Mission and Identity

Jesus calls us into relationship with Him. As disciples, He also describes what our lives must look like to remain in Him. But we are not stagnant in that relationship. Christ leads us to the Father, who sends the Son. Together, they send the Holy Spirit, who leads us to Christ. This is the inner life of the Trinity—which we are caught up in as we are caught up in their love itself. From this we gain our identity—we become children of God. We too, therefore, share the mission of the Son. Just as He was sent into the world for the sake of the whole world, so to in His final words in the Gospel of Matthew, He sends us out—literally to all the nations. He also gives us a purpose, a mission, connected with our identity, to incorporate others into this life of God.

God has planted us in West Seattle. That means that we are called to live as disciples of Jesus right here—followers of Him. That means that we are called to live as Apostles of Christ right here—bearers of His Word.

Through the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Christ, and through the Holy Spirit—God gives life to the world in and through the Church. Every time you look up at our rose window, that is the message. In the middle—symbols of God: the circle, which is eternal; the triangle, representing the three persons of God; the victorious Lamb of God. From this central core, we see the fire of the Spirit enlivening the twelve petals. We also see crosses with white dogwood flowers—symbols of the Resurrection. Each petal represents an Apostle. St. Peter, as chief of the Apostles, is at twelve o’clock. He was given the keys by Jesus, and died on an upside down cross. St. Matthew, at seven o’clock, started life as a tax collector with his money bags. God, through each of these apostles, reaches out to the whole world, symbolized in the outer rim. Through the Church, God bears fruit in the world—symbolized in wheat and grapes, which are also Eucharistic symbols—Christ’s continuing presence in the world.


Through the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Christ, and through the Holy Spirit—God gives life to the world in and through the Church. Not just the Apostles—but you and I as well. It is up to us as members of the Body of Christ, His hands and feet, to continue His work. First and foremost, in our own lives as faithful disciples, heeding His commandments, living a life of prayer and in communion with one another, nourished by the Sacraments, growing in virtue, on the way to Heaven. But also, as Apostles to the world, proclaiming the Good News, healing the brokenhearted, teaching and baptizing all nations.

Through the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Christ, and through the Holy Spirit—God gives life to the world in and through you and I, if we are faithful members of the Church.

This is true here in West Seattle. But we also express this in solidarity with our brothers and sisters throughout the world. For several years, we have been raising funds to help Fr. Charles Ssentenza open a medical clinic. The St. Charles Lwanga Clinic opens today!! Thank you for your generosity. A bequest helped them cross the finish line, and also financed the expansion of one project and the beginning of another. By expanding their pigsty and purchasing land to plant Eucalyptus trees, the local community will find resources near at hand, and the clinic will have a stable source of income for years to come.

St. Charles Lwanga was martyred in Uganda at the age of 26. He was the chief of the royal pages of King Mwanga II of Buganda. He also became the chief of all the staff when his predecessor reproached the king for massacring recently arrived Christian missionaries. St. Charles had just been baptized himself. When questioned, he led the Christian pages in declaring their faithfulness to Christ. He also protected them from the king’s sexual advances. Angered by their faith, and the corresponding refusal of his carnal desires, 21 Catholic and Anglican boys and men were executed, including their leader, St. Charles Lwanga. The Martyrs of Uganda were canonized by Pope Paul VI in 1964.





School Highlights & Events

The 2018–2019 school year is complete! This week included our Kindergarten graduation ceremony. Several of the Kindergarten’s 8th grade buddies, who went through their own graduation last week, came to congratulate and cheer on their Kindergarten buddies. Besides the Kindergarten graduation, we also welcomed in our newest families with New Parent Orientation.

Our 6th grade class held Readers’ Theatre for our 2nd graders. Fourth grade enjoyed a field trip exploring below the streets of Seattle on the very entertaining and historical Underground Tour. After the field trip, students had a picnic and playtime together down at Alki, where the Denny party first arrived in 1851. 


A weekly tip on Caring for Our Common Home

Saint of the Week

Every week, we highlight a particular saint. This week, we remember St. Aloysius Gonzaga. As the eldest son of a noble Italian family, Aloysius (or Luigi, as he was known in Italian) was expected to become a soldier and to lead the family as Marquis. But the violence and debauchery of Renaissance Italy disgusted him, and he found



inspiration in the stories of Jesuit missionaries. Against his family’s wishes, he joined the Society of Jesus. While still a student, he ministered to plague victims in Rome, and before he was ordained he died of the plague himself. He was only 23 years old. We celebrate his feast on June 21.


