## Pastor's Page

**Please Keep in Your Prayers:** Last week we had three funerals. Please keep in your prayers Lorraine Bowlin, wife of Norm Bowlin. Lorraine's funeral was Monday, June 15. Second, please keep in your prayers Lucille Vicente, sister of Isabel Pedroso, whose funeral was Tuesday, June 16. And lastly please keep in your prayers Donald Vine, father of Susan Duncan, whose funeral was Friday, June 19. Please keep all of them and their families in your prayers.

**First Communion Masses:** Over the next few weeks we have several first communions and some adults who will be receiving first communion and Confirmation. Unfortunately, because of the pandemic we are limited in the amount of people who can attend, but we are so happy that the children and adults will be receiving Our Lord for the first time. We have scheduled five first communion Masses. Others have chosen to wait until the fall, when hopefully there will be fewer restrictions in place on the amount of people who can be in the church for Mass. Please keep all of them in your prayers, as well as their families, that these experiences will be beautiful encounters with Jesus Christ and the sacraments.

**Congratulations to Fr. Steven Booth:** Saturday, June 13, was a blessed day for the diocese and the Church as Deacon Steve was ordained a priest. It has been a joy having him here the last year and I know he will strive to be the best priest he can be. Beginning in two weeks he will be assigned just for the summer helping on Martha's Vineyard. But in the end of August he will go to a month-long Officer Chaplain training for the United States military, which he will serve after he serves three years in our diocese (and he will hopefully return to after he serves the military for several years as a military chaplain). When he completes his chaplain training, he will start his permanent assignment at St. Julie Billiard Parish in North Dartmouth.

It is my hope that when things return to a little more normal with parish life and the pandemic, Fr. Steve will return to celebrate a Mass for us and we can hold a reception for him. Please keep him in your prayers as he begins this new adventure as a priest of Jesus Christ.

**Welcome Deacon Peter Scheffer:** Once again we have been blessed to have for this upcoming year a newly ordained transitional deacon who is preparing for the ordination to the priesthood for next year. Deacon Peter Scheffer is 59 and grew up in Clifton, N.J., but his parents live in Brewster. Peter has an older sister and a younger sister. He grew up in a devout Catholic family learning how to pray and developed a deep love for the Mass. His faith was greatly impacted by the example of his mother, Joan, and his pastor, who became the bishop of Paterson (Bishop Frank Rodimer).

After high school he went to West Point and joined the military as an officer in the Army beginning in the early 1980s. Over the years Peter served in the military in many different capacities. He retired as an Assistant Professor in the Department of Joint, Interagency, and Multinational Operations in Ft. Leavenworth, Kansas, in December 2016. He is also a retired Army Lieutenant Colonel. He is a veteran of wars in Iraq and Afghanistan and also participated in other operational contingency missions to the Middle East, the Balkans, and Central Africa.

In the spring of 1990 Army Personnel Command selected Peter for a graduate studies program that he did at Boston College. During this period he experienced spiritual direction and grew greatly in his faith and discovered how to best serve the Lord. After Boston College, he completed his time at West Point and returned to operational forces, participating in missions ranging from full-scale combat, to peace-keeping, to humanitarian assistance, to disaster relief, and to homeland defense both as a soldier and a diplomat. Through these





experiences he continued to grow in his faith. In Afghanistan he learned how to work with both Muslim and Christians and how to bring a Christ-like example to all those he worked with.

Deacon Peter has sensed a call to the priesthood over the years, from the time of his late teens. In 2008 after a trip to Jerusalem he was moved by a conviction the Lord was calling him to be a priest. He is a man of deep faith and has a good understanding of the priesthood. In speaking with him you will see he is humble and easy to talk with. Deacon Peter has over 30 years of experience in teaching, leading, mentoring, and advising men and women of all ages. The last three years Deacon Peter has been in formation for the priesthood at Pope St. John XXIII Seminary in Weston.

**T.n.T. (Tea and Theology):** While we continue through the pandemic, I am trying another daily experience to help people to grow in understanding and living the spiritual and moral life. Mondays through Saturdays at 10 a.m. I am holding 15-minute livestream sessions on the Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish Facebook site. My hope is that each day I will touch on different aspects of faith that can help you grow in your understanding and living the faith, as well as answer questions people may have about the faith. You can simply post your questions in the "Comment" section of the Facebook video. I will try my best to answer questions in the midst of the livestream but sometimes it might have to carry over to the following day. ### **If you are sick and in the hospital**

If you are facing grave illness or going in for surgery at which they will be giving you anesthesia, please let Fr. Kevin know so he can come give you Confession, the Anointing of the Sick, and Communion (but only for a person who is dying, called Viaticum). Please know if you are admitted to the hospital for grave health, you should let them know that you are Catholic and would like the Anointing of the Sick or Confession (and please let your family know, if for some reason you are admitted to the hospital and unable to communicate, so your family can convey your wishes to the hospital). Currently at Rhode Island Hospital there is a priest chaplain, but some hospitals such as Sturdy do not have priest chaplains anymore, so ask them to contact Fr. Kevin, since you are a parishioner of Our Lady of Mount Carmel.

### ***The return of public Masses***

Welcome back everyone! Mass times are the same as always with the exception of the 7:30 a.m. Mass on Sunday, which now begins at 7:15 a.m. The Saturday Vigil is at 4:30 p.m. and Sunday Masses are at 7:15, 9 (which will also be livestreamed), and 10:45. Saturday Vigil and Sunday Masses are celebrated outside. Parishioners are directed where to park and are able to hear the Mass through their use phones. As you drive in, an usher gives you a sheet of instructions to call to connect with the Mass. While many would prefer to be in the church for Mass, the regulations limit the number of people who could attend, and more can participate by it being outside. We must regulate people not gathering with others, so we ask you to please stay at your car before, during, and after Mass. When it is time for communion, we will come to your car. You and anyone else in the car wishing to receive communion should step out on the driver's side of the car to receive. You can also stand on the driver's side of the car during the Mass if you want.

Weekday Masses, including Thursday evening, and Saturday morning Masses are celebrated inside the church. Please wear a mask and bring hand sanitizer.

We will be working on the schedule for first communions and Masses for adults who are planning to come into the Church and receive the sacraments (which they would have done originally at the Easter Vigil prior to the pandemic).

Because the pandemic continues, and knowing there are many who are elderly, frail, or have compromised health issues, the bishop is still granting the dispensation of attending Sunday Mass. You are encouraged to stay at home and continue to join us via livestream on the parish Facebook page, which you can reach from our website, [www.olmcseekonk.org](http://www.olmcseekonk.org), by clicking on the "F" for Facebook.

T.n.T. (Tea and Theology) is livestreamed on Facebook Monday through Saturday at 10 a.m. Father Kevin discusses aspects of the faith and answers your questions. It's dynamite!
