

The Journey of Faith with **Fr. Matthew Oakland**

As Jesus ascended to Heaven and the Father, two men in white were suddenly standing by the apostles with a clear message: "Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky?" (Acts 1:10) Jesus has left the building, and its time to get to work.

Jesus says lots of things in the Gospels. And then there are things He said that were not recorded. But it is his very last words that tell us what we are to be about:

"All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age."

Matthew 28:18-20

Go. Make Disciples. Baptize. Teach. Observe. And live in the presence of God. It is the summation of all that Jesus has said—the conclusion, of sorts. But it's as much about the future and what is to come as it is about what has transpired. This is the mission statement for the Church, given to us by God—for all of those who follow Jesus Christ individually, and together as a body. It is what we must be about.

Some people think that to be a missionary means to go to far away lands. And that is what St. Francis Xavier, the copatron of missionaries, did. However, St. Therese, the other copatron, never left her convent. To go is to constantly be aware that the Lord is sending us. And maybe He is sending us to far away places. But maybe He is sending us to our family, our friends, our neighbors. Where are you going?

I was at a meeting recently, and at one point, the leader asked the whole group, "Does anybody know where we are going next?" It became, for some of us, the unofficial quote of the day because that is the whole point! Answering that question determines everything.

It's not just a question of where and making sure that the where is determined by the Lord. It's also a question of what are we doing as we go?

We do countless things each and every day, from the mundane and routine, to the important and extraordinary. Jesus tells us that we should be making disciples



throughout—inviting others into a deeper relationship with Christ and facilitating that encounter. How does that one thing pop up in all the others that you do?

Being incorporated into the life of God isn't a one and done thing. Baptism is obviously incredibly important, but it something that must be lived each day as we continue to be open to being taught by God, and we make space to learn from Him and strive to observe the way of salvation He leads us on.

The biggest thing to get right, that motivates us for all the rest, is the why. Jesus reminds us that He is with us. It's up to us whether we want to be with Him.

Looking at your daily life, what would you say is your mission statement? How does it compare with the one given to us by Jesus?

I was once in a room with two different framed Mission Statements for the same organization. It's important to know who we are, and where we are going—especially if Jesus is to be the Way.

OBITUARY Mary Berenice Wilson, SP (Sister Petronilla)

Sister Mary Berenice Wilson (Sister Petronilla), age 85, a Sister of Providence for 62 years, died May 2, 2023 at Swedish Hospital, Cherry Hill, Seattle, Wash. All invited to Funeral Mass: Tuesday, May 23, 2023, at Holy Rosary Parish at 10:30 am.

Sister Mary was born on October 27, 1937 in Bassano, Alberta, Canada to the family of Clayton and Helen (Diyoume) Wilson, the youngest of ten children. When Sister Mary was four years old her family moved to Seattle where she attended grade school at St. Anne's Parish and high school at Holy Names Academy. At an early age Sister Mary was taught to be community minded, by delivering homemade bread and cinnamon rolls to elderly neighbors, mowing their lawns, weeding, playing cards, and having "tea" and a chat.

The seed of Providence was planted in Sister Mary at a young age. When her family resided in Alberta, they welcomed the Sisters of Providence to stay in their home during their travels. At the age of 4 ½, Sister Mary again had contact with the Sisters of Providence while selling Thanksgiving turkey chances to support Saint Peter Claver Center, Seattle, Wash. She continued contact with the center through her years in grade school and high school. When Sister Mary was 16 she was hired as a diet aide at Providence Hospital, Seattle, Wash., where she worked until she entered the Sisters of Providence community. Fulfilling the desire of her heart to live the charism

of the Sisters of Providence to minister with people in need, Sister Mary professed first vows in 1962 and final vows in 1967.

Sister Mary's educational achievements included: a BA in English, Seattle University (1971); a MA in Education / Administration, Seattle University (1984); and a MA in Counseling, City University of Seattle (1991).

Sister Mary's many ministries began at Saint Peter Claver Center, visiting people in homes and in nursing homes. She then taught at St. Finbar School, Burbank, Calif. (1963-64, 1968-69); Holy

Family School, Seattle, Wash. (1964-65); Holy Rosary School, Seattle, Wash. (1965-68); John F. Kennedy High School, Seattle, Wash. (1970-73); and St. Louise School, Bellevue, Wash. (1973-78), she was also Vice-Principal. She was Director of Religious Education at St. Joseph Grade School and parish, Yakima, Wash. (1976-77). In 1977, she became activity director at the Adult Day Health Center at Providence Mount St. Vincent, Seattle, Wash. She was principal at Assumption School, Seattle, Wash. (1984-88). In 1990, Sister Mary became the director of Sojourner Place, a shelter for women in transition, where she ministered for 11 years. This ministry had great significance to Sister Mary, she felt honored to be part of the women's journey in gaining their independence.

Sister Mary lived her life feeling extremely blessed by God and filled with gratitude. She shared this gratitude with others with a smile and laughter. She had unwavering love for the Sisters of Providence community, family, friends and all she met.
