**Mass intentions now open for July to December**

The parish Mass book is now open for Mass intentions for Masses offered between July 1 and Dec. 31. At this time there is a limit on Masses requested so everyone will have an opportunity to request Masses to be offered for loved ones (you can request two Sunday Masses and three weekday Masses). You can do this by coming by the office during office hours, as well as by calling Thérèse Duquette, the parish administrative assistant. The offering for each Mass is \$10. If you are requesting a Mass to be offered for a person who is living, it will be listed simply as a "Special Intention." Any Masses for deceased loved ones or a general intention (such as "For Vocations") will be listed as such. Please make sure you spell out the names of those you wish the Mass to be offered for so it will be accurately recorded. Also, there are still weekday Mass intentions in the time period until June 30 available. After July 1, you can request many more Masses between July 1 and Dec. 31.

## Pastor's Page

**Happy Father's Day:** Happy Father's Day to all fathers. Fatherhood is such an important gift from God. This gift is essential for the good of family and society. Many thanks to all the dads in our parish who strive to live out their vocation and responsibility of caring and forming their children. Together with their child's mother they help form their children's character (which a person carries with them their whole life).

To be a father means more than playing ball. It is teaching his children by word and example the moral and virtuous life, and most importantly the life of the child of God. A father's attentiveness and affection to his children helps build within them a healthy self-confidence and strengthening of their character, and when they know they are loved by their dad it helps open their hearts to the greatest reality that they are beloved children of God the Father. Sadly, how often we have seen how the lack of a loving father has affected how people see themselves. A father is called to protect his children spiritually (from assaults of temptation and sin that are presented to them — today this is demanded even more because of the assaults from technology and entertainment that is malforming so many people by feeding youth and adults with distortions of what it means to love, especially assaults from the pornography industry, and what it means to be human.) Ultimately a man must learn how to be a father by reflecting the Fatherhood of God (the one true Father), and he only can truly learn this by becoming more conformed to Jesus Christ (who is one with the Father, and who tells the apostles that he who sees the Son sees the Father).

Let us pray for all fathers in our parish and society that we will truly honor them as we should, just as we are called to honor our mothers and their unique roles in how they love and form us (this is why the mother and father are complimentary roles but yet both unique). The Book of Sirach (3:1-16)

gives us some powerful words (some pretty tough to hear) for us to consider regarding the importance of honoring our fathers:

“Children, listen to me, your father; act accordingly, that you may be safe. For the Lord sets a father in honor over his children and confirms a mother's authority over her sons. Those who honor their father atone for sins; they store up riches who respect their mother. Those who honor their father will have joy in their own children, and when they pray they are heard. Those who respect their father will live a long life; those who obey the Lord honor their mother. Those who fear the Lord honor their father, and serve their parents as masters. In word and deed honor your father, that all blessings may come to you. A father's blessing gives a person firm roots, but a mother's curse uproots the growing plant. Do not glory in your father's disgrace, for that is no glory to you! A father's glory is glory also for oneself; they multiply sin who demean their mother. My son, be steadfast in honoring your father; do not grieve him as long as he lives. Even if his mind fails, be considerate of him; do not revile him because you are in your prime. Kindness to a father will not be forgotten; it will serve as a sin offering — it will take lasting root. In time of trouble it will be recalled to your advantage, like warmth upon frost it will melt away your sins. Those who neglect their father are like blasphemers; those who provoke their mother are accursed by their Creator.”

### **Congratulations to Our Newest**



### **Bishops lift Mass dispensation**

Bishop Edgar M. da Cunha, S.D.V., and regional Catholic bishops have together decided to inform the Catholic faithful that the dispensation of the Sunday and Holy Day Mass obligation will be lifted Father's Day weekend, June 19-20.

The bishops saw Father's Day weekend as an appropriate time to encourage Catholic faithful, especially families, to return to the Sunday celebration of the Eucharist, the center of every Catholic life. The obligation to participate in the sacrifice of the Mass (the new and eternal covenant) on Sundays (or Saturday Vigil) does not apply to those who are ill, recently exposed to COVID-19 or other communicable illnesses, those confined to their homes or other facilities for various reasons, and those who are not able to be vaccinated for specific reasons.

### **Pro-Life Boot Camp is July 24**

The Diocesan Pro-Life Boot Camp will be held on Saturday, July 24, at Bishop Connolly High School in Fall River. It is open for any high school teens at no costs. It begins at 8 a.m. and concludes with Mass at 5:30 p.m. The theme this year is "Life is worth living." The day consists of Pro-Life, faith driven workshops and presentations, Adoration healing and worship, Confession, Mass, and a Pro-Life Question and Answer panel. If any of our high schoolers are interested please let Fr. Kevin know. Sign up must be before July 10.

### **Men's pick-up basketball on Mondays**

Every Monday at 7 p.m. (weather permitting) any men 18 years and older who want some light exercise playing pick-up basketball games can join Fr. Kevin and others. We play at the basketball hoop near the office (so it's not on a basketball court). We will be gathering each Monday during June, July, and August for those interested. Afterwards we will have a brief time for prayer.

**New Covid Guidelines:** The new guidelines for the pandemic given by Bishop daCunha for our diocese (since the governor has lifted many of the restrictions) are in effect. Within the new guidelines there is some leeway being granted to pastors.

First, the church and chapel can now have 100% seating capacity; once again we have the holy water in the fonts available; we will still livestream the Masses for the time being, as well as project the Mass downstairs for those who may feel they need more space when at Mass; currently the dispensation from the Sunday obligation is still in effect; we have ended the option of hearing the Mass in the car; we can also have communal singing; we will still refrain from giving the sign of peace (which is always optional even in non-pandemic times); you can receive communion on the tongue; when it is not too hot we will still open the windows to circulate the air but on hot days the windows will only be open a small bit so we do not lose the air conditioning and make things unbearable for people.

**If vaccinated:** If you have been vaccinated you do not need to wear a mask or social distance. But, if you do not feel safe at this time without the mask, then please feel free to wear it.

**If not vaccinated:** You are advised to wear the mask and perform some aspect of social distancing when indoors, but people are free to make what they believe to be the best decision for themselves and their health of whether they will wear their mask or not.

**In the Adoration Chapel:** Because we are now running the air conditioning, we will close the chapel door (which also helps keep the noise level down) but we will continue to run the air purifier. The mask policy in the chapel is the same as that in the church.

### **We've raised \$73,148 for the Catholic Appeal**

As of June 12, as a parish we have raised \$73,148 for the Catholic Appeal. Please consider this important appeal for the diocese since so many apostolates in the diocese are dependent on people's generous support. If you did not receive the Catholic Appeal mailing from the Diocese, there are some donation cards and envelopes at the main and side entrances of the church. The Appeal will close at the end of June. Many thanks to all those who have donated so far this year!

The theme for 2021 is "Time to Gather, Time to Heal, Time to Love." This year the diocese is offering an incentive program with the Appeal. If we raise 5 percent more as a parish than what we averaged in giving these last three years, we then will receive as a parish 50 cents for each dollar donated after we reach that goal. (So our average was \$119,018, and 5 percent is \$5,950, making our total goal \$124,968.90).
