Mass intentions now open for July to December

The parish Mass book is now open for Mass intentions for Masses offered between July 1 and Dec. 31. At this time there is a limit on Masses requested so everyone will have an opportunity to request Masses to be offered for loved ones (you can request two Sunday Masses and three weekday Masses). You can do this by coming by the office during office hours, as well as by calling Thérèse Duquette, the parish administrative assistant. The offering for each Mass is \$10. If you are requesting a Mass to be offered for a person who is living, it will be listed simply as a "Special Intention." Any Masses for deceased loved ones or a general intention (such as "For Vocations") will be listed as such. Please make sure you spell out the names of those you wish the Mass to be offered for so it will be accurately recorded. Also, there are still weekday Mass intentions in the time period until June 30 available. After July 1, you can request many more Masses between July 1 and Dec. 31.

Pastor's Page

This Sunday we celebrate Corpus Christi Sunday. This great Feast Day renews within our hearts and minds that awareness of the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Jesus promised he would be with us always until the end of the age. He remains through His Church and the life of the Church (His Body and His Bride), but it is in the Eucharist that he remains in the greatest way (it is Jesus par excellence). On this day we give thanks to God for his loving gift of the Eucharist by which He feeds us spiritually and physically and strengthens us in all we must face in life. We think about how the Eucharist is the source and summit of our lives (how through this mystery we bring to Jesus all our joys and sorrows and unite them to His Passion, Death, and Resurrection by the Eucharist). We can think about the great gift of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, being able to remain and gaze upon the hidden Christ present in the Eucharist. This day can give us that renewed awareness of how fortunate we are to have Adoration here perpetually, and it allows us to reflect on how we can better seize these opportunities to spend time before him. (For those who have never gone to Adoration, don't worry about what one is supposed to do ... just come, sit or kneel in his presence, and pray to the Lord about things in your life, or maybe read from the Gospels and speak to Jesus about his teachings and life).

We think about the different Eucharistic Miracles that have been approved by the Church that scientists have studied and confirmed — it is true human flesh and human blood and has remained so for so many centuries still present and fresh. The history of Corpus Christi Sunday goes back to one of the Eucharistic Miracles, and then songs that were written by St. Thomas Aquinas to commemorate how God gave this great miracle to remind us what happens in every Mass throughout the history of the Church, and still everyday throughout the world (though most of the time

we don't see the change, but in faith we have the conviction the bread and wine truly become the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ). I hope everyone will join us this Sunday for the 3 p.m. Eucharistic Procession. If it rains we will still have prayer and Adoration in the church (and a little procession around the inside of the church) because we want to show Our Lord how much we love him and we never want to take him for granted.

Congratulations Fr. Peter Scheffer!

Today is a great day for the Church and our Diocese as Fr. Peter becomes the newest ordained priest in our diocese. Fr. Peter, though 60 years old, has the energy of a 30-year-old man. He spent much of his life dedicated serving our country as an officer in the military, but now he serves our Church as a dispenser of the mysteries of Christ. As we celebrate Corpus Christi Sunday, we remember that we do not receive Our Lord's most powerful presence in the Eucharist unless there is the ministerial priesthood. Today Fr. Peter is now ordained and conformed to the Christ the High Priest, and he will begin the beautiful work of bringing Christ to thousands of people.

It has been a great joy having Fr. Peter here for the last year. Please pray for him as he will start soon his new assignment as parochial vicar at the newly erected St. Joseph, the Guardian of the Redeemer Parish in Falmouth (which was previously three parishes: St. Anthony, St. Patrick, and St. Elizabeth Ann Seton). Fr. Peter is going where Fr. Ryan Healy is also a parochial vicar until August (On Aug. 18, Fr. Ryan is moving to become the administrator of St. Francis Xavier Church in Acushnet).



This Saturday, June 5, is the first Saturday of June, so at the 9 a.m. Mass we will offer the Sacrament of the Sick for those who are Catholic and are facing serious illness, preparing for major surgery, or are elderly and frail. If you know someone who needs the Anointing of the Sick, please encourage them to come join us.

Recollection for Women on June 12

On Saturday, June 12, there will be a Women's Day of Recollection here beginning at 9 a.m. and concluding at 10:30 a.m. All women are welcome to come. The day consists of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, two preached meditations, a talk by a lay woman, Confessions, and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Mass on that Saturday will be at 8 a.m. and is open to everyone.

Men's pick-up basketball on Mondays

Every Monday at 7 p.m. (weather permitting) any men 18 years and older who want some light exercise playing pick-up basketball games can join Fr. Kevin and others. We play at the basketball hoop near the office (so it's not on a basketball court). We will be gathering each Monday during June, July, and August for those interested. Afterwards we will have a brief time for prayer.

New Covid Guidelines: The new guidelines for the pandemic given by Bishop daCunha for our diocese (since the governor has lifted many of the restrictions) are in effect. Within the new guidelines there is some leeway being granted to pastors.

First, the church and chapel can now have 100% seating capacity; once again we have the holy water in the fonts available; we will still livestream the Masses for the time being, as well as project the Mass downstairs for those who may feel they need more space when at Mass; currently the dispensation from the Sunday obligation is still in effect; we have ended the option of hearing the Mass in the car; we can also have communal singing; we will still refrain from giving the sign of peace (which is always optional even in non-pandemic times); you can receive communion on the tongue; when it is not too hot we will still open the windows to circulate the air but on hot days the windows will only be open a small bit so we do not lose the air conditioning and make things unbearable for people.

If vaccinated: If you have been vaccinated you do not need to wear a mask or social distance. But, if you do not feel safe at this time without the mask, then please feel free to wear it.

If not vaccinated: You are advised to wear the mask and perform some aspect of social distancing when indoors, but people are free to make what they believe to be the best decision for themselves and their health of whether they will wear their mask or not.

In the Adoration Chapel: Because we are now running the air conditioning, we will close the chapel door (which also helps keep the noise level down) but we will continue to run the air purifier. The mask policy in the chapel is the same as that in the church.



80TH ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL
DIOCESE OF FALL RIVER

We've raised \$51,556 for the Catholic Appeal

As of May 30, as a parish we have raised \$51,566 for the Catholic Appeal. Please consider this important appeal for the diocese since so many apostolates in the diocese are dependent on people's generous support. If you did not receive the Catholic Appeal mailing from the Diocese, there are some donation cards and envelopes at the main and side entrances of the church. The Appeal will close at the end of June. Many thanks to all those who have donated so far this year!

The theme for 2021 is "Time to Gather, Time to Heal, Time to Love." This year the diocese is offering an incentive program with the Appeal. If we raise 5 percent more as a parish than what we averaged in giving these last three years, we then will receive as a parish 50 cents for each dollar donated after we reach that goal. (So our average was \$119,018, and 5 percent is \$5,950, making our total goal \$124,968.90).
