## Pastor's Page

This week, as our nation focuses on Halloween (the Eve of the Hallow or Holy), the Church is focusing on all our brothers and sisters who have died and are judged by God to be forever in His glory in heaven, the saints. All Saints Day is on Friday, Nov. 1, and it is a holy day of obligation for us. There will be a vigil Mass on Thursday, Oct. 31 at 5 p.m. On Friday, Nov. 1, the Masses will be at 9 a.m., 12 noon (good for those who are working and can make it during their lunch break), and 7 p.m.

A holy day of obligation means we have the moral obligation to participate in the Mass on that day because it is such a crucial mystery of our faith (to give praise and thanks to God for). On All Saints Day we remember those saints who are canonized by the Church — those officially declared saints after the Church does an extensive study of their lives and sees how they lived heroic virtue, and God has given us proof of their sanctity by two miracles that have been attributed to their intercession. But we also remember all our brothers and sisters who are in heaven, and therefore as saints share in the same reward as those whom the Church has canonized.

On the following day, Nov. 2, we remember those who have died and have been judged by God for heaven but are still in need of being purified of attachments to sin or need to make reparation for past sins. This day we call All Souls Day and it is a reminder we should make concrete efforts to pray for the souls in purgatory (and since we share in the communion of saints with them, we can assist them with our prayers and sacrifices). Liturgically the priest can wear black, purple, or white for those Masses. There is also the tradition that on All Souls the priest can offer three Masses for the souls in purgatory, so I will be offering Masses at 8 a.m., 10 a.m., and 11:15 a.m. (At the 11:15 a.m. Mass, we will also remember those who died this last month and we will also have the anointing of the sick offered).


### Used Religious Items

Many times people drop off different blessed religious items they no longer are using or that deceased loved ones had, and they are trying to figure out what to do with them. If a religious article has been blessed, or if it is a Bible which has fallen apart, one should not throw it away, but should either bury it or burn it out respect that it was blessed. But another way is sometimes discovering others may want them and one can give the blessed item to them. Knowing that, sometimes people just drop them off at the church, which is really not the right thing to do because it then makes the church, if no one wants the items, have the bury them or burn them.

So, I thought maybe we could try on the weekend of Nov. 10 to put out on some tables downstairs religious articles that are in decent condition that people no longer want yet others may be interested in. (If you know they are not in good condition, please bury or burn them yourselves). If you have any religious articles or Bibles that you wish to pass on to others, just bring them to the parish office over the next two weeks, or put them on the table in the choir room at the base of the front stairs. We will simply put them all out on the tables that weekend and parishioners can then head down after the Masses and take whatever they are interested in to use. (You should not take them and then sell them, because one should never sell blessed articles). Any items left after that weekend will be burned or buried (I don't want to spend weeks afterwards trying to find a home for whatever is left over).

### Bishop da Cunha's New Blog



### **Signature drive here Nov. 1-2**

An initiative petition to amend the Massachusetts constitution to permit the state to exclude abortion services from state-funded health care has been duly filed and now requires thousands of signatures to be placed as a referendum vote on the state ballot for November 2020.

This petition responds to two bills before the state legislature which our bishops consider “deeply troubling” for expanding state funding for abortion for virtually any reason during the nine months of pregnancy while eliminating protections to children who survive abortions. The bishops indicate that the result of the House and Senate bills would be abortion on demand through the full nine months of pregnancy.

Please consider recording your signature on the petition form on Nov. 1-2 after the weekend Masses. Tables will be set up by parishioner volunteers for this purpose. It is vital that all people of good conscience respond to this deliberate legislative push by our own Massachusetts elected representatives for increased abortion when society has already begun to have fewer abortions. Thank you for your consideration and participation in this new effort.
