



## Twentieth Anniversary of 9/11

This Saturday marks the twentieth anniversary of that tragic day, Tuesday, September 11, 2001, when terrorists attacked our country and killed the lives of thousands of Americans. For many of us it is a day we will never forget. I remember I had just finished celebrating Mass for some Capuchin sisters in New Bedford and was going to meet up with my classmate and friend, Fr. Dave Pignato, for a bike ride in Plymouth. We had been ordained priests only three months at that point. When I left the sisters' convent I did not turn on the radio but decided to just pray the rosary. When I reached my destination in Plymouth I finally turned the radio on and it was Peter Jennings reporting about a second plane just flew into the towers and there were reports of explosions in Washington D.C. (which ended up being a false report). In the first few seconds I thought I was listening to some fictitious story that Peter Jennings was reading about until it dawned on me asking why was Peter Jennings on the radio (Peter Jennings was the national anchor on ABC News Tonight). The reality hit me that something evil was happening right then. Fr. Pignato showed up at that point and asked if I was listening to the reports on the radio. We decided to drive to my parents' house (which was only about 15 minutes away) and watch the news. Watching the horrors of the towers burning, people running through the streets of New York, reports of the two other planes crashing, and then the collapse of the towers was the surreal experience. I remember my mother trying for hours to call my sister who lived in Manhattan to see if she is ok but the phone lines were too jammed up, no one could not get through (fortunately she was fine). But for her, she lived and worked in a seventeen-story building near the Empire State Building and was in a meeting when the first plane hit. The towers could be

seen clearly from the room she was in. They had turned around to turn on the television and as they were watching the television the second plane crashed into the second tower behind them). As Fr. Pignato and I were watching this we both felt we needed to be back at the parish to be there for our people. Not knowing exactly what we could do for them at that moment, not knowing if more attacks would happen in our state, we raced back to our parishes to serve in whatever way we could. I think about different people I knew involved or had relatives who were directly involved. A priest friend of mine had a nephew who worked in the Twin Towers who called his wife to say he was currently ok and he and another coworker were trying to help a handicapped person down the stairwells to get out (they did not make it). Fr. Pignato had a family in his parish whose daughter was on one of the flights that went into the towers. At Holy Family Church in East Taunton (where I later became pastor), they had a priest from the Holy Cross Fathers in Easton who covered Mass there every Friday who also was on one of the planes (he had just been at the parish the Friday before). A priest I know from New York, when seeing the towers on fire headed towards the towers to see if he would be needed to anoint people, but as fire fighters were running past him, all of a sudden a fire fighter stopped and ran back to him and asked for absolution. As the priest was absolving him, he suddenly found himself surrounded by New York Firefighters kneeling around him also asking for absolution (they knew the gravity of what they were heading into and wanted to be ready if God called them that day... and for some of them God most likely did). And there was Fr. Mychal Judge, the chaplain to the New York Fire Department who was at the towers anointing people as they were being carried out, and himself was killed from falling debris from the tower (many of us remember the famous image of fireman carrying his body away in the midst of the chaos). Lastly, my friend and classmate in the seminary, Fr. Steve McGraw, who is a priest in the Diocese of Arlington, Virginia, was heading to Arlington Cemetery for a burial that morning. He had missed the exit for Arlington Cemetery (knowing Fr. Steve.... not surprising) and he got off at the exit where the Pentagon is so as to turn around and head back towards Arlington Cemetery. At that moment, as he was on the overpass

to head back to the other direction, the plane that crashed into the Pentagon had flown just over his car as it clipped the light posts and crashed. He quickly turned his car around and drove to the entrance of the Pentagon. Outside of emergency responders, he and another priest who lived at the parish nearby (who was also a few years ahead of me in the seminary) were the only non-military personnel allowed in the area of the Pentagon as they were anointing people as they were being carried out. The days following was a surreal experience for everyone. My sister in Manhattan said for days the city was silent except for the sound of sirens of ambulances. Another sister who lived just outside of Washington DC said all week there were not planes allowed into DC so the only sound you heard was the sound of fighter jets roaring overhead every so many minutes as they protected the city. As a priest it was my first experience of seeing many more coming to Masses that weekend seeking God's grace and guidance spiritually of what they should be doing at that time. We should never forget the first responders and their sacrificial response, public servants stepping up to lead others in the face of fear, and many stepping up to put others' needs before their own. As a priest, I also think of the great response of different members of the Church in those moments. On that day the evil actions of a few have impacted our country and world on so many levels. So many aspects in daily life have changed. But it is a day that reminds us how when individuals choose to use their free will for evil (which God allows because He gives us free will), God counters with grace and mercy. We are reminded of in the face of evil, many respond with heroic sacrifice, those who are public servants (fire fighters and EMTs, police, soldiers, medical personnel) and many ordinary people as well. In everything we are reliant on God to give us the grace to respond like Christ would, no matter how great the difficulty.

### Looking for New Altar Servers

Since the pandemic began, one area, among many, that we have been affected is losing altar servers for our Masses. Altar serving is a wonderful way that younger parishioners can give glory to God and help make the Mass a more beautiful experience. Often by altar serving it has helped foster a love for the Eucharist, as well as fostering awareness of their vocation. I am looking for any youth who have received their first communion (so most likely entering grades 3 all the way through high school) who are willing to serve the Lord in this very unique way. Altar serving not only helps the youth to understand the Mass better, but also helps others to reflect on how important the Mass is. It is important for your child to understand that there are responsibilities involved and expectations of being able to carry themselves in the sanctuary in a mature way so they can help people to pray and not be distracted by distracting behavior. Also, my hope is to entrust to the servers (depending on their age) a few more roles such as lighting candles before Mass and adding more frequently (at special Masses) the use of incense that the servers should be comfortable working with.

We would be looking to have several sessions of training for those wanting to serve. If your child is interested in serving please email me with your contact information and what Mass time you would prefer to have them serve at. Three subtle changes I will be making for the servers is:

- (1) The servers will be wearing cassock and surplice when serving instead of the Alb and scapular (I think it visually adds a little more dignity to visual aspect of the Mass)
- (2) The expectation the servers are dressed appropriately for Mass even though they have the cassock and surplice on
- (3) Unless it is siblings serving together, I will be having teams of boys serving together and teams of girls serving together when there is more than one servers assigned for a Mass.
