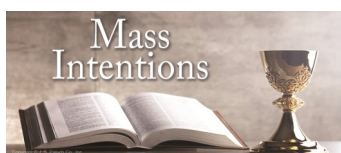

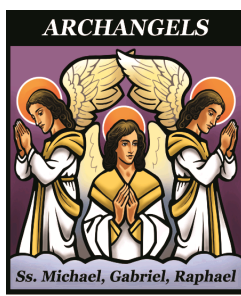

“UNDERSTANDING THE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN”

The Legacy Campaign is being conducted to raise money to be placed into existing endowments to support Ministries. One of those ministries is Vocations. The advantages sought by the use of endowments is that they are “permanent and sustainable.” This is done by only using income from the endowment that does not reduce the corpus of the endowment. So, in a year that 10% is produced by the investment, and inflation is 8%, only 2% would be available to be spent for vocations that year. The Case Statement examples say that the current endowments generate 5% in interest. And the examples for the Legacy additions assume that the full \$50 M in

pledges are raised and those pledges are fully realized as \$7.5 M in cash for Vocations. The Case Statement implies that an increase in the Vocations Endowment translates into an increase of 5 seminarians annually. Costs of training will rise over time, but more money does not equate to having more seminarians in training. It will allow the diocese to help fund the same number of students as now at the increased costs in the future due to inflation. The Case Statement lists all of the sources of vocations funding that are used now, and all of these sources will continue with the Legacy funds being a small but “permanent and sustainable” addition to them other sources.
