Pastor's Page

This month of May is a time in which universally the Church fosters deeper awareness of and devotion to Mary. One devotion which so many saints have encouraged us to pray is the rosary. Most of us were taught this prayer from our youth, but many times we were not really taught well how to pray it. There are the very practical parts of saying the rosary: Using the rosary beads, saying the Apostle's Creed, the Our Father, the Hail Mary, the Glory Be, the Hail Holy Queen, and meditating on certain decades on certain days. But, unless we pray it frequently and from our heart, we may find it a struggle to remember the mysteries, or other times we may feel like the rosary takes an eternity to pray and we are just reciting prayers and not praying from our hearts.

The rosary is a prayer that requires a contemplative heart and mind. At the core of the rosary is praying the Gospels (pondering the life of Christ through Mary). This is why Pope John Paul II called it his favorite prayer and referred to it as sitting at "the school of Mary." The gospels make several references of Mary pondering what was being said about her son and Savior. This is what the rosary is, primarily — pondering/meditating on Christ with and through Mary. We often pray a rosary for particular intentions (or as many intentions as we would like) and ask the intercession of Mary. It is also helps pondering these intentions in the light of the life of Christ.

When the Dominicans (or the Order of Preachers, which was founded by St. Dominic) were catechizing people on the life of Our Lord (especially to a people who were unable to read in the Middle Ages), they taught people to meditate on some of the essential aspects of Jesus' life. This is why we have the Joyful, Sorrowful, and Glorious Mysteries; and more recently, the Luminous Mysteries, which Pope John Paul II introduced to the Church back in the Year of the Rosary. In imitation of

the Prayer of the Church, the Liturgy of the Hours, in which all 150 Psalms were prayed weekly by priests and religious (before the Church made revisions to the Liturgy of the Hours after the Second Vatican Council and the Psalms are now prayed in the span of a four-week cycle), the laity would accompany them in their daily lives by praying the 15 decades of the rosary (therefore reciting 150 Hail Marys, like the 150 Psalms).

The rosary is primarily to help us seek how to conform ourselves to Jesus in deeper ways. To truly imitate him we need to contemplate the face of Christ, and as we come to know his humanity we discover his divinity in deeper ways. Through this deepening union with Our Lord, he leads into the union of the Trinity. This is why we turn to Mary, because she lived perfectly this union with Him and she, as our mother, is always seeking to teach us how to live our lives in this profound union with him. The more we become conscious of this mystery, the more we have the awareness of the presence of God and what He calls us to. The more we entrust ourselves to Mary, the more she leads us to trust in her Son and do whatever he tells us (and we see our lives caught up in imitating how he lived). The rosary can be an instrument of God to lead us to greater conversion, hope, and joy.

Next week I will get into some practical ways of how to pray the rosary better and hopefully may we together experience in more profound ways the fruits of it in our daily lives.

Happy Mother's Day: As we continue through this trying time, I hope all mothers have a blessed Mother's Day. Thank you for all you do for your family and may the Lord shower you with countless blessings. I am sure for many of you this year's Mother's Day is challenging because of being unable to be with some of your family due to COVID-19, but may you find joy and peace of knowing how happy the Lord is in the love and sacrifices you have made


for your children.

Please Keep in Your Prayers: This last week we have had one of our long-time parishioners pass away: Evelyn (Piquette) Hendricks. Her funeral service was last Tuesday at Perry McStay Funeral Home and she was buried at Mount St. Mary's Cemetery in Pawtucket. Please keep Evelyn and her family in your prayers during this difficult time.

Interested in doing some yard work? Along Route 44 we have forsythias that line the street. It has been noted that as they grow they make it more difficult to see as you pull out of the church parking lot, and especially if you are crossing at Lincoln Street. Because of that reason our maintenance men have to keep trimming them, which is actually contrary to the growth pattern of forsythias (they are supposed to grow naturally 9-12 feet in size). We currently have 106 of them lining Route 44. I would like to move all of them away from the edge of the road and plant them in different parts of the property so they can grow to their full beauty, and allow a little more viewing space when trying to pull out of the parking lot or Lincoln Street. But, we don't need so many forsythias and it would be too much work for our maintenance men. So, my thought is to see if parishioners want to come help transplant a forsythia on a certain day, and if you help move one, you can also transplant another for your home. Also, if anyone has any machines to make the process easier and could lend us them that would be great.

You do not need to give your name, but say that you want Confession and a time can be arranged. If you are sick and in the hospital

If you are facing grave illness or going in for surgery at which they will be giving you anesthesia, please let Fr. Kevin know so he can come give you Confession, the Anointing of the Sick, and Communion (but only for a person who is dying, called Viaticum). Please know if you are admitted to the hospital for grave health, you should let them know that you are Catholic and would like the Anointing of the Sick or Confession (and please let your family know, if for some reason you are admitted to the hospital and unable to communicate, so your family can convey your wishes to the hospital). Currently at Rhode Island Hospital there is a priest chaplain, but some hospitals such as Sturdy do not have priest chaplains anymore, so ask them to contact Fr. Kevin, since you are a parishioner of Our Lady of Mount Carmel.
