#### THE JOURNEY OF FAITH WITH

## Fr. Matthew Oakland

#### Ora et Labora.

This was the motto of St. Benedict and the order that he founded. Prayer and Work.

After going to Rome for his education, Benedict decided to leave and live a solitary life about the year 500. Attempting to living in a cave as a hermit, his holiness soon attracted others who came to him for counsel and advice, or even to follow his way of life. After three years, a group of monks convinced him to come and become their abbot after theirs had died. Once he arrived, though, the austere lifestyle that he asked of them was too

much—and they tried to poison him. Thankfully as he said his meal time blessing, the wine cup shattered and a raven came and flew off with the bread. Needless to say, he returned to his cave. But more and more disciples came to him, and so he started organizing new monasteries and writing a Rule of Life.

His Rule of Life would guide Benedictine communities for 1500 years, and countless others, as other religious communities used it in shaping their own, as well. And while it outlines their life in the monastery, it actually provides some great insights for those outside monasteries, as well.

Chapter 22, On Sleeping Arrangements: "On arising for the Work of God, they will quietly encourage each other, for the sleepy like to make excuses." I am a night owl—and always have been. In my last two years of college, while in a formation program, thankfully my roommate was not, as we rose each morning for Morning Prayer in the Chapel with the others in the program. As such, it was rather common for him to "encourage" me—although I will also admit that while it might have started out as quiet, it didn't always end that way. As we heard in the second reading today, we all have our weaknesses. This is but one example of the many places throughout the Rule that St. Benedict urges us to treat faults and failings and weaknesses with gentleness and compassion when possible, and to encourage when possible before reproaching.

Chapter 31: Qualifications of the Monastery Cellarer: "He will regard all utensils and goods of the monastery as sacred vessels of the altar, aware that nothing is to be neglected." While we might think the Cellarer is in charge of the Wine Cellar, and a very desirable job, the Cellarer was responsible for the daily operations of the monastery, including the material goods. Its quite a task, second only to the Abbot. And with the largeness of that task, of running the kitchen, of visiting the sick, of tabulating and ordering supplies, of distributing to monks that which they need, St. Benedict instructs his cellarers to be mindful even of the utensils. In the Abbey, there was always a radical equality—whether your came in rich or poor, as a noble or an orphan, you were treated the same—as a brother. What was true of the people was also true of things, as well. Pope Francis has called us to a special Care of our Common Home. Part of this entails not wasting that which we have, or devaluing things as little and therefore insignificant or unworthy. At my last parish, I remember a parent once commented that she wished her son could manage to throw the bed cover up with a fraction of the effort and attention that he used in carefully folding and unfolding the altar cloths and linens. We should treat all things as holy, as if they are from God and used in worship of Him — because they are!

Ora et Labora. Prayer and Work. These two words summed up the Benedictine Life—the short version of the Rule of Life.



Work was not something extraneous, but part of the holy pursuit of God. Worship at the altar is important. Worshipping God while at the altar of a desk is also important—as we give our best, as we use our God-given talents, as we become co-creators with God, as we seek to build up our community while supporting our families. There can be great dignity in labor when seen in pursuit of Heaven—whether teaching, programming, healing, banking, or whatever it might be.


Chapter 72: The Good Zeal of Monks: "No one is to pursue what he judges better for himself, but instead, what he judges better for someone else. To their fellow monks they show the pure love of brothers; to God, loving fear; to their abbot, unfeigned and humble love. Let them prefer nothing whatever to Christ, and may he bring us all together to everlasting life."

New for 2018-19, we will be bulk buying school supplies and passing on the savings to parents. Costs for school supplies per student is dependent on grade and will be communicated in August.


