



Pavers for the Courtyard

There is still the opportunity to have pavers that are being installed to be engraved in memory of loved ones, in honor of a family or friend, in thanksgiving to God for some cause, etc. The two sizes for memorial pavers are 4"x8" and 8"x8". On the 4"x8" one can have up to 14 letters and spaces per line and up to three lines (each 4"x8" paver will cost \$150). There will be a cross in stones laid out in front of Our Lady and the cost to engrave the 4"x8" stones which will outline the cross will be \$200. On the 8"x8" pavers you can have up to six lines per paver and 14 letters and spaces per line (each 8"x8" paver will cost \$300). There are samples of the sizes and lettering of the pavers in the entrance of the church. If you are interested in having a memorial stone (or stones) done please fill out the forms by the sample pavers and give the form and payment to the office.

Please type up what you would like to say on the paver (and double check your spelling) and submit your form with the payment to the office (or you can mail it in). At this point any submissions might be delayed after the pavers were installed, but once there is a group of requests for memorialized pavers they will be installed.
