The Journey of Faith with Father Oakland

In 2018 Archbishop Sartain appointed me to the Archdiocesan Finance Council. It has been a fascinating look into a world that I never thought much about. The AFC relies upon the expertise of the laity in the investment, insurance, real estate, audit, church administration, technology and general finance fields. As the lone priest, I provide a pastor's perspective. While our role is mostly to advise the Archbishop, there are some things he can't do without our consent. We have 6 committees, and we participate in a number of other committees and commissions to help support Archdiocesan (and therefore parish and school) operations, decision making and direction—all of which include some chancery staff and others outside of the AFC who are experts in their fields in order to be effective in the work and mission.

I would encourage you to take some time to read the [Archdiocese of Seattle's 2019-20 Annual Report](#). It contains details about the many works and ministries of the Archdiocese and its parishes and schools—all of that good work for which Christ founded the Church. It also contains the report of the finances for our Program and Administrative Offices which helps make it possible. In the interest of transparency, for the second year now we have also published the full [audited financials](#). If you have questions, I would encourage you to reach out our CFO, [Joe Schick](#).

There is a common belief that the Catholic Church is rich. That is definitely true when it comes to property and art, which exist for and are at the service of all humanity free of charge. And our annual financial income is also considerable, though it is also true that the Catholic Church is second only to the government when it comes to charitable work here in the United States. And while there is no question that dioceses and orders have financial assets on hand, there are also large liabilities, and it is all rather complex, as I have discovered. But one of the things that shocked me when I joined was that in most ways, our financial picture at Holy Rosary was much stronger than that of the Archdiocese!

The primary reason for the long decline was insurance claims (mostly from sexual abuse settlements) and cumulative operational losses.

Things are looking up, thankfully, owing to a number of factors. The chancery has finished in the black for two years in a row now, making tough decisions to live within their means. Market gains on our investments have been helpful. There are some other things in the works, as well, but one of the big improvement factors is the [Called to Serve as Christ](#) capital campaign, which has a primary goal of fully funding the separate priest retirement pension trust. This removes the benefit obligation from the Archdiocese.

The campaign has done other good work, as well. 15% of donations have been returned to parishes. We used our portion so far to help us fix our stained glass windows in need of repair and assist with our Bell Tower retrofit. Direct contributions to the school that utilized company matches help with the new Big Toy for our school and wider community. 24% of donations have gone to support the retirement of women religious who have served in our Archdiocese, including our Carmelite Sisters, the nearby Sisters of Providence, and the Dominican Sisters who educated our parish youth for so many years. Thank you for your support- those who have [made donations](#), and those still fulfilling their pledges.

It is important that we share the Good News, including the good news of the works of our Catholic community as we journey together and grow in faith, educate individuals of all ages, and serve those in need.

A Plan for Lent: Ready or not, here it comes!

1. Sacrifice: What will I give up?

It may be easy to say, "I will give up sweets," or "I'll give up soda," for Lent, but make sure you put some thought into it. Will giving up sweets or soda help to draw you closer to God? If you reach for sweets or soda daily, will giving them up mean that you will think of Jesus and His sacrifice every time you reach for or think about something sweet or soda?

2. Growth: What will I add to my life to help me to grow spiritually?

Lent is a period of the Church year when we reflect on Jesus' passion and death for our sins and we prepare to celebrate His resurrection from the dead on Easter Sunday. It is good to add something to our lives that will help us to more fully connect in our hearts with Jesus' sacrifice for us and contemplate what that means to us. We can also reflect on how we can live our lives better in light of Jesus' sacrifice for us.

3. Prayer: How will I spend more time in prayer?

Adding more prayer to our lives during Lent can help us to draw closer to God and understand Him better. You may decide to spend more time in personal prayer or pray with others. Praying the Stations of the Cross is something you can do by yourself or with other church members.

VATICAN CITY - Abuses and violence against women are “acts of cowardice and a degradation of all humanity,” Pope Francis said.

“We must not look the other way. Let us pray for women who are victims of violence, that they may be protected by society and have their sufferings considered and heeded by all,” he said.

The pope’s remarks were part of a video message released by the Pope’s Worldwide Prayer Network as part of his prayer intention for the month of February.

Titled, “For women who are victims of violence,” the pope’s prayer intention decries the various kinds of violence millions of women suffer daily: “psychological violence, verbal violence, physical violence, sexual violence.”

“It’s shocking how many women are beaten, insulted and raped,” said the pope in the February message.

According to U.N. Women, the U.N. organization dedicated to gender equality and the empowerment of women, an estimated 137 women are killed by members of their own family each day. Globally, one in three women have experienced physical or sexual violence at some point in their lives, and 15 million adolescent girls worldwide aged 15 to 19 have experienced forced sexual relations, according to a report issued by the agency in November.

The COVID-19 pandemic has aggravated the situation as measures aimed at limiting the spread of the coronavirus have often led to greater social isolation and economic insecurity, making women more vulnerable to violence in private, it added.

In his video message, the pope said, “The testimonies of the victims who dare to break their silence are a cry for help that we cannot ignore.”

He urged people to not be indifferent and to pray for the protection of victims.

At the start of each month, the Pope’s Worldwide Prayer Network posts a short video of the pope offering his specific prayer intention on www.thepopevideo.org.

“The Pope Video” was launched in 2016 to encourage people to join an estimated 50 million Catholics who already had a more formal relationship with the prayer network — better known by its former title, the Apostleship of Prayer. The prayer network is more than 170 years old. (NWCatholic.org)


