Pastor's Page

Happy Easter! Happy Easter to all of you! Christ is Risen, Alleluia! He is truly risen, Alleluia! We give praise and thanks to God for the ultimate proof of his love for us in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, our Lord. What an awesome mystery! We read in the Scriptures how Jesus raised the son of the widow, the daughter of Jairus, and Lazarus from the dead. But they were raised but resuscitated (not resurrected), not transformed in a new life (eventually they would die again). But Jesus, the Word made flesh, rose in a glorified body. It is truly him and the body he received from the flesh of Mary, but now his body is (and forever will be) glorified. 



Easter Message from the Bishop

Dear Friends in Christ,

As we celebrate another Easter, we are reminded that, even in the midst of a pandemic, this is a time of renewal and rebirth, of hope and joy. This past year, we have seen many difficulties, but the crisis brought by the pandemic can also become an opportunity for transformation. If we focus on how our struggles and our circumstances can strengthen our faith, hope, and love of God, we will truly be embracing the message of Easter. When we encounter a crisis in our lives, we can, with Christ's help, find an opportunity to emerge more faith-filled and encouraged. As St. Paul teaches us, "Do not be conformed to this world but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may prove what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect" (Romans 12:2).

In the Paschal Mystery of Jesus' Passion, death, and Resurrection, we witness eternal life spring forth from death, suffering turned into joy, and despair replaced with hope. Happily, Easter always takes place in spring, a time when the once barren quiet of winter melts away and signs of new life emerge. The past year has been, at times, bleak and perhaps even desolate for some, yet, in this Easter season, like nature itself, we are called to recognize that all things are made new again, and be an integral part of this renewal. The Resurrection of Jesus brings new life to us all. May we recognize and be receptive to God's plan of sheer goodness (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1), prepared for a spiritual renewal of ourselves and our Church.

General Rule Regarding COVID-19 Vaccination

In January I did an extensive write up (and TNT session) on the morality questions about receiving the vaccination for COVID-19. A basic guideline is this: different types of vaccinations are offered. The ones by Moderna and Pfizer are morally fine (the ones that require two shots). The other vaccinations, such as Jensen (aka Johnson and Johnson) and AstraZeneca, have more moral issues at stake because of the direct use of the fetal cell line from aborted babies several decades ago in the creation of the vaccine. Moderna and Pfizer did test their vaccination on the fetal cell line but did not use them in their production (so any cooperation in an evil by those receiving this vaccination is remote and material – meaning the cooperation in the evil of testing on the fetal cell line is solely by those scientists who tested on them). As for Johnson and Johnson (Jensen) and AstraZeneca there is more cooperation in the evil because of their use of the fetal cell line in the creation of it.

The Vatican and the Bishops in the United States have said one can take morally compromised vaccination **if there is no other opportunity to receive the other vaccination**. They said if one does receive the Johnson and Johnson vaccine (or in the future others produced in a similar fashion) then one should write to the pharmaceutical company to express disapproval with creating it using the fetal cell line from an aborted child. As a priest I cannot say it is a sin to receive this vaccination since the Holy Father and bishops are saying one can receive it if there is not another option (but for me personally, I cannot in good conscience receive the morally compromised vaccine since it appears to me the logic in saying it is all right is saying the ends justify the means ... the means being using a fetal cell line from children who were killed by abortion). But we should pray and give serious thought about how receiving the vaccination can help towards the common good.

Lastly, a person does not have a moral obligation to receive the vaccine. Would it help in lessening the spread of the virus? Though it is not a guarantee, it will help people who have received it from being affected by the virus (though apparently those vaccinated can still be carriers of the virus to others though they are not infected by it). Those who have compromised health conditions should consider receiving it and should be given the priority of place to receive it. But people do have to weigh their own health concerns as to whether they should take it or not. There are obviously the questions some people rightly have as to whether there could be an unintended long-term negative affect from the vaccination (since it is a new vaccination) so they have every right to choose not to receive it, especially if they have concerns about whether it could affect them or their child long-term (so they may choose not to have their child receive the vaccination). Finally, none of us has a right to know whether someone has been vaccinated. That is a choice between someone and their doctor (so if you find yourself asking others if they have received it, please stop asking and furthermore putting pressure on them if they have chosen not to receive it).




