A Special Opportunity for Those 70½ Years Old and Older: You can give any amount (up to a maximum of \$108,000) per year from your IRA directly to a qualified charity such as St. Bernadette without having to pay income taxes on the money. Gifts of any value \$108,000 or less are eligible for this benefit and you can feel good knowing that you are making a difference at St. Bernadette. This popular gift option is commonly called the IRA charitable rollover, but you may also see it referred to as a qualified charitable distribution, or OCD for short.

Why Consider This Gift?

- Your gift will be put to use today, allowing you to see the difference your donation is making.
- Beginning in the year you turn 73, you can use your gift to satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution (RMD).
- You pay no income taxes on the gift. The transfer generates neither taxable income nor a tax deduction, so you benefit even if you do not itemize your deductions.
- Since the gift doesn't count as income, it can reduce your annual income level. This may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax.

We encourage you to consult with your retirement plan administrator or your tax or financial advisor to determine whether this option would be advantageous to your financial and tax circumstances.





1st Reading Question:


Abraham questions God about how He passes judgment on people. What questions do you have for the Lord?

Daily Meditation: Luke 11:1-13

I tell you, ask . . . (Luke 11:9)

Have you ever heard the phrase "You never know unless you ask"? It's true in so many situations. For example, you might never know if your boss will give you a raise unless you ask. Or you might never know what your ailing friend needs unless you ask how you can help him.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells a parable about a man who hoped that his neighbor would give him some bread to feed his guest. It was late at night, so he wasn't sure. But he would never know unless he asked! So he knocked on his neighbor's door—and persisted until his neighbor finally got out of bed and gave him what he needed (Luke 11:5-8).

Jesus told this parable to encourage us to ask our heavenly Father for whatever we need. Have you ever hesitated in asking God for something? Perhaps you thought you didn't deserve what you were asking for. Or maybe you suspected that God wouldn't answer you—so you didn't bother trying. Maybe you even feared that he would think you were being too demanding!

But that's not how Jesus wants us to relate to our Father. He knows that God provides everything that we need, so he wants us to approach him with confidence and make our requests. That's why he taught his disciples to ask for their "daily bread" when they prayed (Luke 11:3). Jesus also knows that by coming to God with our needs, we not only acknowledge our dependence on him

acknowledge our dependence on him, but we also come to know him and trust him more deeply.

Is there something you've been hesitant to ask God for? Or is there something you've asked for in the past and haven't received? Then be like this persistent man who wasn't shy about knocking at his neighbor's door at midnight. Keep knocking at God's door, and trust that he will give you the bread that you need (Luke 11:9)!

"Father, you are the giver of all good gifts. Help me to be bold and ask for what I need."
