

The Journey of Faith

With Fr. Matthew Oakland

Pope Francis has called for the next Synod of Bishops in 2023 to explore the theme of Community, Participation, Mission as we reflect upon Synodality (journeying together) in the life of the Church.

The word synod comes from the Greek for assembly or gathering, but also with a connation of a journey-and therefore journeying together. Synods are called by the pope so that the pastors of the church might assist him in his ministry as they reflect upon some aspect or need of the Church. Recent synods have reflected upon Marriage and the Family, the Church in the Amazon, the New Evangelization, the Church in the Middle East, the Church in Africa, the Word of God, Young People, and the Eucharist. There is always a stated purpose and point of reflection and an initial process to begin discernment. It culminates with a gathering of some bishops who are usually chosen in part by representation from around the world, but mostly pertaining to the particular topic. They are assisted by others with particular knowledge or insight into the particular topic at hand, including priests and deacons, religious and lay people.

This will be the 15th Synod since the Second Vatican Council brought them back to life as a part of the western Church. In the earliest days of the Church, there were a number of significant Councils in which all the bishops gathered to reflect upon some important question-is Jesus human and divine, is Mary the Mother of God, etc. We take for granted these questions in our own day and age, when at the time there was great division even within, fostered by secular forces who benefited from division within the But these Councils of Nicaea and Church. Ephesus Constantinople, and Chalcedon (between 325 and 451AD), and others that followed, were gatherings of all the bishops.

There were also other smaller gatherings. The Church at the time was divided up into dioceses as it is today, headed by bishops. But certain dioceses had a special history connected with the Apostles, themselves. Rome of course, taking preeminence, but also Alexandria, Antioch, Constantinople and Jerusalem. These were headed by patriarchs, a



sign of their special significant, who were still in union with Rome but had local authority over others in the area as well. Sometimes, they would call local assemblies of bishops and pastors to reflect upon a question. Of course, they always did so in union with the See of Peter in Rome and the wider Church. These were not universal Councils, but Synods.

As division slowly emerged, synods were a part of the eastern and western Churches. The Council of Trent in response to the Protestant revolution called for annual diocesan synods, and every three years at regional levels. It was an opportunity for local Churches to live intentionally in Christ, and discerning the call of the Holy Spirit in the world and in the Church. But unfortunately the practice fell away, until it was revived by the Second Vatican Council.

Local synods are of course permitted by a diocese or a region, but the primary form that we have seen since the first in 1976 is a worldwide Synod of Bishops. Not a universal Council of all bishops as at Vatican II, but some and on a particular topic.

The results are usually recommendations from the Synod, which the pope can accept and confirm or not. He usually follows with his own major document.

What is unique about the current synod is that Pope Francis has asked the entire Church to participate, starting at the local level with recommendations from parishes to dioceses, then to national conferences and regions to the full Synod of Bishops. On March 20 and 29 we will have our own Synod Gatherings here at Holy Rosary. More information in the coming weeks.

UPDATE FROM FR. DUNSTAN

A Very Happy Beginning....

Warm greetings from Amukura Parish in Kenya. I feel so happy to let you know that work on Amukura Parish Spiritual/Pastoral Formation Centre has already begun.

I am equally pleased to also let you know that, from the time I left Seattle in November last year, I have so far received a total of \$49,158 in kind donations from you.

This is an amazing record which gives me great hope that the big dream of our Christians at St Rose of Lima Amukura Parish for a spiritual/pastoral formation facility will get realised sooner than their wildest expectations. I have distributed the donations into the following need areas:

1. POOR CHILDREN'S EDUCATION:

Total Kids Under Support- 24 (including 11 in Grade school, 8 High School, and 5 in College/University.

Whole year Budget- \$22,500 Current allocation- \$15,700

2. AMUKURA PARISH SPIRITUAL/PASTORAL FORMATION CENTRE

The construction work will be in four phases: foundation slab, walling, roofing, and finishing. Project estimated total cost- \$420,000 Conference capacity- 400 persons Guest room capacity- 38 participants.

Work on the foundation slab phase, cost at \$47,300, is going on as follows:

- From Holy Rosary donations, after deducting \$15,700 for children's schooling, I have allocated to the ongoing work the remainder \$33,458.
- Our local Christians have so far raised \$2,320, bringing the available funds to \$35,778.

As a parish, and with great involvement of all our grassroots leaders, we are working very hard (even with our tough economic circumstances) to ensure that we achieve a certain level of financial sustainability for this very important project for our Parish.

The project will not only facilitate greater spiritual nourishment for our people, but will also, through the seminars and trainings that will take place there, promote their human and economic advancement.

Also, when the facility is hired to serve the needs of the wider community, it will provide much needed financial relief to our Christians in their support for the Parish ministry.

I am very happy to note that our being able to have already begun work on this project is, for the greater part, on account of your extremely kind donations.

My special thanks to Fr Oakland for his very kind facilitation of the same.

I very sincerely want to say that we deeply appreciate what you have done for us and very humbly appeal for your continued support for this very important project for our people. God bless you all-

Save the Date! March 20 & 29 Join in the worldwide Synod of Bishops!

Pope Francis has invited all members of the Catholic community and beyond to reflect on the ongoing action of the Holy Spirit in the life of the Church today. He has invited all local churches to engage in this journey which will culminate in a worldwide Synod of Bishops in 2023. He describes the process as being: "One listening to the others; and all listening to the Holy Spirit."



Archbishop Etienne has invited each parish to come together, to share, to listen to one another but even more importantly to God, as we ask that all important question of what is God doing in the Church today? The theme for the Synod is communion, participation and mission. It is those three things that we will reflect on together. Holy Rosary Parish will be hosting Synod Gatherings on Sunday, March 20th at noon and Tuesday, March 29th, at 6PM. Each session will last around two hours. Please join us! We will begin in the Church with prayer before spending some time reflecting together in small groups.




