

St. Joseph the Worker \ Winding Down or Wrapping Up?

The beginning of June means different things to different people. For many, especially students and educators, it can mean that the academic year has ended and it's time for summer plans. Spring's late arrival (and summer's early and forceful entrance!) meant that May was even crazier for many people with various activities and efforts to get vards and gardens in shape. Perhaps more of us can take a deep breath, relax and wind down for a while this summer; I've noticed a change in schedule already and am grateful for it.

As we wind down, it might be worthwhile to glance at June from a spiritual perspective and see what is included in these thirty days. This weekend we have another special feast before we enter fully into ordinary (as in "counting," not blasé) time, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ or Corpus Christi. This year's timing might remind us of our need for the Eucharist throughout the year. including summertime. If traveling, there are easy ways to find Mass times, such as masstimes.org. Tuesday, June 5th, we remember the Apostle to Germany, <u>St.</u> Boniface (I always like to note that it is a memorial, whereas St. Patrick is an optional memorial). Friday is the patronal feast for the Diocese of Winona-Rochester, the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, and it is also the date of the priesthood ordination (our "own" Brian Mulligan and The Hoang). The following day is the Immaculate Heart of Mary, the patronal feast for our seminary in Winona. June 11th is St. Barnabas, an apostle, and June 13th, St. Anthony of Padua, patron saint of lost articles ("Tony, Tony, look around; something's lost that must be found"). The Nativity of St. John the Baptist falls on a Sunday (6/24) this year and will be more solemnly celebrated, especially with the elevation of the Co-Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist in Rochester. (Other than Jesus, who is the only other person's birthday we celebrate?) The month ends with a solemnity, Saints Peter & Paul, Apostles, on June 29th and that's also the reason for the date of the Peter's Pence collection, which supports the work of the Holy Father.

Fiscally, June 30th marks the end of our financial year and I encourage you to check and make sure that your church support is up-to-date. As you may have noticed in the bulletin, we are slightly behind at both parishes. At HF we are wrapping up the new entrance project and are only \$9,650 away from the goal; wouldn't it be great to sweep clean that slate? SJW is in the last stages of the capital campaign, Working for our Future, Treasuring our Past; we have raised over \$570,000 thus far, but would still like to meet our "faith" goal of \$820,000. I would be happy to visit with anyone who can help us make up the gap. Lastly, it would be great if both parishes could wrap up the Catholic Ministry Appeal (CMA) 2018 by the end of the month. Remember anything over our goal at HF helps pay for the new furnace and air conditioning improvements (\$11,790) and at SJW supports our youth conferences and retreats. Thanks for all your prayer, time and contribution to support our parish cluster's mission and ministry!

- You authorize monthly payments from your account. Your financial institution transfers the pre-determined amount from either your checking or savings account to SJW's account.
- We withdraw your contribution from your bank account on the 5th, the 20th or both the 5th and 20th of each month. If either of these days of the month falls on a weekend or a bank holiday, your contribution is processed on the next business day.

Thoughtful Moments

St. Germaine Cousin

Born to poor parents near Pibrac, France, St. Germaine suffered from a deformed right hand, sores on her neck and ill health from neglect and abuse. Despite



this, she was never bitter. She walked to Mass daily – even in the winter – and shared what she had with the poor. The most powerful proof of St. Germaine's holiness was her forgiveness of her abusive stepmother, Hortense. She is the patroness of abuse victims, people with disabilities, and shepherdesses.

Make anger work

Teach children that it isn't healthy to pretend we're not angry when we are. Instead of giving in to anger, though, find a solution to the problem. "In your anger do not sin" (Psalm 4:4).

Biblical advice for kids

"Children, obey your parents (in the Lord), for this is right. Honor your father and mother" (Ephesians 6:1-2). "Children, obey your parents in everything, for this is pleasing to the Lord" (Colossians 3:20).

Sing a psalm. Choose
a psalm that praises
God for his mercy,

such as Psalm 103.

virtue. Virtues are good habits. For example, temperance can be practiced by limiting the amount of time spent watching television or using electronics. Charity can be

Read a story. The Bible is a library of books that weave together the story of our family of faith.

Read about heroes, brave rulers, warriors, prophets and thrilling victories.
For example, the first book of Samuel (chapter 16) begins the account of David, a poet and musician, warrior and king with an extraordinary love for God. Or, read about the remarkable journey

Moses led out of slavery found in the book of Exodus."

Christ in both words and deeds (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1303).
Confirmation can only be received once. Confirmation recalls Pentecost, when the Spirit was poured out on Jesus' disciples in the Upper Room
