BAPTISM


To begin the process of having your child baptized, please call the office or visit our website.



Hear, Reflect, Respond: Let Scripture Transform Your Life Today

They have Moses and the prophets. (Luke 16:29)

Jesus draws a stark contrast in today's Gospel between a man who enjoyed his riches but had no concern for others and a poor man, Lazarus, whose life was filled with poverty, suffering, and humiliation. When the rich man died, he was condemned to the "torment" of "flames" in the underworld (Luke 16:24). Lazarus, however, rested peacefully in "the bosom of Abraham" after he passed away (16:22). When the rich man begged Abraham to send Lazarus to warn his brothers about what awaited them, Abraham dismissed his request. "They have Moses and the prophets," he said. "Let them listen to them" (16:29).





This is a troubling story, but it's also filled with promise.

Jesus is telling us that the word of God can change even the hardest of hearts. Through the commandments God gave to Moses, he told us to be kind and generous toward those in need. And through the words of the prophets, he revealed his own heart for those who are vulnerable and neglected. Now he tells us that if we sit with these words and let them sink into our hearts, his Spirit will draw us out of our own selfishness. He will help us reach out of ourselves and share his love and generosity with anyone who is hurting.

What is Jesus saying to you today? Is there a word or phrase from one of today's Mass readings that is standing out to you? Take that word and ponder it, even if you're not sure what has drawn you to it. Be patient. Be open. Let almighty God speak to you.

We assist parishioners and those within our community in times of crisis, promote an awareness of the needs of the underprivileged, and provide the opportunity for parish members to become directly involved with charitable works. Christian Action relies solely on the ongoing financial donations and donations of clothing and food from our parishioners and community to be successful.

Christian Action is here to serve registered parishioners and our neighbors in living in the following zip codes: 77062, 77058, 77059, 77598.

We are also one of the main clothing pantries for the Clear Creek Independent School District. Whenever a student or a family member needs clothing, the counselors at the At-Risk Services department of CCISD contact us.

We assist with electricity bills. We pay the whole amount, so the families can have a clean start the next month.

Christian Action is also the lead for other programs and drives at St. B, such as... Parish Lenten Soup Suppers, Back to School Drives for CCISD, Provide Counselor Care Bins at Clear Lake Intermediate School, Thanksgiving Efforts, Christmas Programs, Advent Programs, Serve our twinning parish, Immaculate Heart of Mary (Back to School Drive, Thanksgiving, Christmas, and pay a portion of IHM Cathedraticum tax)

Christian Action is successful because we collaborate with churches, non-profit organizations and other agencies so we don't recreate the wheel and we are able to serve our community to the best of our ability.



Question: Can a divorced Catholic receive holy Communion?

Answer: Unfortunately, too many people today — Catholics and non-Catholics alike — mistakenly believe that divorce separates one from the Communion of the Church and that divorced persons may not receive Communion. However, as the Church has communicated in a number of places, the issue at hand is not the reality of divorce, but is more often the reality of re-marriage outside of the Church (such as in the case of a Catholic who was previously married within the Church, divorced, and remarried without receiving an annulment).

Divorced persons are called to live chastely as single people and to observe the same call to avoid sin as anyone else who desires to receive the Eucharist. Beyond this, however, Pope Francis has reminded us that the healing power of the Eucharist can be especially significant for those who have "endured separation, divorce, or abandonment ... divorced people who have not remarried, and often bear witness to marital fidelity, ought to be encouraged to find in the Eucharist the nourishment they need to sustain them in their present state of life." (Amoris Laetitia, no. 242) Moreover, he continues, "The local community and pastors should accompany these people with solicitude, particularly when children are involved or when they are in serious financial difficulty." (AL, no 242)

As Pope Francis has also reminded us, the Eucharist is "not a prize for the perfect," but "a powerful medicine and nourishment" (*Evangelii Gaudium*, no. 47). Because we all stand in need of healing and wholeness, the Church invites all who seek to live their faith in integrity and devotion to come and receive the grace offered in the Eucharist.
