



The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph December 30, 2018

After three days they found him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions, and all who heard him were astounded at his understanding and his answers.

As we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family, this Gospel exposes us to a strange tension. While this family is one we can look to for an example, they are not quite the same family unit as everyone else. There is an otherness to Jesus, something profound. And yet, perhaps on second thought, are our families so different?

When Mary and Joseph encountered Jesus in the temple, **they were astonished**. But at what? Mary's response is surprised.

- They're not astonished that Jesus is preaching in a place for respected teachers.
- They're not astonished that their son has captured the attention of the wisest men of the time period.
- They're astonished at his seemingly disobedient behavior! Son, why have you done this to us?
 Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety.

All our children have an **otherness** about them, something that makes them unique and different. They are distinctly not me.

- What will our own children become?
- What temple will they wander off to?



Treasures From Our Tradition

Today's feast is new as feasts go, and it sets us this year in a very modern crisis. Amid conflicting schedules and commitments, a young man, testing the limits, has strayed from his parents and gone off to the big city. Mary and Joseph search frantically, only to find the child Jesus in the temple, conversing with the elders and scholars of the law, who are amazed at his wisdom.

In the time of Jesus, the temple was the religious center of Jewish ritual. Outside of Jerusalem, people gathered in the synagogues, centers of learning, for daily prayer and study. Still, everyone longed to journey to the temple to participate in the offerings, and to fulfill certain obligations of the law that could only be done there. On this feast, we catch a glimpse of the family of Jesus: parents dealing with the normal stresses of raising a child, and yet completely grounded in the ways of faith and tradition.

There has always been an appreciation in Christianity for the value of pilgrimage—the journey to holy places that is a symbol of our life's journey to God, and a sense of connection to important events in our family history. During the Christmas season, many of us undertake pilgrimages to the family homestead for festival meals, to the parishes where we were formed in the faith, or perhaps even to a beautiful manger scene or festival of lights. There are few better days than this in our calendar for spending time with the family, especially on a short pilgrimage to a favorite place.

Daily Bread, Celebration PublicationsMonday, December 31; 1 Jn 2:18-21; Jn 1:1-18

In the beginning was the Word ... On my way to a local drug store, I was listening to The Screwtape Letters by C.S. Lewis, read by Joss Ackland. (Excellent!) I was struck by the equality of humans in the eyes of the devil — that is, we are all equally despised — which leads to the idea that in the eyes of God, we are all equally loved. I walked into the store, wondering how hard it would be, just for one day, to love everyone I met. Note, I don't mean feel love. Lewis makes the point that this feeling is not what we mean by Christian love. It is what we say and do that measures our love. I tried it out on the person in front of me who had an enormous number of coupons and an apparent need to produce the exact change ... slowly. I did not feel loving. But mindful of Lewis' writing, I smiled and said something about what a good shopper she was. O my gosh, she positively glowed. So I know what my new year's resolution is. If in the beginning was the Word and by the Word everything was made, perhaps it's a worthy goal to be mindful of my words. Maybe my heart will follow. Loving God, give me the grace to live by the wisdom of St. Paul: Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up. PBS

Lk 2:16-21 - Mary, the holy Mother of God Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart. My New Year's resolution is to watch my words. As a writer I have received my fair share of criticism, usually quite civil – after all, I do write for a pretty churchy crowd. But let's face it, any kind of criticism cuts. Years ago I got into the habit of waiting a day before responding to a critic. During that waiting period I always come up with something agreeable to say to someone who disagrees with me. It's actually quite easy because it's rare that anyone is 100 percent wrong. What makes it even easier is when criticism is in writing: I can take a breath and see how I could have written my thoughts more clearly or with less self-righteousness. Would that it were so easy face-to-face. It is very tempting to return cut for cut. Especially at home. Especially with teenagers. So this year I'm going to try to keep comments quietly in my heart until I can respond with love. May the words of my mouth and the


