Mass intentions for 2021 now being accepted

The parish office is taking Mass intentions for Masses between Jan. 1- June 30, 2021. There is a limit on the number so everyone will have an opportunity to request Masses (two Sunday Masses and three weekday Masses). Come by the office during office hours or call the parish secretary, 508-336-5549. The offering for each Mass is \$10. A Mass for a person who is living will be listed as a "Special Intention" but any Masses for deceased loved ones or a general intention (such as "For Vocations") will be listed as such. Please make sure you spell out the names of those you wish the Mass to be offered for so it will be accurately recorded. There are still weekday Mass intentions available through Dec. 31. After Jan. 1, we will increase the number of Masses you may request.

Pastor's Page

This week we enter into the last week of the liturgical season with the great celebration of Christ the King. This solemnity helps us remember, in the face of different challenges, how we are participating in this eternal kingdom of the Lord and how he reigns. In his reigning, Jesus calls us to participate in it by uniting all things in our daily life to him. Sometimes we can feel overwhelmed, which often leads to anxieties and fears, but when we remember it is his kingdom that is victorious and eternal and all he asks of us is to trust in him while we face daily life, then it leads to a deeper peace and joy in our hearts and minds. This awareness also can help us be more mindful of God's blessings.

As a nation, we are approaching the great holiday of Thanksgiving, which we will celebrate this Thursday. It is an opportunity for us, as we see the Lord's victory and blessings, to offer greater acts of thanksgiving to God. Knowing so many feel overwhelmed in our society, how can we help them see God is very much at work? How can we help our family and friends to have hearts of gratitude in the face of crosses? Let us ask the Lord for the grace to grow not only in gratitude, but to give us the grace to help others we love to see the truth of God's blessing and lead them in prayer to give God thanks.

Mass of Thanksgiving: This Wednesday, Nov. 25, at 7 p.m. we will have a Mass of Thanksgiving to give thanks to God for all that God has blessed us with. This is the evening before Thanksgiving so it gives us a great opportunity to spiritually enter into the holiday with the awareness of the best way we can thank God. There will also be the opportunity for those who come to this Mass to give dry and canned foods toward our food pantry and show our gratitude by helping others who are in need.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion at Mass: For the Sunday Mass-

es, we have started to have one extraordinary minister of holy communion helping with communion. When there are two deacons at Mass, then we will have two communion lines in the center aisle coming forward, since having one extraordinary minister will allow us to have four stations. If there is only one deacon at Mass, then we will have just one communion line in the center. Some of the extraordinary ministers are nervous about giving communion on the tongue, so if you wish to receive communion on the tongue, please come to me or one of the deacons, since we are comfortable giving communion on the tongue (and the faithful do have a right to receive communion on the tongue as reiterated by the Vatican in the document *Redemptionis Sacramentum* #72). Once the pandemic hopefully comes to an end, then the extraordinary ministers will be expected to give communion on the tongue.

Please Keep in Your Prayers: Please keep in your prayers Robert Guertin who passed away last week. Bob's funeral was Thursday, Nov. 19. Please keep Bob and his family in your prayers during this difficult time.

Novena for Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception: Beginning on Nov. 30, we will have our annual Novena for Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception. The novena will run from Nov. 30 to Dec. 8 at 7 p.m. each evening. Each evening we will have Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, a talk given by a different priest or deacon, a chance for Confessions, praying the Rosary, and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. It will also be livestreamed. The theme for this year will focus on Our Lady and the spiritual dynamics we must be mindful of in these trying times. More details on speakers to come.



Faith Formation has begun

We have started up the new program for Faith Formation. This year parents are using the program Project Nazareth, which entails conversations about the faith, as well as praying with their children throughout the week. The goal is just to help families talk more with each other about different aspects of the faith that maybe would not normally come up in discussion in home. Also, some families pray together, but not all, so it's a unified effort to help foster family prayer. Think of the words of Venerable Patrick Peyton: "The family that prays together stays together."

It is a different approach, so for some families it may take a little time getting used to it. With the busyness of so many people's lives, this is not intended to be just one more thing that parents have to do, but actually something that can help foster the faith in the home in a very natural way. That is why each lesson is intended to be talking for maybe five to ten minutes a few days a week. It is not meant to be an hour-long classroom style.

Our Evangelization Team is here to offer different tools to help the parents grow in their knowledge of the faith and ways to share the faith with their kids.

Any parents who have not registered their children in the program will need to contact the Evangelization Team this week to do so (also, if they have not picked up the needed materials from the office, please do that as well). Please keep all families involved in your prayer so that this will bear fruit in the faith lives of the children and their families.

Join us for Youth Nights for Grades 8-12

All youths in Grades 8-12 are invited to join our monthly Youth Nights. The first Friday of the month is for boys, the second Friday of the month is for girls. We will meet from 7-9 p.m. downstairs in the church for competition, snacks, discussion, and prayer. We will adhere to Covid guidelines.

Youth Nights are part of Confirmation Preparation for Grades 8 and 9.

Pray for the Souls in Purgatory every Thursday

The Catholic Church consecrates the month of November to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. Are you aware that there is a Holy Souls Apostolate at Our Lady of Mount Carmel? We meet every Thursday at 9 a.m. in the main Church for one hour of prayer devoted to the Holy Souls. Our mission is to gain release for the souls in Purgatory who can no longer help themselves. Prayer books and pamphlets are provided free of charge. Please stop by even if you cannot remain for the entire time. For more information see our brochure located in the Narthex and by the back entrance, or call Dolores de Paiva at 508-252-4826.

Thoughts about the return to Mass

As we are a few months into being in the church for Mass, I just want to make a few reminders for everyone (and as some are returning more recently, I want to help them be aware of the different options and responsibilities). It is important for us to remember we need to social distance when sitting in the pews (sitting six feet apart unless we are sitting with people we live with), when coming up for communion (there is blue tape on the floor to indicate the six feet spacing), and when leaving after Mass (we need to work on this a little more, spacing out from others as we leave). We should wear our masks in the church, covering our nose and mouths. After every Mass we sanitize all the pews and when the temperatures are not too hot we will open the windows to circulate the air.

We are working on having ushers at all the Masses to help greet and sit people, take the collections, and hand out bulletins after Mass. As for seating, if the church is full due to social distancing, downstairs we are projecting the Mass and have 40 chairs set up throughout the hall for people to still participate (one of the deacons or extraordinary ministers will bring communion downstairs). Those still not comfortable coming into the church can sit outside in their cars and hear the Mass on their phones (a sheet in the narthex explains how to do this) and then come to the front door to receive communion when it is time. We also livestream every Mass for our homebound.

When coming up for communion, one should have one's mask on. After we say "The Body of Christ" and you say "Amen," then you receive communion. If you are receiving on the tongue, remove the mask after saying "Amen" and then receive. I know some people are concerned about someone receiving on the tongue but I cannot deny someone since they have a right to receive on the tongue if they wish. I know the bishop's guidelines say people cannot receive on the tongue, but the Vatican has stated in different documents "each of the faithful always has the right to receive Holy Communion on the tongue" (Redemptionis Sacramentum, 92), so no bishop can command that people cannot receive communion on the tongue. We follow these guidelines: If someone comes up to receive on the tongue, if we make any contact with them, we then dip our fingers first in a little bowl of water on a table next to us (to purify our finger first of any possible particles of the Eucharist), then dry our fingers, then dip our fingers in the sanitizer that we have in another bowl on that table. There are many at Mount Carmel who receive on the tongue, so I must respect their desires and right to receive on the tongue.

With all this there is a challenging balance we have to foster. There are people who come to Mass who are still overcome by fear of the pandemic and others with anger about the pandemic and government policies. While trying to be safe, I am trying help people to focus on the Lord (rather than on COVID) because they need his grace and guidance as they face the challenges of daily life along with the challenges of the pandemic.
