# The Journey of Faith with

Fr. Matthew Oakland



St. Clare is the first known person to have watched a livestreamed Mass. In the early 1200s with Saint Francis she founded the women's branch of his new Franciscan Order. St. Clare suffered from a variety of physical maladies, and was often unable to leave her room or even her bed—even for Mass. One year, for Midnight Mass at Christmas, the Lord granted her a special grace in the form of a vision of Mass then happening in the chapel. In 1958, Pope Pius XII declared her the patron saint of television.

Especially in the beginning of the Stay Home, Stay Safe order, when there were no public Masses, watching on television, computer or phone were the only ways to participate in the Mass. Thankfully we have reopened for public Masses, but many still remain home as they avoid all outside interaction due to their own individual risk levels in particular.

Sunday Mass “attendance” looks much different these days. We have our three Masses, with about 170 people coming to Mass each Sunday in person, 85 watching live online, and another 475 online views during the week. We have yet to be at full capacity for in person attendance at Mass.

Because of the pandemic, the bishops have granted a dispensation from Holy Days of Obligation—which include all Sundays as well as some other special feast days throughout the year. Those who were unable to come because of sickness or caring for someone who are sick are always exempted. And while watching online is nice to be able to do, it has never satisfied the obligation of actually being present, and hopefully being able to receive the Eucharist, as well.

Sunday is the Lord's Day. And that is always true—whether there is a pandemic or not. Sunday is not just part of the weekend. It is not just Saturday part two. It is not just an extra day of the week to get things done. It is the Day of the Resurrection. And just as we celebrate Easter Sunday as a different day, so too we should celebrate all of the Little Easters as a different day, as well.

Normally this means Sunday Mass—in person. It means gathering together with the community of

the Church in the worship of God as Christians have done for 2,000 years, and as our Jewish brothers and sisters did before that on the Saturday Sabbath.

Literally since the dawn of time God consecrated and set aside a Sabbath Day—and it is important for us to honor and live that way, too. It is a reminder to us that God is God—and we are not—and so we order our lives according to Him and His Creation. Our every act is one of returning home to the Lord at the end of our lives, but we take time out for special worship, as well, as we encounter Him in the Sacred Liturgy.

Right now some aren't able to return to Mass because of the pandemic, just as they have restricted themselves from other public gatherings, time with friends, entertainment, eating out, etc. In that case, watching Sunday Mass online is good and important, whether live and joining spiritually with those in the church at the time, or at some other time during Sunday. It should also be noted that it is the Lord's Day, not the Lord's Hour—so leaving early is never good. While it is different and weird to watch at home, it is good to set aside distractions, and enter in the best you can—which means no coffee, and no pajamas. Truly show up with and for the Lord, as you join in the gestures and responses as able, as if you were truly present.

The Lord's Day is a time for worship, recreation, rest, focusing on those most important things (God, family, friends; not laundry, yard work, etc.).

Next week we will start emailing out a weekly Gospel reflection for you and your household to spend time preparing for the Sunday celebration of Mass by reflecting on the Good News together. Growing as disciples, sharing the journey of faith, should be at the heart of our lives, and of your home, as the Domestic Church. As our lives experience much change, it is a good opportunity to ask ourselves whether they are what we want them to be—and what God wants them to be? How is He calling you to live differently, and more fully with Him?






