy Hour will be offered in one church in most deaneries to provide an opportunity for all from the region to join together in prayer for this important intention. The Holy Hours will take place at 7 p.m. on Friday, July 26, in Holy Name Church, Fall River; St. Mary Church, New Bedford; St. Mary Church, Norton; and St. Ann Church, Raynham.

Pastor's Page

Continuing from last week, there are many great books that have been written that can help us grow in understanding and living our faith. One challenge is figuring out whether a book is faithful to Revelation and the Church's teaching or if it something which may claim things which are contrary to our faith.

One safeguard to look for is in the opening pages of the book. One should notice if it has an "Imprimatur" and "nihil obstat." These two things are required to be in certain publications, not others (though it is helpful to the reader to know a book is faithful to our faith when it does have it). The Imprimatur is shown by a small cross and then a bishop's name next to it. It means that the bishop, as a successor of an apostle, is saying this book can be printed for the faithful.

The Our Sunday Visitor Catholic Encyclopedia explains the Imprimatur in this way: "Literally, 'let it be printed,' the imprimatur is required for publication of certain religious or scriptural texts. The law" (canon law) "requires that all books of the Sacred Scriptures, including translations, be published with the permission of the Holy See or the Episcopal conference. The publication of liturgical books also requires the permission of the Holy See. Publication of catechisms, prayer books, and books about morals, Scripture, theology, Church history or canon law that will be used as textbooks are to receive the approval of the bishop or other competent ecclesiastical authority before being published. The law no longer requires that any book about a religious subject receive the imprimatur. It does urge, however, that books about religious subjects that are not to be used as textbooks be submitted for approval."

For example, take a look at your Bible. On the front pages, look for the little cross and bishop's name next to it. If there is not one there it means it is not an approved Catholic Bible (which


means it is either missing certain books of the Bible or that it is a translation which is not faithful to God's Word which is originally written in Hebrew and Greek). Because the Scriptures are written in these ancient languages, there are different ways words can be translated, but however they are translated, they must be faithful to the original meaning. This is why Bibles used by the Jehovah Witnesses or Mormons are not truly the Bible because the translations are so far off they do not convey what the Holy Spirit revealed through the human authors.

The "Nihil Obstat" is also needed in these publications. It literally means "nothing obstructs," meaning that the book does not say things contrary to the faith. This is always found just below or near the Imprimatur.

Also, it is nice to know the publishers that tend to publish some very good books for spiritual reading or theological study. There are obviously many publishers who are very good, and some of the major publishing companies who are printing not only Catholic books (and some excellent ones) but also other books as well. But here is a small list of some that you can always count on publishing excellent Catholic books: Ignatius Press, Scepter Publishers, Sophia Institute Press, Daughters of St. Paul (Pauline Press), Our Sunday Visitor, Tan Publishers (they tend to publish mostly older books), Midwest Theological Forum, Alba House, Roman Catholic Books, and Christian Classics.



Benefits of Eucharistic Adoration

One of the extraordinary gifts Our Lady of Mount Carmel offers is Perpetual Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

Every week hundreds of people stop by our church to spend time in prayer with Jesus, even many who are not parishioners of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. But this is only possible due to the commitment of many people who regularly cover times in the St. Joseph Adoration Chapel to pray before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Many adorers are older. Some have been able to commit over many years, but now, for health reasons, are not able to regularly cover like they used to.

Adoration can be done by people of any age, but a committed adorer should be an adult. If you are hesitant to add another commitment to your schedule, know that this commitment is life-changing. Churches that have frequent adoration report that parishioners grow closer to Jesus Christ and often find the experience of Adoration gives them much peace.

If you have a family, consider covering a certain day or time, at times together, other times splitting up. This may be a powerful way that the Lord unites your family. If you are a young adult, consider a committed time every week. You may find that you are able to discern the Lord's vocation for you, and it will foster a deep silence that your heart yearns for the busier you are.

Late through the night we need adorers. Men are encouraged to consider covering those times. If you are a young mother who wants to take part, perhaps the parish can organize a time of day when older parishioners could babysit in the lower church so you can have time for silent prayer, and maybe to after with other mothers in a support group.

Perhaps a parish ministry's members could team up to cover a certain hour every day. Not only would you be supporting each other in faith, but the Lord may bless your efforts so that your ministry bears even greater fruit.
