Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Journey of Faith with

Fr. Matthew Oakland



Next Sunday, October 4th, we also celebrate the Feast of St. Francis. Just years after his death he was canonized, and within a few years a massive three-level Basilica was built in Assisi to serve as the home of the new order, the resting place of the saint's remains, and a place for all to enter into the praise of God. Completed one hundred years after his death, 28 large frescoes collectively titled "The Legend of St. Francis" were then painted on the walls of the upper church. The story of his life is incredible, from start to end, such that even these 28 are not enough to tell many of the beloved or important stories from his life.

St. Francis is often thought of as an animal lover, and commonly depicted in yard statues with birds or a wolf. There are two main stories from the life of St. Francis pertaining to animals, though there were others as well, as told by his contemporary biographers.

One day, Francis was making his way through the countryside on a trip to proclaim the Good News to several villages, when he saw a great number of birds of different kinds nearby. He left the road and went over to them, who surprisingly did not startle. He greeted them, and asked if he could share with them the Word of God. He took their failure to stir as assent. "My brother and sister birds, you should praise your Creator and always love him: He gave you feathers for clothes, wings to fly and all other things that you need. It is God who made you noble among all creatures, making your home in thin, pure air. Without sowing or reaping, you receive God's guidance and protection."



The birds spread their wings, raised their necks, and praised God in a wonderful way according to their nature. Francis then walked through them, touching them with his tunic. He then blessed them and they flew off, as Francis and his companions journeyed on praising God.

On another occasion, he visited the town of Gubbio and found out they were being terrorized by a ravenous wolf who not only ate their livestock. Their attacks upon it failed, and he had started attacking and killing people as well. Francis and a companion went out to meet the wolf and as the wolf charged them from the woods, Francis made the Sign of the Cross toward it. The wolf slowed, and closed its mouth. "Come to me, Brother Wolf. In the name of Christ, I order you not to hurt anyone." The wolf lowered its head and lay down at his feet. Francis explained its sins to the wolf. "Brother Wolf, I want to make peace between you and the people of Gubbio. They will harm you no more and you must no longer harm them. All past crimes are to be forgiven." He asked the wolf to take a pact not to cause any more harm, and the wolf extended his large paw and shook Francis' hand. The wolf followed them back into town, where Francis preached to the people about repentance from sin, and repeated the pact with the wolf. Francis asked the people if they too would agree to live in peace with the wolf and feed him. All agreed, and the wolf became a welcome guest who went from home to home for food, and whose death was later mourned by the people.

Throughout his Canticle of the Sun, Francis constantly repeats the central theme: "**Praise be to you, my Lord.**" It was these same words that Pope Francis used as the opening of his encyclical five years ago, [Laudato Si](#), on the necessity of living in communion with all of Creation. All of Creation should live in praise of God, the Creator. His desire is for the victory of the Cross, the triumph of grace over sin and division, to be realized on earth and amongst all Creation. The painting to the left, one of those from the Basilica, is entitled "Sermon to the Birds." It wasn't just a question of loving animals, but loving and living in communion with all of Creation, and all of Creation living in faithfulness and praise of God the Father and Lord of us all.






