Third Sunday of Easter

As the first bishop of the new Diocese of Nesqually (later to be renamed the Diocese of Seattle), Bishop Blanchet set himself to the task of providing nourishment to the local Catholic population, as well as proclaiming the Gospel to all the rest—in particular, the local Native Americans. His diary and collections of his letters provide a wonderful story of the life of the early Church here in Washington state. Very often the demands outstripped his resources, as he received delegations and sometimes chief's themselves asking for 'black robes' (priests) and/or sisters, as there was always a need of money to help with construction of churches or aid in the work or ministry to those in need.



In his first year, on one particular day, his diary tells the story of his mind being far away in Montreal. It was the Feast of Corpus Christi, and in Montreal grand processions would be taking place through the city streets. He wondered aloud in his diary whether or not such processions might one day happen here, too.

We believe that at every single Mass, through the power of the Holy Spirit, the bread and wine are changed and transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ. Jesus comes into our midst and gives himself to us as true food. The Feast of Corpus Christi was established, to celebrate this wonderful mystery, in the 14th century.

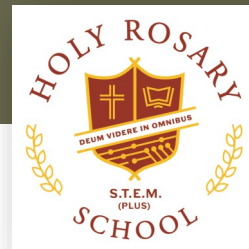
In veneration of our Lord, and in public witness to our faith in Him, the practice emerged of Corpus Christi Processions—where the Blessed Sacrament, held in a monstrance, is carried by the priest. A veil is held over his head—a baldachino, as a sign of the presence of the Holy, and the priest and people together go into the streets of the neighborhood or town, and then return to the church. Each and every week, we receive our Lord, present in the Blessed Sacrament. We are called to be changed and transformed by Him whom we receive. We are called to take Jesus with us into our homes, the marketplace and in our streets. On the feast of Corpus Christi, some do that in a very literal way.

This year, on May 31st, after Mass at 8:35am with the school, we are going to have a Eucharistic Procession. The plan is to circle the block, and come back to the church for Benediction—the final blessing. The Feast of Corpus Christi falls on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday, which is the Sunday after Pentecost. Here in the United States the feast is moved to Sunday.

I hope you will put this feast and procession on your calendar. We are currently working on the details, and working with the City of Seattle to plan and prepare. If you are interested in helping in some way, please contact Robert King at evangelization@holyroaryseattle.org.



A year ago, my parents and I visited Montreal and Quebec. Much of our early history owes a great debt to those places, the origins not only of our first bishop, but also of our first religious—the Sisters of Providence. It just so happened that I was there for the Feast of Corpus Christi. A few years ago, the Archbishop restarted the age old practice of the procession, and with hundreds of people we walked with our Lord out the doors of the Cathedral into the city streets. We walked past restaurants and bars and stores of every sort, singing our hymns of praise, in adoration of our King. It was a powerful experience, as well as a powerful witness. This Spring, we will experience the same in our streets, as we seek to walk always with the Lord.



School Highlights & Our Upcoming Auction

Our 5th grade Reading class spent several weeks in book clubs. Students picked a book group, took turns leading discussions, and at the end put together a book summary using Google Slides that they presented in class. They were graded on creativity and appearance of their slides, content, participation and presentation. Audience participation was also a part of the grading criteria.

In 6th grade, students in Science used different materials to produce chemical reactions in a zip lock bag. This closed system allowed students to observe gas more critically. Students will take a test on mixtures and solutions based on their notes taken in class and the results of their experiments.

First graders explored being engineers, having spent time studying how walls are built and the materials used. They worked in small groups to build a wall and later tested their walls in different scenarios, how it stood up to a 'wrecking ball' or an 'earthquake.'

Music, art, circle time, free-choice activity time, and outdoor recess are part of our preschool curriculum.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities: As part of Holy Rosary Parish you will assist us in carrying out the mission of Jesus Christ by the maintenance and cleaning of our school, church, and other buildings and grounds. This includes sweeping, mopping, floor stripping and polishing, dusting, cleaning bathrooms, and other basic janitorial duties. You may also be asked to perform minor maintenance duties as well.
