

# PASTOR'S PAGE

Dear Parishioners,

I will be continuing on the Points about the Vaccine Mandate next week, my apologies. I will try to get into whether a particular institution can

mandate their employees or students to have to take the vaccine, and in general what does it mean in forming and following one's conscience. Finally, I will try to look at the question of demanding someone to act against their conscience.

Purchasing new hymnals. Beginning with the new liturgical year at Advent (November 28<sup>th</sup>), we will have new hymnals in the pews. When Covid hit we were instructed to remove all missalettes because of the concern at that time that the virus could pass on to others by touching the same objects. During the period without them I was thinking and praying about whether we should continue with missalettes when we are permitted to use them again or do something different. There were several reasons why I began to reflect on this: one is the quality of music in the missalettes and another reason is the costs of annually buying new missalettes. The missalettes are published by the company OCP and they tend to publish mostly songs more recently developed by particular musicians and not have as many songs that have been part of the rich traditions of the Church for decades and centuries. Also, some of the music theologically can at times be weak (or wrong) and furthermore I find many are more focused on ourselves than on glorifying God. So I decided after much thought and prayer that I would like to move towards music that reflects more the theology and the traditions of the Church. We will not be using the missalettes but will use a hardbound hymnal that has music that is more theologically correct and more focused on the Lord. The hardbound hymnals, if we treat them well, should last us approximately fifteen years before beginning to fall apart. The hymnal we are going to use is called The St. Michael Hymnal.

Though I believe the switch should enrichen our liturgies, there was a dilemma I had regarding the hymnals not having the Sunday readings within them. I know many find it helpful being able to read along as the Scripture is being proclaimed at Mass. There are some other hymnals that are good that have the readings in them so I was debating

whether I should get those (but a drawback being it makes the hymnals much heavier to hold and the quality of music I felt was not as strong). But this summer, when I was at my annual workshop for priests, one of the priests with us who works at the United States Catholic Bishops' Conference informed us there is going to be a new lectionary for the Sunday readings coming out in approximately four years (they are working out corrections to the current translation we use). With a new translation of the readings, then currently having a hymnal with the readings will not be helpful once the new translation for the readings comes out. Last year, our St. Vincent DePaul Society purchased paperback books with the readings for this last liturgical year so people could follow along, as well as bring them home to read in preparing for Mass (and I know many found this helpful being able to have the option of having the readings at home and then simply bringing the readings with them to Mass). So, until the new translation comes out we will purchase the paperback books for people to take home and bring to Mass. Hopefully in a few years when the new translation for the readings come out we can purchase a hardbound version of all the Sunday readings for the pews.

Furthermore, financially it will help the parish. Each year we spend close to \$3000 on missalettes which we throw out each year because they are dated but by buying the hymnals the cost is a little over \$8000 total. But, if the hymnals last us fifteen years, that would mean a savings of approximately \$37,000 over those fifteen years.

Lastly, I would like to give, anyone interested, the opportunity to have a dedication put inside a hymnal asking for prayers for a loved one (so hopefully over the years people will see the note on the inside cover and will pray for your loved one). For a gift of \$25, we will stick a notation asking for prayers for them. If this is something you would like, type up the following note:

- "This hymnal is in loving memory of \_\_\_\_\_. Please keep \_\_\_\_\_ in your prayers."
- "This hymnal is in loving memory of \_\_\_\_\_ donated by \_\_\_\_\_. Please keep \_\_\_\_\_ in your prayers."

You can mail or drop off your donation along with your remembrance note to the office. Please make checks payable to *Our Lady of Mount Carmel*.

This week we celebrate *National Vocation Awareness Week*. We will be hav-

ing a Holy Hour for vocations this **Thursday, November 11<sup>th</sup> at 7:00PM** to pray for vocations in our families, our parish, and our diocese. The holy hour will consist of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, some readings, a homily, the rosary, intercessions for vocations, and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Every Thursday we have Mass at 6:30pm so Adoration will begin at the conclusion of the Mass. All are welcome to join us. In accordance with our celebration, there is the **Diocesan Effort of Monthly Day of Prayer and Fasting for Our Priests**. The Diocese of Fall River has begun an initiative for the faithful to gather via Zoom once a month to pray for the priests of our diocese and offering that day as a day of sacrifice through fasting as well. The next monthly day of prayer and fasting for our priests will be Thursday, November 18, 2021. In addition to the commitment of fasting that day, the Rosary and Divine Mercy Chaplet will be prayed at 3:00 p.m. via zoom. **Please save the date** as we begin to approach the end of the liturgical year and the season of Advent. Once again we will have our annual Novena for *Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception*. The novena will take part from **November 30<sup>th</sup> - December 8<sup>th</sup> @ 7:00pm** in the church, during which every evening there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, a talk by be a different priest or deacon on a particular theme for the novena, the praying of the Rosary, an opportunity for Confession, and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. The main purpose of the novena is to help us honor Our Lady and prepare spiritually for the great celebration of *Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception* on December 8<sup>th</sup>. It can be a way to, not only deepen our love for Mary, but also help us to enter into the Advent Season and help direct our hearts, in a peaceful way, during the craziness and stresses of preparing for Christmas.

In closing, the **100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish** is at the end of October of next year, 2022 and we will begin to celebrate 100 years as a parish. I would like to put a group of parishioners together to plan different events to celebrate 100 years as a parish from late October, 2022 through October 2023. ## No to Physician Assisted Suicide

Just a reminder from last week's insert, there are two bills being presented in the Massachusetts Legislature seeking to legalize Physician Assisted Suicide (which would be the direct killing of a person who is very sick). Physician Assisted Suicide is killing and can never be justified. Along with recognizing it is the evil of killing, but these two bills would allow a physician to provide a deadly drug mixture to an individual diagnosed with less than six months to live that, when consumed would cause death. Many times diagnoses can be wrong and many have long outlived a six months or less diagnosis. Second, there are no real safeguards in place so a vulnerable person who is depressed or feels like a burden may be subject to undue influence by others to take the drug mixture, especially if there is a financial benefit for the ones influencing them. Third, the primary focus of elected officials should be dedicated to legislation providing quality health care, mental health care, and palliative care to the sick and dying, in particular for the poor and underserved. When someone is gravely ill, our focus should be how to be there for them to love them and know they are worth loving rather than giving into the fear of suffering and seeking to hasten a person's death. Also, though there are many emotions involved, we have to be objective about our sadness or a person's pain cannot justify killing them (we should be fostering palliative care which seeks ways to ease their pain in moral ways and being attentive to their spiritual needs).

To take action, please call or email your legislators to let them know you are a Massachusetts voter and say NO to Physician Assisted Suicide. Log onto [www.macatholic.org](http://www.macatholic.org) and follow the links to find out contact information for your individual state senator and representative via address and zip code, as well as find out contact information for legislative Joint Committee on Public Health who will be considering these bills. When you approach he will purify his fingers so there will be no particles from the regular communion hosts and then give you communion.
