Easter Sunday: The Resurrection of the Lord

Jesus Christ

Happy Easter!

On this day, Jesus Christ rose from the grave.

Celebrating Easter

This is the great and wonderful mystery that we are celebrating. But what does our celebration actually look like? Growing up, the major events of the day were Easter morning Mass and Easter dinner at my grandparent's house with my mom's side of the family. Of course there were other important elements as well. As my brother and I woke up we would find our Easter baskets in the living room — my brother always got peeps, where I preferred the chocolate covered marshmallow eggs. There was usually an Easter egg hunt as well at some point, if not several with my cousins. And of course the family picture in front of the Rhododendron tree. Easter also meant that whatever I gave up for Lent I could now indulge in. These were our Easter rituals.

Last week I ran into a parishioner at Costco who asked for my thoughts on the age when children should no longer receive Easter baskets. I informed her that not only do my brother and I still get one every year from my parents, but that my grandmother hid eggs outside for my uncle when he was 50 years old and made him go out and find them all.

Celebrating Easter, Part II

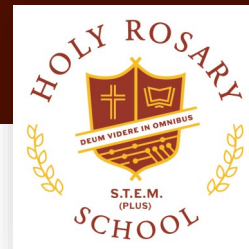
All of that was and is well and good, as our families are supposed to be places where we encounter God's love—He who is the origin of every family. No family is perfect, as we each have our own brokenness, but as far as possible, it is important that on feast days we celebrate with those closest to us.

But Easter is about something much more—something which should not just effect what we do, but more importantly, who we are and how we live. We all have crosses in life. As we celebrate Easter, we celebrate the God who is not only bigger than the crosses, but who through them can lead us to unending happiness and joy. The brokenness of our lives and of our world is not the end of the story. Just as Jesus conquered sin and death, so too He promises that we can share in His victory. Hence our lives can be filled with peace and joy and love and hope—things we could all use more of—here in this world, and forever. But Jesus leaves the choice up to us—whether we live as His children, with Him, receiving these gifts, or whether we go our own way.

Easter should change our lives and the way we live. If we are truly the disciples of Christ, if we are truly living as children of God, then this day should impact every day of our lives, as we live as His beloved and as we receive His grace. This year, be sure not just to celebrate Easter in the usual ways, but to truly celebrate and embrace and live that gift of new life that Jesus has come to bring in and through His Resurrection. 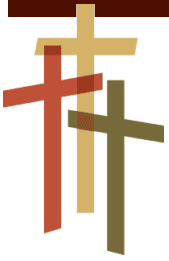

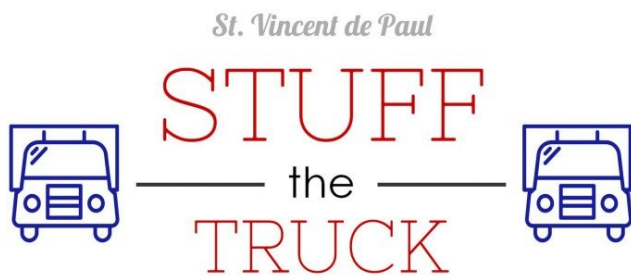
Holy Rosary Parish CYO Track and Field
