


Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Times

The Journey of Faith with Father Matthew Oakland

Back to (New) Normal

Last weekend it was a joy to welcome people back to Mass—even if I could only see part of their faces because of the masks, and even if it was only some people because of ongoing risk. While we initially asked people to only sign up for Mass every two weeks to give everyone an opportunity to come, we are now permitting individuals to sign up weekly if they desire.

The Mass is different—there is no question about it.



I have sticky notes all over the Roman Missal reminding me to skip some parts, and not to sing others. When I was first ordained, I didn't sing any

of the prayers or dialogues of Mass. My pastor was unrelenting. I begrudged that yes, the many musical notations in the Missal itself would indicate that it is supposed to be sung, not to mention that it has always been our liturgical practice going back to the days of the Temple and the synagogue. As St. Augustine said, “Only the lover sings.” And so we sing our prayers to the Lord – except right now, we sing only with our hearts. It is a part of who we are, and is a sacrifice, but if it means that we can be together for the Eucharist, then it is a sacrifice that is worth it.

Looking Ahead—the Fall

Before COVID-19, there is usually at least one thing happening in each of our five buildings on campus every weeknight. To manage this, every May, the staff and I have a Calendaring Day where we get together in a room for six hours with our own individual calendars and we map out the coming 14 months, scheduling as many meetings and events for parish and school programming as possible, as well as outside events we host.

Given how many unknowns there are, we have delayed our Calendaring Day until August. This means that we unfortunately have no schedules yet.

We will be assessing what spaces will be available for what use and when, and ensuring we have adequate janitorial staffing present, as well.


This coming year is going to be different. And our goal is to have as many aspects of regular parish life as possible, and the rest in adapted forms as possible. It is that “as possible” part, though, which will take some serious planning, as we also look for new ways to connect and grow together as disciples of our Lord Jesus Christ.

In the Meantime

The Parish Office will remain closed until August 10th and the staff will continue to telecommute. All parish ministries will continue to meet in alternative platforms, primarily online, with the exception of our social ministries serving those in need, which are allowed to gather for this purpose under strict guidelines.

There is ongoing risk as the number of new cases in King County has started to climb again. This is also in consideration of the high cleaning requirements which must be carried out by staff to ensure full compliance with our reopening plans. Our maintenance staff, besides cleaning up after Masses and the few social ministries, are working hard to finish the summer classroom cleaning in much less time than usual. If we are going to reopen for in-person school with social distancing, most of the grades which are currently split up into two classes will be divided into three instead, utilizing more space, and requiring existing classroom furniture to be moved around, some new furniture brought in, as well as installation of extra other equipment, such as plumbed handwashing stations.

There is an ancient principle which I have called to mind a lot these past few months: Do not make the perfect the enemy of the good. There are things we are deprived of right now. But we can't let that rob us of the goodness God always has in store for His faithful. So let us remain faithful to the Lord!




