

Update from the Ministry Center

The Ministry Center often gets asked the question:

"Why do you need to raise money for the food you give out at the parish's three food pantries when you get it all for "free" from the Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank (GPCFB)?"

The short answer is: not everything that we give out comes to us for free. While many of the items we get are free of charge, there are some items that we must pay for, and they are, thankfully, at a much reduced price than what it would cost us in a retail setting.

As an example, the St James site picked up 2987 lbs. of food from the GPCFB during one of its weekly runs in April, at a cost of \$521.60. When you consider that this was just one week out of 52 for the year, and it was for just one of our sites, it is easy do a quick calculation and see that our fundraising efforts through the annual Highmark Walk For a Health Community is vital to covering our costs. This is the weekend of the Walk — held on May 7. The money raised by our Walk Team goes onto an account at the GPCFB to be spent down to cover our expenses throughout the year.

In 2021, we distributed over 151 tons of perishable and nonperishable food, paper products, and personal hygiene items at our three distribution sites: St. James, Holy Rosary Rectory, and Eva Mitchell Tower.

Financial Update:

The need continued unabated in the month of April. The Ministry Center gave just over \$15,000 in financial aid – almost 4 times the amount given in December 2021.

Pastor's Note

Jesus is the Good Shepherd!

For the past Twenty-one years, God has blessed me with great parish assignments in my Priesthood ministry. From 2008 to 2012 I was Pastor of Good Shepherd Parish in Braddock which was one of the first merged parishes in the Diocese of Pittsburgh established in 1985. My four years at Good Shepherd (which is now part of St. Joseph the Worker Parish serving Braddock, North Braddock, East Pittsburgh, Forest Hills, Swissvale, Turtle Creek, and Wilmerding) was a wonderful experience seeing how seven former ethnic parishes could come together to be one family. Every day I try to do my best to be a good priest and shepherd to the people that I am entrusted with.

This weekend we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Easter, also called "Good Shepherd Sunday" and we also celebrate Mother's Day! In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we read how Paul and Barnabas continue their first missionary journey going to Perga and Antioch to preach in the synagogue. Paul and Barnabas preach to the Jewish people and the Gentiles. They respect that the Jewish people are God's chosen people who must first hear the Gospel, but they also assert that the Gentiles likewise be invited to eternal life. The

Gentiles in the congregation are thrilled to hear this.

Traditionally the Fourth Sunday of Easter is called "Good Shepherd Sunday" because the gospel is always from John Chapter 10 which focuses on Jesus as the Good Shepherd using the metaphor of sheep and shepherd to express how he and the Father are one.

Shepherds protect and care for the sheep they watch over. In the same way, Jesus cares for us too. Sometimes we wander off on the wrong path or put God out of our life and take some wrong turns in life. Jesus says he will lay down his life for his sheep. He will give everything that he has to guarantee their safety and salvation.

Mother's Day is always a special day to honor all the women in our lives who hold a motherly role: Mothers, Grandmothers, Godmothers, Mothers-in-Law, and Aunts. It is a special day to say thank you for all they have done for us. I thank God every day for my mom, Marge, who after all these years still does so much for her three children, seven grandchildren, and one granddaughter. Thanks Mom, for giving me life, teaching me the faith, and encouraging and supporting me throughout my fifty-one years of my life. Life...what a beautiful choice!

Virtually every good and worthwhile occurrence in life comes with sacrifice and commit-

ment. The events between Good Friday and Easter Sunday consistently remind us of this. In light of this reality, the Theme of the Good Shepherd shows the extent of care and concern that must accompany our daily actions. A Shepherd's care involves not only what we do but just as important how and why we carry out these responsibilities.

A faithful Shepherd must always be willing to accept the role of the flock as well. A spiritual leader must be willing to both a leader and a follower. The most difficult tasks in life can be accomplished if done with love, care, and compassion. And the real Shepherd leader must come to terms with his or her own personal weaknesses. Jesus taught by the way he lived, and he invites us to do the same. He assures us of a life safe and secure but not shielded from the sufferings of daily living.

The Synodal process continues to show us how we carry out these ministry roles in our daily living. This will also guide as we plan for the future.

As we come near the end of the school year we are grateful and thankful for the ministry of Catholic education. I have been blessed to share in the ministry of St. Bede, St. Benedict the Moor, and Sister Thea Bowman Catholic Academy schools. There have been many challenges but our schools continue to be a blessing for all of us.

Our CCD and faith formation programs continue to enrich all of our parish programs. This is how we evangelize and spread the faith. We owe much gratitude to all of our faithful teachers and staff.

Religious education is an essential part of priestly ministry to our parishes. Religious education

does not come at the expense of other ministries but to neglect religious education is to neglect the people of the parish. And the parish is the people.

The biggest challenge facing the Catholic Church in the 21st century in the mid-Atlantic region is the retention of current parishioners and evangelization of former Catholics and people who have never been members of the Catholic Church. Retention and evangelization require a solid commitment to religious education both within the parish and sometimes outside.

In terms of K-12 education, the calculus is straightforward: if you reach the children, you will draw their parents in, and if you catechize parents, they will instruct their children in the faith at home. Faith-formation of adults will strengthen the effectiveness of Catholic schools and faith formation for children who do not attend Catholic schools. At both ends of family life, religious education is essential, and it does not come at the expense of ministry to the rest of the parish.

Similarly, adult education that prepares people for marriage or entering the Catholic Church, or understanding the sacraments, the liturgy, and the Bible is all part of ministry to the parish. A parish will not exist for long if it is not committed to the faith formation of children and adults. Therefore, education is an essential part of parish ministry.

Finally, St. Mary Magdalene has a unique role within the diocese of Pittsburgh, and so do her priests. St. Mary Magdalene has the second largest membership of Black Catholics in the diocese, the most prominent being at St. Benedict the Moor parish in the Hill District. Currently, Catholic schools throughout the diocese, including our universities, wrestle with how to enter into difficult conversations about race. This effort is essential because our children are in these schools, and they will be affected by adults who graduated from them. A necessary part of ministry to the two parishes in the diocese with the most prominent African American populations is to help our educational institutions respond to our students in creative and constructive ways. Again, ministry to the parish means ministry to people at all stages of life. It means catechesis in intellectual and spiritual formation.

The parish is the people. Ministry to people means taking all of their needs into account, including their bodies, minds, and souls. Therefore, our ministry must be to people as individuals, families, and communities. It must value faith-formation and education.


