Called to Serve as Christ


This campaign is an opportunity for us to do a lot of good! It is an opportunity to fully fund retirement for priests and our religious sisters for generations to come, those who dedicated their lives in service to God and His people, those who served us as Christ.

- It also supports our parish community in many ways.
- If the campaign is fully funded, fully funding priest and sisters' retirement, then the current sourcing of funding decrease or go away all together. \$19,000 of our Annual Catholic Appeal goal and about \$19,000 of our annual parish assessments fund priest retirement right now. Imagine what we could do with that money in our own community if we no longer need it to pay for priest retirement?
- We earn a 15% rebate on every donation up to our \$1.411 million Archdiocesan Goal. Over our goal, we earn an 85% rebate, with the other 15% going to the pillars of the campaign—retirement funds, extra costs, or back to the parishes. This is why our Finance Council, Facility and Maintenance Committee and School Commission leadership set a goal of \$2 million—to take care of our needed campus upgrades by taking advantage of that large rebate.
- -If we reach our \$2 million goal, we will be able to fix the rest of the stained glass windows that are breaking and bulging,

allowing them to inspire us for generations to come. With help from the School Auction and possibly grants, we will also be able to install a new Big Toy—a safe environment for our children and those of our neighbor's to play. We will also perform the necessary work on our brick and mortar buildings to protect their structural integrity by tuckpointing.

Will you join us in helping accomplish these incredible goods, by making a pledge which is payable over the next three or four years?

Important Note: Priests who have been found to have credibly abused a minor no longer benefit from the regular pension plan supported by your donations and this campaign, but from a separately created pension plan. Legal settlements have been funded by insurance and from sales of unneeded properties.



Baby Lucas Update


Thank you to those who have been keeping my nephew Lucas in your prayers. He was born on March 19th with four heart defects and a stomach that is on the wrong side of his body, leading to some malrotated intestines as well, which have the potential of further twisting and complications. Unless a problem arises, there is no plan in the short term to address the digestional tract. The heart defects have obviously been the big concern from the beginning. We were thankful when he didn't require surgery right away. The unique nature of his heart defects has meant that his heart has continued working—just in his own way—and his oxygen has stayed above 90% - which is incredible. He is perfectly broken.

In July we found out surgery was going to be moved up from originally planned in December. They did a CT scan to make a 3D model of his heart in August. Last week his case was presented to a team of 40 or so doctors, nurses and specialists at Seattle Children's. Their big concern is still his weight—at 13 pounds he in the 0 percentile. So they have decided to push the surgery off again until he is at least 15 pounds as long as his oxygen levels are stable. He is gaining weight—but very, very slowly. The doctor's have said Lucas is "literally one in a billion" in terms of the uniqueness of his combination of defects, and his ability to go this long without any assistance. And yet—they believe that they have a plan that will fully fix his heart, something not always possible with cases of fewer or less severe defects. It only confirms what we have always known—miracles happen.

Thank you for your continued prayers for Lucas. We have been invoking the intercession of Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati. The Archbishop was kind enough to give Lucas a 2nd class relic—a piece of the sheets from his deathbed. The community at my home parish of St. Michael's Parish in Olympia is also invoking his intercession for the pastor there, Fr. Jim Lee, diagnosed this past year with ALS. Blessed Pier Giorgio needs a second miracle to be canonized a saint—we are volunteering for #2 and #3!

Why Do We Care for God's Creation?

By being good stewards of creation, we recognize and honor our Creator. We also care for creation because we believe that people deserve to live in conditions that uphold their God-given dignity. **When the environment suffers, human beings suffer.**

When natural disaster strikes, people living in fragile homes and those whose livelihoods depend on nature are the most devastated. Catholic Relief Services witnesses this through work with the poor in more than 100 countries due to loss of their homes and livelihoods due to droughts, heatwaves, flooding, and mudslides. In 2008 alone, more than 20 million people were displaced by climate-related natural disasters, including 800,000 people by cyclone Nargis in Asia, and almost 80,000 by heavy floods and rains in Brazil. And this doesn't even include all the wildlife and fauna species that are lost every day!

What are some suggestions that you can do to help?

Saint of the Week

Every week, we highlight a particular saint. This week, we focus on St. Thérèse of Lisieux. St. Thérèse lived less than 25 years, having suffered from tuberculosis, and was hardly known to anyone in her lifetime. But her memoirs of her spiritual struggles as a young girl and as a Carmelite nun described a “Little Way” of profound trust in God’s love for her and for all, so many call her “The Little Flower”. She is a patron of missions and of those seeking holiness in everyday life. Her feast is October 1.





How much of the funds donated to the campaign is going to the Archdiocese?

All campaign funds raised will be put toward the

needs and priorities identified in the campaign case book and on the campaign website. **None** of the campaign funds raised are going to the Archdiocese of Seattle for operating expenses. If the campaign raises more than our \$100 million goal, those funds will still only be used towards the needs identified in the campaign case statement and returned to parishes at a greater (85 percent) share.

In our parish, the money raised will be used for the renovation of the remainder of stained glass windows, the Big Toy, and Tuckpointing of our buildings. If more is raised, we will finish funding the church door replacement and needed renovations to our school and gym bathrooms. The remainder will be used to support the retirement and medical needs of our priests and sisters throughout the Archdiocese.
