THE JOURNEY OF FAITH WITH

Betrayal after betrayal. His Apostles fall asleep as He prepares to undergo His passion. Is it really too much to ask to keep watch and pray? And then there is Judas. He has been with Jesus for three years. For three years he has followed Him, watched Him, seen the miracles, heard the teachings, saw the love. And yet now he comes forward and betrays our Lord with a kiss. It is not enough that he betrays Him, but He must do so with a sign of love itself.



While Judas' sin was the gravest, almost all the Apostles would abandon Him. The

Beloved Disciple alone would be there with Him at the foot of the cross, with Mary, His mother, and a few of his other closest disciples. Peter, the one chosen to 'strengthen his brothers,' would deny him not once....not twice....but three times in the hours to come. Truly, darkness covered the earth. Truly, the world was in need of great mercy.

And in the Resurrection of

Jesus Christ, the doors to this mercy are now open and accessible. Not that we deserved it. Not that we earned it. But God loves us. So much so that He came down from Heaven, took on humanity, endured the Passion, suffered cruelly, and hung upon the Cross for us. This is love.

In the glory of His Resurrection, He promises that we too can be triumphant over sin and death. We can share in His victory. We do not have to be bound up any longer. When we stray, we have but to turn back to Him, to repent, and not only find His forgiveness, but also the grace that we need to overcome sin itself. This is His promise. This is our hope.

During these days in which we celebrate these mysteries, there are many contrasts that can be drawn. The King, with a reed for a scepter and thorns for a crown. The King, not with a throne of precious metal but of wood.



The all-powerful one, choosing weakness. Pilate and Herod, the secular and the religious, each with their own reasons. Barabbas and Jesus—both the Son of the Father (Bar= Son, Abba = Father), both promising to be a Savior (Jesus wants to free people from sin and death, Barabbas wanted to free the people from Roman rule), both desiring to establish a Kingdom (Jesus in Heaven, Barabbas on earth).

But the most fitting for this day is Peter and Judas. Both denied or betrayed our Lord, each for their own reasons, each in their own ways. Both wept bitterly for their transgressions. But only one stuck around to seek forgiveness from Christ, while the other sought an earthly salvation, and when denied even that, gave in to despair and hung himself. Judas could have been forgiven. He could have been reconciled to the Apostles. He could have become a bearer of the Good News. All he had to do was turn to Christ.

Jesus desires mercy. There is no question of this. We have but to look to the cross to be reminded. However He can not give us that mercy if we are holding onto our sins. We must bring them to Him and we must acknowledge our offenses. In doing so, Jesus is rich in mercy. He forgives us, and welcomes us home—no matter how far we have strayed. This is love. There is nothing that He can't, that He won't forgive—except the sins we hold onto. By our sins, we choose something other than Jesus, we choose something other than love. And until we are willing to let go of that, we close ourselves off to His mercy. It isn't that Jesus denies us—we deny ourselves. We can not grasp onto Him while still holding onto to other things.

On this Divine Mercy Sunday, we call to mind the greatness of God's love and mercy for us. As we give thanks for the New Life He comes to bring, let us look for those areas deep within where we stand in need of His mercy, and let us lay them at His feet—that we may see the power and glory of God at work in our own lives, that we may truly have new life in Him.
