### "When the Going Gets ..."

Perhaps we heard the following refrain as we engaged in sports or other activities: "When the going gets tough, the tough get going." There is a certain amount of truth in the statement. Persistence and "stick-to-itiveness" help us face and overcome difficult situations that we may face. However, it is an incomplete mantra for a person of faith. As I reflected on the reading from the Prophet Jeremiah on Wednesday (Jeremiah 15:10, 16-21) and the responsorial psalm (Psalm 59) with the refrain, "God is my refuge on the day of distress," I felt



the need to modify the expression. A more faith-filled outlook is "When the going gets tough, the person of faith turns to God for strength and direction."

The events in a suburb of Rouen in the Normandy region of France may have guided my reflection on these scriptures. As you may have seen, heard or read (but not on the front page), Father Jacques Hamel was slain while saying Mass by Islamic extremists. Deacon John mentioned it on Tuesday afternoon, but it wasn't until I watched the evening news and received an email from a former parishioner that it began to affect me. When I laid my head on the pillow that evening, I wondered if I would have the courage and strength to suffer in such a "horrific" (word used by the nun who was a witness) way. Granted, the chances that any of us will be asked to give our lives in such a manner are remote. Christian martyrdom is rare, but still quite prevalent in certain parts of our world today. As you probably know, the word "martyr" comes from the Greek word meaning "witness." A martyr gives the most complete and convincing type of witness possible, one's life. Each of us, however, is called to witness to our faith in a myriad of ways day-by-day. How effective is our testimony?

Most often we testify in rather ordinary and seemingly meaningless ways: individual prayer, community worship, the words we use, the way we treat others, and the values and priorities we embrace. The Jubilee of Mercy invites us to consciously engage in the corporal and spiritual works of mercy (Matthew 25). There are times when life gets difficult or tough, and that is when our faith is truly put to the test. In times of loss, conflict and misunderstanding, we can turn to the scriptures, especially the Psalm response, "God is my refuge on the day of distress" or the modified mantra, "When the going gets tough, the person of faith turns to God for strength and direction." And, may Father Jacques intercede for us, too!
