## Pastor's Page

Some people have noted to me how in the years past at the 9 a.m. Mass on Sundays we had the children come forward at the homily in the Mass. As you know I have not been doing it over the last year. I am willing to do it periodically, but in a way that will both engage the children and at the same time foster awareness of the sacred mysteries we are present at in the Mass. The homily will be preached directly to them with the hope they will grow in their understanding and from it the living of their faith. I hope that by doing this it can make the Mass more engaging for the children, and hopefully the simplified message will resonate with adults as well. But children, like all of us, must learn that the Mass is not entertainment but a mystery to be participated in. Participation is not only external actions (for example, their coming up for the homily), but more importantly, internally actions within our souls (not only kneeling and standing and sitting, or saying the necessary responses and singing praise to God, or praying for different intentions, but just as importantly offering our joys and sorrows, listening and responding in our hearts, giving praise and thanks to God, etc.).


I have decided this will not be every week but approximately once a month because there are many messages of the faith that need to be directed to all the adults. Also, since the deacons preach every other weekend right now, I would like them to focus on preaching to the parish as a whole. In general, though sometimes some homilies may not be grasped by the children, it is the role of their parents after Mass to talk to them about the different messages or the homily in the Mass because the parent can then curtail it to their particular age. This is the challenge of giving a homily just to children: unlike with adults, when speaking with a child, the age differences between the children can make a huge challenge as to how to explain the faith and types of analogies to give.

Another challenge with a homily just for the children is some adults enjoy it simply because they themselves are looking to be entertained rather than recognizing that they need to reflect on the mysteries of Christ and to be challenged in the faith. As a modern culture we are so much in a mentality of being entertained we can unconsciously come to Mass still looking to be entertained rather than participating fully and consciously in the victory of Christ's death and resurrection. Even as a priest, there can be a dangerous temptation of wanting to entertain the people rather than calling them to Christ and conversion (and we see this in such a prevalent way in so many parishes where people come and go because they are looking for the personality of the priest who entertains rather than seeing if he is bringing the gospel message).

When calling the children forward, I will have them sit on the floor in front of the sanctuary and I will come down to them. I know in the years past the children sat up in the sanctuary at the homily, and though it does allow the people to see the children, this can also foster the mentality for the children that the sanctuary is like a stage (which it is not ... it is an area designated for sacred actions, which is why those who enter the sanctuary come up because they have an important role in those sacred actions). The children that should come forward will be those who want to come forward and are able to sit and listen. I hope this will be something that helps the children and all of us to grow in our love for Christ.

### **Marian Medals**






