PASTOR'S PAGE



Dear Parishioners,

Advent is Upon Us! Amazingly, we are now in the start of Advent. This season helps us put our focus on the need for the Messiah. In the need for Jesus, we should be looking at the current disposition of our hearts and minds so as to recognize how receptive we truly are to him (or how much are we truly seeking him and aware of our encounters with him). So how are we to experience Advent while we are preparing for the Christmas Season? Here are some practical little things to foster as you prepare for Christmas and hopefully grow in one's desire for the Lord coming in glory.

First, if you can have an Advent wreath on your kitchen or dining room table. Try to have your meals together as a family and as you light each candle say grace and maybe sing a verse of a religious Advent hymn (maybe O Come, O Come Emmanuel; or Come Thou Long Expected Jesus; etc.). By the way, the rose candle is lit on the third week (the 3rd Sunday of Advent). It is beautiful tradition to put up a manger scene in your home and each time you see it say a little prayer (there is also the custom of not putting the Christ child in the manger until Christmas Eve night). If you have children, have them put a piece of hay in the crèche or around the scene for each time they do something good when not asked, and see if by Christmas the scene can be filled with signs of their acts of love.

When it comes to your Christmas decorations, stagger putting things out so there is an experience of waiting with anticipation. When it comes to playing Christmas music, limit the amount listened to currently and gradually increase it as you get closer to Christmas (especially make sure you are listening to some of the hymns focusing on the birth of the Lord so as to help foster the awareness of why we celebrate Christmas). Some try to not listen to any Christmas music until only a week or few days before Christmas Day (and by it find they enjoy listening to it for days afterwards while everyone else stops listening to Christmas music on Dec. 26th because they are already tired of it). Furthermore, by gradually increasing it you will more likely carry the celebration of the Birth of Christ through the Christmas Season rather than being tired of it.

Lastly, try to pray more and foster the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. In your prayer spend time reading the beginning of the Gospel of Matthew and Luke so as to meditate on the hearts of Mary and

Joseph as they prepared for Jesus' birth. Or read some of the prophecies in the Old Testament about the signs of the Messiah so as to help not only increase your desire for Jesus but you may find it strengthens your faith in embracing Jesus as the one true Savior. As for showing the merciful heart of Christ, intentionally foster the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. The corporal works are: to feed the hungry, to give drink to the thirsty, to clothe the naked, to shelter the homeless, to visit the sick, to visit the imprisoned, and to bury the dead. The spiritual works of mercy are: to counsel the doubtful, to instruct the ignorant, to admonish the sinner, to comfort the sorrowful, to forgive injuries, to bear wrongs patiently, and to pray for the living and the dead.

Also, **the Giving Tree is going up this week.** Like past years, there are several groups that we are supporting. Please grab a tag or two and purchase what the tag requests. If you could please return the gift tag requests by Sunday, December 11th at the latest. Thank you everyone for your great generosity. You can place them under the trees when you come to Mass over the next few weeks or you can drop them in the office as well. If you pick a tag from St. Vincent DePaul which said "Fuel Assistance" please make a donation to the St. Vincent DePaul Society. Gift cards can be placed in the bin under the tree. Only gifts for the children in the foster home should be wrapped. Thank you everyone for your generosity.

Order forms are now available to be able to make purchases for **different memorabilia of the parish marking the hundredth anniversary.** Next weekend there will be different samples on display in the narthex area. There are many items to not only purchase for yourself but also with Christmas coming up consider making some purchases for others. There will be different sweatshirts, jacket, t-shirt, pens, ceramic mugs, insulated bottles, tote bags, Sherpa blankets, and stickers commemorating this great anniversary.

It is planned that starting next weekend we will be **selling a Christmas ornament of our church** as we celebrate one hundred years. Each ornament is \$10 and can be bought after the Masses in the narthex for the next three weekends (one can pay either by cash or by check). It is a wonderful way to remember the hundredth anniversary in the years ahead.

As we begin to approach the end of the liturgical year and approach the season of Advent, we once again will have our **Novena for Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception.** The novena will take part from

November 30th – December 8th at 7:00PM in the church, during which every evening there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, a talk by a different priest or deacon on a particular theme for the novena, the praying of the Rosary, an opportunity for Confession, and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. The theme for this year's novena is learning from the lives of different saints of how to live the virtues after the heart of Christ. The main purpose of the novena is to help us honor Our Lady and prepare spiritually for the great celebration of Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception on December 8th. Those speaking are the novena are: Fr. Scott Carpentier (Nov. 30th Courage); Fr. John Grieco (Dec. 1st Patience); Fr. Greg Quenneville (Dec. 2nd Humility); Fr. Matt Gill (Dec. 3rd Justice); Fr. Kevin Cook (Dec. 4th Sincerity); Deacon Matt Sweeney (Dec. 5th Perseverance); Fr. Chris Peschel (Dec. 6th Magnanimity); and Fr. Dan Nunes (Dec. 7th Obedience). The novena can be a way to not only deepen our love for Mary, but also help us enter into the Advent Season and help direct our hearts in a peaceful way during the craziness and stresses of preparing for Christmas.

For the holy day of the **Immaculate Conception there will be a Vigil Mass** at 5:30PM and on Thursday, Dec. 8th Masses will be at 9:00AM, 12:00PM, and 7:00PM.

And lastly, **congratulations to Ron Larose** who is our parishioner receiving the Marian Medal this year. Ron will be receiving it at the diocesan ceremony on next Sunday, December 4th at 3:00PM at St. Mary of the Assumption Cathedral in Fall River (which are all welcomed to attend). Ron has manifested in many ways such a generous heart in serving the Lord and His Church through the pro-life work (the head of our parish pro-life group and coordinated the annual baby bottle collection; daily praying outside the abortion clinic in Attleboro and by that witnessed have helped many women see the gift of their baby); a member of the parish Finance Council; volunteers in so many different parish activities; and lectors at Mass; a member of prison ministry; and many other things. Thanks to Ron for his example and the actions of the love of Christ that he has shown in so many ways. All are welcome to attend the ceremony.


Entrance Exam for Bishop Stang

Interested in attending the March for Life 2023?

Even with the Supreme Court overturning the national legalization of abortion, as we have seen in the reaction of so many thinking women have a right to abort their baby, we are reminded we have a long ways to go as a people to recognize the dignity of life from the moment of conception and cherish and protect the dignity of life. There are so many areas we have to work at helping people to recognize that dignity. One area is as a people to publicly march to proclaim life is sacred at the national March for Life in Washington D.C. January 19 - 21st.

1) Going by Flight: We are coordinating a group pilgrimage with others from other parishes in Dighton and Taunton. We will be flying to Washington on January 19th and flying back on the 21st. We will be staying at the Renaissance D.C. Downtown Hotel. The cost for the flight and two-night stay at the hotel varies on whether one wants to have a room to one self or if you want to have two, three, or four people to a room. One person

per room - \$500; Two people per room - \$285; three per room - \$210; and four per room \$175 per person. The cost does not include price of airport parking, Metro ticket, meals, or incidental expenses. A \$50 non-refundable deposit is due by October 31st (we must reserve our rooms by November 1st). We currently have 25 plane tickets reserved so the first 25 to sign up will have the costs as listed, but if we need to reserve more tickets then the costs for those who sign up after the 25th person could have their cost rise because plane ticket prices continue fluctuate daily so we may not be able to get tickets for the same price.

2) Going by Bus with the Diocese March for Life - The Pro-Life Office for the Diocese of Fall River is looking to organize a bus to travel to the March for Life in Washington, D.C this January. All Attendees have to be 18+ for safe environment standards. Those registering should have a friend in mind that they wouldn't mind sharing a room with. The approximate cost per individual is going to be \$350. The trip would run Thursday, January 19th, 2023 - Saturday, Jan-

uary 20th, 2023. The trip includes: Two-night stay at the Double Tree by Hilton; Double Queen bed Room (shared); Friday and Saturday Breakfast; Mass at the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception; March for Life Rally & March; and round-trip transportation. Meals beyond breakfast are not covered. If you are interested please contact Deborah LeDoux at www.dledoux@dioc-fr.org.

3) Going by Bus with Cape Cod Bus for Life - The Cape Cod Bus for Life is organizing a bus trip to the March for Life. They will be leaving from Massachusetts on Thursday, January 19th and returning on Saturday, January 21, 2023. The cost is \$300 per person if you plan to share a room - double occupancy. If you do not share a room with someone, and, are the only one in the room - single occupancy, the cost will be \$500. Please fill out the registration form. If you have more questions. 
