
The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity



**Happy Trinity Sunday!**

Every year, on the Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate the Trinity. One God, Three Persons—Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Today’s feast is rather ancient. In the 4th centuries, in order to help offset some of the false teachings around the person of Jesus Christ (Was he a ghost? Just a human? A human who became God?), special set of prayers was written which could be used on any number of Sundays. At the turn of the first millennium, Pope Alexander II declared that every day was devoted to the Trinity. Every Mass is a participation in the one Sacrifice of Jesus Christ in and through the power of the Holy Spirit to the Father, as the Father pours Himself out into His Son and together they send the Holy Spirit upon us. Starting in the 9th century, the Frankish bishops selected today’s date as the annual feast day—something which was incorporated into the whole Church five hundred years later in the 14th century. Not only do we celebrate this annual feast, but it is something we call to mind every time we make the Sign of the Cross or pray the Glory Be.

The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them. It is the most fundamental and essential teaching in the "hierarchy of the truths of faith". The whole history of salvation is identical with the history of the way and the means by which the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, reveals himself to men "and reconciles and unites with himself those who turn away from sin" (CCC, 234).




Throughout the centuries different analogies and symbols have been used to try and teach this truth of the faith. St. Patrick famously used the analogy of a Shamrock to teach about the Trinity, although the pansy was more popular in northern Europe—still referred to there as the ‘Trinity Flower.’ A triangle is an obvious symbol of the Trinity.

St. Augustine used a candle—the candle, the wick and the flame. Others have used the apple—the peel (The Father protects us), the flesh (Jesus became flesh for us) and the seeds (The Spirit helps us grow in virtue and holiness). The Trinity is a great mystery. It is one that we are familiar with in many ways. But it is good to take time and pray and reflect on the mystery of God and His love for us.

But it is also good to celebrate feasts! Every Sunday is a Feast Day—a Holy Day (of Obligation). But these special feasts of the year should be celebrated in special ways to bring the liturgical year alive in our homes—and not just in our churches. For Trinity Sunday, why not make a Trinity Sundae! On this particular feast, I recommend Neapolitan Ice Cream—Three flavors, one ice cream. Three persons, one God. I’ll let you figure out which flavor is which divine person. Another good (and sugary!) option would be Triple Chocolate anything—brownies, cake, .... you can never go wrong with lots of chocolate. If you are looking for some ideas for dinner—perhaps macaroni and cheese with three cheeses. If you have some three leaf clover decorations from St. Patrick’s day, break them out! Whatever the case, be sure to celebrate this great feast, as we celebrate our Triune God—Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

**Public Service Announcement:**

This week I played phone tag with a Hospice Chaplain for 2 days. I called her at least eight different times. Because everything goes through a call screening center, I can never talk to her directly when I call. Because I have meetings and Masses and classes, I am not always available when she calls. Under the HIPPA Privacy regulations, she is not able to leave a message for me—either on voicemail or with the Front Office— with the name of a patient asking for me to come visit them. Should you find yourself in a position of requesting a visit from a priest, please indicate that you waive your HIPPA privacy protections with regard to the priest to enable me to respond quicker. Thankfully the hospitals have a good system set up, with a live person always there when I return a call, so that I can get that information quickly. You can always just call the parish directly, too, if you are in need of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick when someone is dying—just dial the extension for “If this is a Sacramental Emergency and you are in need of a priest.”



### The 2016/17 school year has ended!

- On Friday, Grades 1-7 had their last day of school, ending the school year with an all-school mass and lots of excitement for the summer.
- Before the last day, there were a few field trips that happened. First grade visited Woodland Park Zoo to see the animals that many of them did their reports upon. Fourth grade experienced the Underground Tour and capped off their trip with a picnic down at Alki Beach.
- Fifth grade completed their book drive for Lowell Elementary School, helping a fellow school with providing reading materials for students over the summer.
- Kindergarten had their graduation ceremony, complete with graduation caps and a presentation that showed off their knowledge of our school-wide learning expectations (SLEs).


### **New Hearing Assistance System!**

Instead of using headsets which are easily knocked on the ground, we now have receiver packs with ear pieces. The receiver pack hangs on a lanyard hung around the neck. The lanyard has an inductive loop which will interface with personal hearing aids with telecoils. Most newer hearing aids have this technology, which means that these individuals won't have to wear the earpieces, but that the church's hearing assistance system will connect to their personal hearing assistance devices.
