


# St. Anne Parish

Looking back to some bulletins from February 2020, trying to remember how we promoted the Fish Fries that last time we offered them, I found a column describing something that happened at Mass of which I have absolutely no recollection. Since I suspect you don't remember it either and since I did stumble into a kind of clever connection to that day's gospel, which we heard just two weeks ago, I thought it was worth reading again. -Fr. **A COUPLE WEEKS AGO** we heard the account in Matthew's gospel of Jesus walking along the Sea of Galilee and inviting two brothers and then two other



brothers to follow him. He called and they answered.

During my homily I identified three circumstances that warranted, even demanded, remarkable consideration and response, that of Harriet Tubman and her determination to bring others to freedom from slavery, that of the people in Corinth to move beyond their cliques and misconstrued loyalties, and that of Andrew, Peter, John and James to follow Jesus, to be fishers of people.

It was in that third piece of the homily, the part about the disciples, that someone's cellphone rang and the person

## CONGRATULATIONS, ST. ANNE PARISH!

The parish has exceeded its target for the INSPIRED BY THE SPIRIT capital campaign.

Thanks to those generous parishioners who have contributed and pledged \$927,429, which is 102 percent of our goal of \$905,000.

The campaign, which began in April, is a joint venture with the diocese, but with 65 percent of all contributions retained by the parish. The vast majority of parish funds will go toward remaining costs of the church renovation, as well as paying off a previous debt and adding funds to the St. Anne Endowment.

While meeting our target is great news, a discouraging note is that only 234 parishioners pledged or contributed; that's 23 percent of all parishioners. A previous campaign, BUILDING OUR FUTURE that ended in 2020, raised \$1.2 million from 366 parishioners. Regardless, two successful campaigns in such close proximity of time is admirable.

Pledges that have been made will be paid over the next four years. Reminders will be sent by the diocesan finance office and updates will be shared in the Stewardship column of the bulletin.

answered the call as he headed toward the bathrooms. I continued preaching, noticing but not acknowledging what had just happened. But in the next breath, I said something akin to: “Jesus called and they answered.” That prompted someone in the assembly to laugh, out loud. A totally understandable response. The incongruity of the two circumstances, these remarkably distinct calls and answers, was indeed laughable.

While I’m not keen on cellphones disrupting Mass, my homily being the least of the problematic moments, what I appreciated about the situation was the keen awareness and quick wit of the worshiper who started to laugh. Immediately she saw a connection between what I was saying and what was transpiring among us. Immediately, she saw a link between the gospel and the circumstance in which she was living – in that moment, in that space, among those people.

It was a frivolous, potentially meaningless confluence of words and actions, and yet it’s indicative of what we encounter as disciples. Realities of life that prompt and compel awareness and attention, and then a response. In life, our responses are, by necessity, going to be far more demanding than a mere chuckle at a bizarre coincidence, but they will often need to be immediate, maybe almost without mentally sorting through our options and potential consequences. As with those disciples called by Jesus, our response as disciples, what we say and do in our response will not allow for delay. **TL**
