Starting up Faith Formation: Next week we start up the time of Faith Formation. This year parents will be teaching using the program Project Nazareth, which entails conversations about the faith, as well as praying with their children throughout the week. Any parents who have not registered their children in the program will need to contact the Evangelization Team this week to do so (if you have not picked up the needed materials from the office, please do that as well). Please keep all families involved in your prayer so that this will bear fruit in the faith lives of the children and their families.

Mass Intentions through June 30

Open: The parish mass book is still open for Mass intentions through June 30. You can request Masses by coming by the office during office hours, as well as calling the parish secretary. The offering for each Mass is \$10. If you are requesting a Mass to be offered for a person who is living, it will be listed simply as "Special Intention." Any Masses for deceased loved ones or a general intention (such as "for vocations") will be listed as such. Please make sure you spell out the names of those you wish the Mass to be offered for so it will be accurately recorded.



With this election year, we have an obligation as citizens to vote, and with voting we must make sure we are forming our decision according to the truth and what is morally right. So many times we can be tempted to vote without looking at the issues and what candidates stand for or against; we just vote in line with whatever political party we favor. But by voting just for whoever is representing our party and not looking at their stances, we may be giving our support to stances that are immoral (and we may be formally or materially cooperating in an evil that may be standing for). There are many crucial issues, but the primary issue is the defense of the sanctity of life and preventing abortion. To truly understand our responsibilities, go to the United States Bishops' website on our roles as citizens and voting, www.faithfulcitizenship.org, and read the document "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship."

- The bills would allow abortion on demand for all nine months of pregnancy


Hiring for Little Flower Early Learning Center Program Director:

Adult Confirmation classes offered

In December the Bishop will be offering the sacrament of Confirmation for anyone 18 and older who has never been confirmed but has received first communion. If you would like to receive the sacrament, please contact our Evangelization Team at the office to find out what will be needed.

If you are sick and in the hospital

If you are facing grave illness or going in for surgery at which they will be giving you anesthesia, please let Fr. Kevin know so he can come give you Confession, the Anointing of the Sick, and Communion (but only for a person who is dying, called Viaticum). Please know if you are admitted to the hospital for grave health, you should let them know that you are Catholic and would like the Anointing of the Sick or Confession (and please let your family know, if for some reason you are admitted to the hospital and unable to communicate, so your family can convey your wishes to the hospital). Currently at Rhode Island Hospital there is a priest chaplain, but some hospitals such as Sturdy do not have priest chaplains anymore, so ask them to contact Fr. Kevin, since you are a parishioner here.

Thoughts about the return to Mass

As we are a few months into being in the church for Mass, I just want to make a few reminders for everyone (and as some are returning more recently, I want to help them be aware of the different options and responsibilities). It is important for us to remember we need to social distance when sitting in the pews (sitting six feet apart unless we are sitting with people we live with), when coming up for communion (there is blue tape on the floor to indicate the six feet spacing), and when leaving after Mass (we need to work on this a little more, spacing out from others as we leave). We should wear our masks in the church, covering our nose and mouths. After every Mass we sanitize all the pews and when the temperatures are not too hot we will open the windows to circulate the air.

We are working on having ushers at all the Masses to help greet and sit people, take the collections, and hand out bulletins after Mass. As for seating, if the church is full due to social distancing, downstairs we are projecting the Mass and have 40 chairs set up throughout the hall for people to still participate (one of the deacons or extraordinary ministers will bring communion downstairs). Those still not comfortable coming into the church can sit outside in their cars and hear the Mass on their phones (a sheet in the narthex explains how to do this) and then come to the front door to receive communion when it is time. We also livestream every Mass for our homebound.

When coming up for communion, one should have one's mask on. After we say "The Body of Christ" and you say "Amen," then you receive communion. If you are receiving on the tongue, remove the mask after saying "Amen" and then receive. I know some people are concerned about someone receiving on the tongue but I cannot deny someone since they have a right to receive on the tongue if they wish. I know the bishop's guidelines say people cannot receive on the tongue, but the Vatican has stated in different documents "each of the faithful always has the right to receive Holy Communion on the tongue" (Redemptionis Sacramentum, 92), so no bishop can command that people cannot receive communion on the tongue. We follow these guidelines: If someone comes up to receive on the tongue, if we make any contact with them, we then dip our fingers first in a little bowl of water on a table next to us (to purify our finger first of any possible particles of the Eucharist), then dry our fingers, then dip our fingers in the sanitizer that we have in another bowl on that table. There are many at Mount Carmel who receive on the tongue, so I must respect their desires and right to receive on the tongue.

With all this there is a challenging balance we have to foster. There are people who come to Mass who are still overcome by fear of the pandemic and others with anger about the pandemic and government policies. While trying to be safe, I am trying help people to focus on the Lord (rather than on COVID) because they need his grace and guidance as they face the challenges of daily life along with the challenges of the pandemic.




