

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (A) Wis 12:13, 16–19 Rom 8:26–27 Mt 13:24–43 or 13:24–30

"The Kingdom of Heaven Is Like..."

The Gospel reading consists of parables, one of which Jesus explains. The two that seem easy to understand compare the kingdom with a mustard seed that begins small and then grows large enough to welcome all manner of birds for nesting, and of a bit of yeast that completely transforms the entire batch of dough. The parable about the weeds in the field of wheat needed explanation. Any farmer would have recognized the situation described. We don't always know where they come from, but weeds seem to crop up everywhere. What should one do? Lest wheat be inadvertently pulled up, let both wheat and weeds grow till the harvest. That is the time of separation.

So, what's the meaning of these parables? Like the mustard seed, the kingdom—the new way of living that Jesus came to inaugurate—consists of small acts of unselfishness and genuine love. But it grows and grows until it is opened to all manner of people. Like the


yeast, as insignificant as it might appear, this kingdom can transform all of society.

The parable of the wheat and the weeds is about the last judgment. But it also insists that the field (society), even the Church, is made up of both good and bad. It is very dangerous to try to get rid of what might be considered bad seeds, bad citizens, or bad members. One might pull up the wrong ones. There will be a time of judgment, and it will be in God's time, and in God's hands.

Los dos que parecen fáciles de entender comparan el reino con una semilla de mostaza que comienza pequeña y luego crece lo suficiente como para recibir todo tipo de aves para anidar, y de un poco de levadura que transforma por completo todo el lote de masa. La parábola sobre las malas hierbas en el campo del trigo necesitaba explicación. Cualquier agricultor habría reconocido la situación descrita. No siempre sabemos de dónde vienen, pero las malas hierbas parecen surgir en todas partes. ¿Qué se debe hacer? Para que el trigo no sea arrancado inadvertidamente, deje que tanto el trigo como las malezas crezcan hasta la cosecha. Ese es el momento de la separación. Entonces, ¿cuál es el significado de estas parábolas? Al igual que la semilla de mostaza, el reino, la nueva forma de vida que Jesús inauguró, consiste en pequeños actos de generosidad y amor genuino. Pero crece y crece hasta que se abre a todo tipo de personas. Al igual que la levadura, por insignificante que parezca, este reino puede transformar a toda la sociedad. La parábola del trigo y las malas hierbas es sobre el juicio final. Pero también insiste en que el campo (sociedad), incluso la Iglesia, se compone de buenos y malos. Es muy peligroso tratar de deshacerse de lo que podrían considerarse malas semillas, malos ciudadanos o malos miembros. Uno podría sacar los equivocados. Habrá un tiempo de juicio, y estará en el tiempo de Dios y en las manos de Dios.



SAINT PROFILE OF THE MONTH: SAINT JAMES, APOSTLE



Feast Day: July 25th

Beatified: Pre-Congregation **Canonized:** Pre-Congregation

Nothing is known of St. James the Greater's early life, though it has been established that he is the son of Zebedee and Salome and brother of John the disciple. The title "the Greater" was added to St. James' name to help distinguish him from the Apostle James "the Less," who is believed to have been shorter than James "the Greater."

Saint James the Greater was one of Jesus' first disciples. James was fishing with his father and John the Apostle when Jesus came to the shores of the Sea of Galilee and called for the fisherman, who were unable to catch any fish that day, to dip their nets in the water once again. When the fishermen followed Jesus' instructions, they found their nets full, and after emptying the fish on board, the boats nearly sank from their weight. Later, James was one of only three called by Jesus to witness his Transfiguration, and when he and his brother wanted to call fire upon a Samaritan town, both were rebuked by Jesus.

Following Christ's Ascension, James spread the Gospel across Israel and the Roman kingdom as well. He traveled and spread the Word for nearly forty years in Spain. It is said that one day, as he prayed, The Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to him and asked him to build her a church, which he did. Later, James returned to Jerusalem but was martyred for his faith by King Herod, who decapitated him. Saint James the Greater is known as the first apostle to die. As he was not allowed to be buried following his martyrdom, his remains were taken to Compostela, Spain, by some of his followers, who buried him. In the ninth century his remains were discovered and moved to a tomb in Santiago de Compostela. Today, his remains can still be found in the Cathedral of Santiago. Because Santiago de Compostela is the most frequently visited place pilgrims migrate to following Rome and Jerusalem, Pope Leo declared it a shrine.

PARISH REOPENING SCHEDULE

- Daily Mass resumes on Wed. June 24th at 8:30 a.m. in the chapel. Maximum capacity: 12
- Weekend of June 27th: Masses available: Sat: 5 p.m.; Sun: 9 a.m., 11 a.m., and 1 p.m. (Spanish Mass). Maximum capacity of Church until further notice: 100
- Starting in July, all regularly-scheduled Masses (including 7:30 a.m. and 7 p.m.) will resume

HOW TO ATTEND MASS WHEN REOPENED

All Saints Guidelines to Follow

- Continue to practice social distancing of at least 6 feet apart from each other at all times
- The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday and Holy Day Masses continues until
 further notice. We encourage you continue to utilize our resources in maintain/meeting your
 spiritual needs (e.g., watching our livestreamed Mass)
- Those who are at higher risk of COVID-19 (e.g. 65 years or older or those who have underlying health conditions) are strongly advised to continue staying home
- We will continue to livestream our 11 a.m. Mass
- Parishioners to bring their own hand sanitizers and masks

Sanitation Information

- All touched surfaces will be sanitized after every Mass
- Volunteers and ushers will be present to provide further assistance in ensuring guidelines are followed for additional safety and help provide direction

Entrance and Exit

- Entrance into the Church: side entrance/doors facing the courtyard
- Exiting the Church: main doors facing the street note: Seniors and those with disabilities who need further assistance may exit out of the side doors to access stairs or ramp

Beginning of Mass

- Temperature of each person will be taken upon entrance of the Church
- Each person will be given a number and escorted to their assigned seat
- Stay in your assigned seat and limit movement as much as possible

During Mass

- Holy Communion is distributed only to the Liturgical ministers at the usual time during mass.
 Communion for our parishioners in the pews will be distributed immediately after the conclusion of Mass with no recessional song
- Holy communion will be given only by section and by pew
- After receiving communion, people may depart after a brief prayer of thanksgiving

After Mass

- After all the people have exited, the pews will be sanitized using wipes or sanitizer machine
- Church will be closed then re-opened 15 minutes before next Mass to allow adequate sanitizing
