

### **Annual Catholic Appeal:**

#### **Supporting the Ministries of the Archdiocese of Seattle**

Most of our experience of the Catholic faith is in and through our parish community. It is there that we receive the Sacraments, it is there that we worship on Sundays, it is there that we live and grow together on the journey of faith with our neighbors. Holy Rosary has a host of different ministries to serve our parishioners and those in our community, as individuals share their different gifts in service to the Lord and one another. But there are some ministries which are bigger than any single parish community, or which serve a much broader area. This is one of the reasons for the existence of the Archdiocesan offices, as they help parishes to thrive, but as they also facilitate some of these broader ministries which serve us all. This includes everything from Catholic Community Services, to our youth summer camps, our campus ministries at colleges, or the formation and training of our future priests. These important works and ministries are funded through a special effort every year—the Annual Catholic Appeal—as every parish participates and helps make these possible.

You should have each received letters in the mail from the Archbishop asking for your participation in these works of the Body of Christ here in the Archdiocese. Each parish receives a goal from the Archdiocese of Seattle. Every dollar we raise over that goal comes back to us. For the last two years, our rebate has gone to our Bell Tower fund. Below is an update on that project. This year our rebate is going to go to replacing our parish bus, which is used each weekend to transport parishioners to Mass who are unable to get here on their own, often because of age and/or infirmity. It is also used to transport the women for our onsite women's shelter from September through June. It is also used by various parish and school groups for field trips and outings.

This week, please pray about what your contribution to the ACA will be this year. I thank you for your generosity. Our parish community, and the wider Archdiocese, have life because her members share the gifts that they have been given from the Lord. It is always wonderful to see this at work, whether it be those who clean up the pews each week, those who prepare the flowers and decorations in the Church, those who serve in Mass, those who stuff the bulletin, those who blow the leaves off the sidewalk, those who share their own faith and/or lead others in doing so, those who lead us in the praise of God, those who lift us up to the Lord in prayer, those who assist others in moving, those who visit the homebound or those in need, those who prepare meals for the hungry, or the countless other ways that people give of their gifts. On May 11th, the staff and I are hosting a Volunteer Appreciation Dinner as a small way to say 'Thank You' to our countless volunteers. Please RSVP to the parish office for you (and your family) so that we can plan accordingly! Last year we even have volunteers who wanted to volunteer at the Volunteer Appreciation Dinner. I hope that you will come as we celebrate you and your gifts and your generosity.

#### **Bell Tower Update**

The current Queen of the Most Holy Rosary Church (our official name) was built in 1937. It was built in such a way that it truly fulfills its role of reminding us of God's presence in our midst. This is true of the Bell Tower, in particular, which rings out several times each day and before Mass, and can be heard and seen all over West Seattle. The top 25' of the Bell Tower, however, is unreinforced masonry—which is of grave concern of collapse in earthquakes because of its instability. Rain water also comes through the open windows at the top, which is mostly caught at present by a system of garbage cans for storage. Two of the exterior sides in particular are also in need of maintenance on the mortar between the bricks. Our project got a little stalled in the design phase, but we are moving again. We have a new architect we are working with in cooperation with our structural engineer, and are meeting with the city to receive approval of our planning and design work so that we can finalize the design and fix the tower and address the various issues. The estimated cost of the project is still at \$315,000. To date, we have received:

2016 ACA Rebate: \$27,398.17

2017 ACA Rebate: \$10,680.98 (*one final rebate distribution to be received, probably \$1-2k*)


Bell Tower donations: \$103,718.71

Total Donations to Date: \$141,797.86

About one-third of the donations came from a bequest from Chelly Chelminiak. He was a devoted parishioner who was instrumental with our campus maintenance and upgrades in the recent past. He passed away last spring, and included Holy Rosary in his will. In death, as in life, he will continue to help us with his legacy gift. The remainder of the project will be funded by a bequest from James Martin. He passed away in 2013, and we will be receiving the final distribution this summer. This second bequest will cover the cost difference for the project, plus give us a cushion for the unexpected. Thank you to all who have donated to the Appeal, and/or made special donations, so that we can ensure our bell tower continues to ring out the Good News.

Student must be age 2.5 by August 31st. This is a drop-off class on Mondays and Fridays from 8:30am-11:00am. Class size will be 10 students and 2 teachers. Music, art, circle time, free-choice activity time, and outdoor recess are part of our preschool curriculum.

Students are engaged by enthusiastic teachers who provide hands-on curricula designed to spark creativity and encourage critical thinking. Recycle as much as possible. EPA figures show recycling aluminum cans saves 95 percent of the energy used when making new ones from raw materials. The energy saving is as much as 70 percent when recycling steel and tin cans, 60 percent for paper and about 33 percent for glass and plastic.


