## SAINT OF THE WEEK

This week, we celebrate Sts. Perpetua and Felicity. Perpetua was a young North African noblewoman and mother of a newborn infant who wrote an account of how she and several others, including a pregnant slave named Felicity, and their children, were



put to death by Roman authorities around AD 200. She describes the fervor of their faith in Jesus, and the comfort they received in the form of dreams and the kindness of some guards. We know little about them except that, whether rich or poor, all were equally willing to give everything else up rather than reject Christ. Their courage is a model for us to stand by our belief even in the face of opposition or threats, and to trust both ourselves and our children into the care of Jesus. Their feast is March 6.

# In the Spotlight

## What is Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW)?

"Amen, I say to you, whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it." *Luke 18:17* 

Children love to explore at the world around them. Their minds are filled with questions. They talk to God the way they talk to their friends: with honesty, sincerity, love, and joy. They have the capability to pray and worship very well when someone shows them the way.

Children' Liturgy of the Word is one way of expanding the range of a child's ability to pray and be nurtured of the word of God. When we facilitate the Children's Liturgy of the Word, we are trying to:

- Support children in having an age-appropriate experience of the Liturgy of the Word
- Support children in applying the Word of God to their own daily experiences and actions
- Support children in developing their personal relationship with God.
- Support children in learning how to participate in the celebration of the Holy Mass.

During 10:30 AM Sunday Mass, elementary-aged children are dismissed after the opening prayer (Collect) to celebrate the Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW), and they return to Mass following the homily. Children are divided into three groups according to their school grade. CLOW is free and no need to enroll. Just come to the 10:30 AM Mass and bring your children with you.
