WHEN THE WORLD WAVES ITS BANNERS—WHAT DO YOU CHASE?

When I was 11, I was riding my bike on a Friday night in Scottsdale, Arizona. I saw giant spotlights swirling in the sky. Something amazing had to be happening. I pedaled after them with excitement. Sweaty and tired, I arrived, only to find a used car lot. Bright lights, flapping banners, inflatable balloon men swaying wildly in the wind. I stood there, heart sinking. All that spectacle, and all my effort ... for this?

As life proceeds, we learn what it is like to pursue promising but fruitless searches. This week we hear Jesus ask the crowds regarding John the Baptist: **“What did you go out to the desert to see? A reed swayed by the wind?” (Matthew 11:7).** He’s not just describing the crowd’s mis-aimed pursuit. He’s naming our tendency to chase after what’s flashy but flimsy. What are our swaying reeds? For me, it is endless video

reels on my phone, worldly pleasures, entertainment in sports, and the good opinion of others. Inflated distractions that bend whichever way the wind blows. But they can’t satisfy my soul. What are your flimsy reeds? John the Baptist wasn’t a swaying reed. He was rooted, grounded, unafraid to speak the solid truth. The people went to see him because, deep down, they were starving for something real.

This Advent, the Church asks us to reassess: What are we really looking for? Are we chasing the dazzling but hollow? Or are we seeking what is solid and lasting — that which points to Christ? — *Father John Muir*

The Doors We Lock

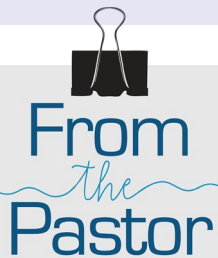
As a child, and even for a while as a teenager, I experienced an enormous amount of anxiety whenever I went to confession. For so many years I feared it. For so many years I waited in the confession line trembling, feeling sick to my stomach.

In the upper room after Christ's Passion and death, the anxiety of the disciples was so strong that they locked themselves away. But still Christ found a way into their midst. He would not be prevented from bringing mercy and hope to a place shrouded in despair. No door barred in a moment of fear could keep him out.

This is the genius of the sacrament of Reconciliation — and of all sacraments, really. Here we are, restricted in so many ways by an existence that is woefully physical. We feel fear, and our body reacts, just as we feel anger and our body reacts.

How can God deliver mercy to us in this flesh-bound state? Through that very flesh which can feel so confining. Through confession, which requires a physical action, and the physical participation not just of the penitent but of the priest.

Sometimes they are called Romani and other times Gypsies. Just like the swallows at Capistrano, they have appeared on time again for Christmas. It is an annual event for us to see them as we leave Eucharist these days.

They do not live near us. They come from across town in a van. They are delivered to Churches in the area on Sunday and are picked up and taken home later. Their job is to tug on your very generous and loving and tender hearts. They want cash and nothing else and use children and babies to make the grab. They do not want to come on Monday and receive the benefits of Christian Action. They only want cash. Be aware. They



do not like no for an answer, not from me or others and we often have to rely on the Police to resolve matters. Usually at the sight of an officer they quickly disappear.

Be mindful, also, that from the very first days of the parish, **5% of every Sunday Collection goes to support Christian Action.** We have, in Christian Action, everything they need, except cash. We never give cash.

All of this means that you have already helped them. **You have already provided for them** and there is no need to fall into their trap. Be aware. **Smile and keep walking.** Just like the swallows, they have come to roost for the Christmas season. We have everything they need in Christian Action.

Another Reminder: We will never solicit money or gift cards for staff or clergy by text, email, or social media.

A JUBILEE OF HOPE: REFLECTIONS THAT CARRY US FORWARD



As we wind down the Jubilee Year of Hope, our parish held a special Advent Mission with Bishop Brendan Cahill to help us reflect and find renewed inspiration for the journey of hope ahead.

Day 1—Mercy That Gives Us Hope

Our first session, Bishop Cahill invited us into the beauty and depth of Psalm 51, King David's heartfelt plea for mercy after being confronted by the prophet Nathan. Through this Psalm—and with the guidance of St. Augustine's reflections—we were reminded that God's mercy is the foundation of our hope: He sees us, forgives us, and stays with us even when we fail.

We also reflected on the call, echoed by St. John Paul II and Pope Francis, to extend that same mercy toward others—especially the poor—by recognizing the dignity of every person and stepping beyond ourselves to be present with those who suffer. Participants closed with small-group conversations and a quote from Pope Francis to guide further reflection.

Day 2—A Message of Hope

Our reflection on *Exodus* 6:2–8, reminds us that God sees us, hears us, and never forgets His promises. Even in times of struggle, God stays close—just as He did for His people in Exodus. Drawing on the witness of leaders like Archbishop Desmond Tutu, we are reminded that God always stands with

those who suffer and brings freedom in His time. During this Advent season, the Eucharist becomes our sign of hope: Christ walks with us, strengthens us, and sends us out to bring His love to others. We concluded the Mission with reflection, prayer, and an inspirational music video on Hope, featuring singers from around the world. 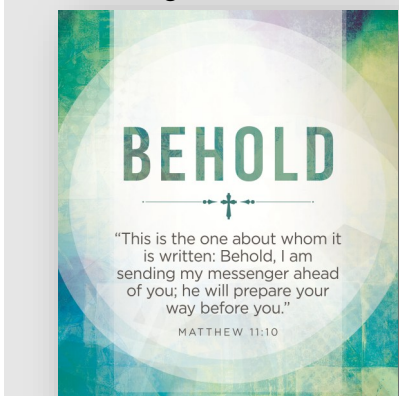

The floral arrangement at the shrine last week was in honor of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

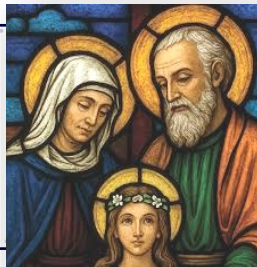
