Pastor's Page

"We have come to do Him homage."

These are the words of the Magi as they came across the path of Herod. Let us think about how the Magi came from such a great distance to see the newborn king, but especially let us reflect on their words, which reveal their ultimate intention: to do him homage (to adore him). Though they did not have a complete understanding of who Jesus was as perfect God and perfect man, nor of his mission to bring redemption for humanity by dying on the cross and rising from the dead, they recognized their need to adore.

When talking about the act of adoring, the glossary of the Catechism of the Catholic Church explains adoring as: "The acknowledgment of God as God, Creator and Savior, the Lord and Master of everything that exists. Through worship and prayer, the Church and individual persons give to God the adoration which is the first act of the virtue of religion. The first commandment of God obliges us to adore: *You shall worship the Lord, your God, and Him only shall you serve.* (Deut. 6)"

In the Catechism it states: "To adore God is to acknowledge, in respect and absolute submission, the 'nothingness of the creature' who would not exist but for God. To adore God is to praise and exalt Him and to humble oneself, as Mary did in the Magnificat, confessing with gratitude that he has done great things and holy is his name. The worship of the one God sets man free from turning in on himself, from the slavery of sin and the idolatry of the world." (CCC 2097)


Also, the Catechism talks about adoration being the principle act of the virtue of religion (CCC 2628): "Adoration is the first attitude of man acknowledging that he is the creature before his Creator. It exalts the greatness of the Lord who made us and the almighty power of the Savior who sets us free from evil. Adoration is homage of the spirit to the 'King of Glory,' respectful silence in the

presence of the 'ever-greater' God. Adoration of the thrice-holy and sovereign God of love blends with humility and gives assurance to our supplications."

And as we celebrate in the Christmas season the Incarnation, we are reminded how the angels adore Jesus: "From the Incarnation to the Ascension, the life of the Word incarnate is surrounded by the adoration and service of the angels. When God 'brings the firstborn into the world, he says: 'Let all God's angels worship him' (Hebrews 1:6) Their song of praise at the birth of Christ has not ceased resounding in the Church's praise: 'Glory to God in the highest!'" (CCC 333)

In these simple words of the Magi: "we have come to do him homage," we are reminded how we too are called to do him homage, especially in our encounters with Christ in his very Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity in the Eucharist. Pope St. John Paul II wrote in a beautiful letter on the Eucharist called *Ecclesia Eucharistia*: "The gaze of the Church is constantly turned to her Lord, present in the Sacrament of the Altar, in which she discovers the full manifestation of his boundless love." (EE, 1)

In the Mass, we are present to the Death and Resurrection of Christ, we are renewed in the new and eternal covenant with Christ, and we are uniting our daily actions to his perfect act of love. Through the Mass he manifests himself to us in the proclamation of the Sacred Scriptures, in the life of the Church and her prayers in the Mass, and especially in consecration of bread and wine into his very self. One dynamic of the Mass is adoring God before us and as we receive him adoring him within us. We are called to worship him from the Mass to wherever we are. But beautifully we can continue the worship of Jesus in the Eucharist through the act of Adoration of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is spending time in prayer before Our Lord in the Eucharist, ador-

ing Him and giving Him due worship. It is truly Him present, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity and He remains forever until the Eucharist is dissolved. Adoring him can have many effects on us within our soul (which I will try to reflect on in the weeks ahead in the bulletin).



Annual Diocesan Pro-Life Essay Contest

Each year the Diocese has a pro-life essay contest for middle school and high school students. There will be a contest for those in Grades 6-8 and one for those in high school. The first prize is \$150. Second prize is \$75.

The theme this year is "Christ our Hope: In Every Season of Life." The essay should focus on the sanctity of life at the moment of conception, responding to the words of Pope Francis: "Our defense of the innocent unborn ... needs to be clear, firm, and passionate, for at stake is the dignity of a human life, which is always sacred and demands love for each person, regardless of his or her stage of development."

The essay should be typed and double spaced. Middle school essays should be 300-400 words and high school essays should be 400-600 words. Any parishioner in middle school or high school who would like to write an essay should submit it to Fr. Kevin by Feb. 7.

The winners will read their essays at the annual Pro-Life Mass on Thursday, March 19, at St. John the Baptist Church in Westport, and their essays will be published in *The Anchor*.




