OUR MISSION / NUESTRA MISION:

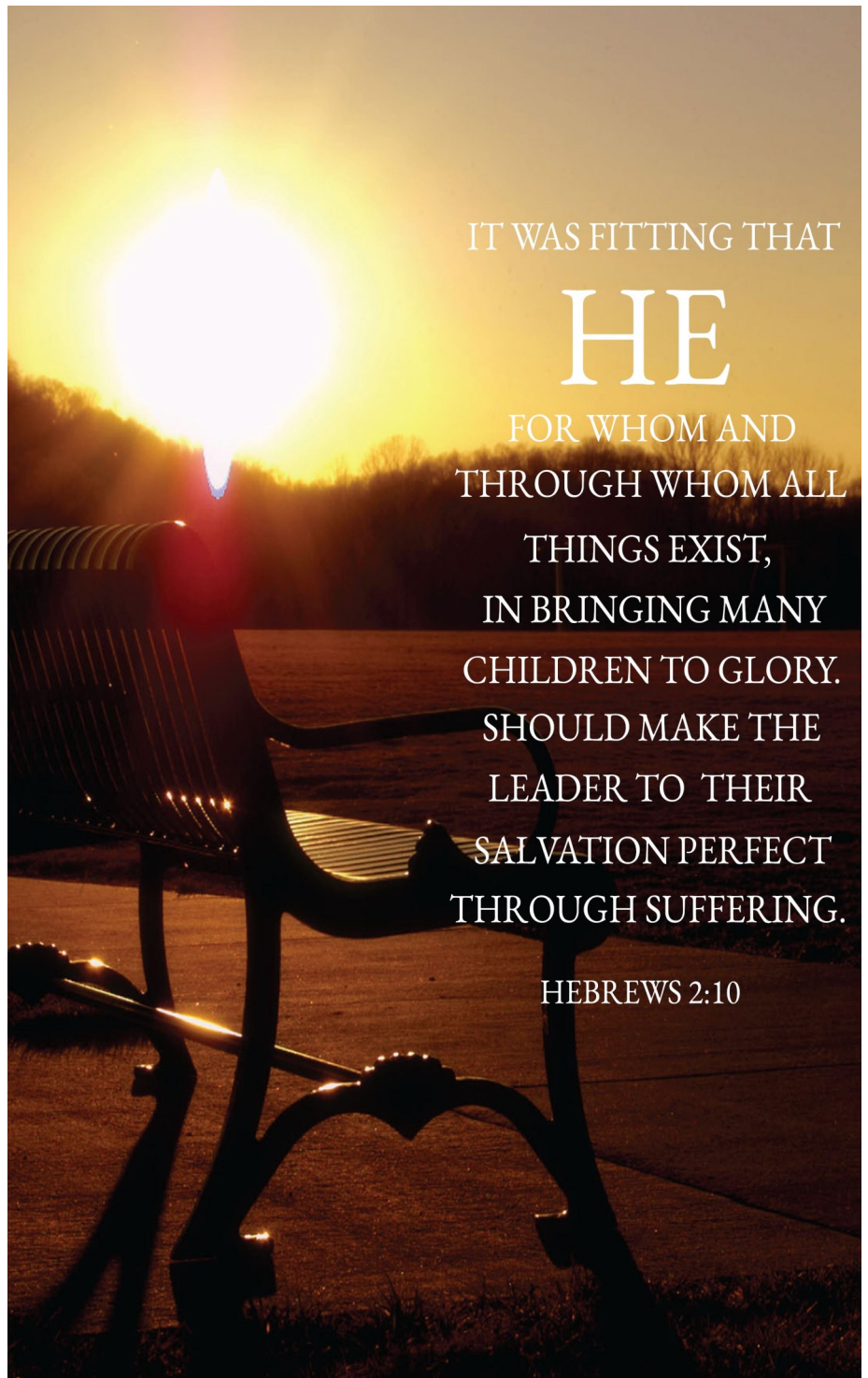
Inspired by the saints, we aspire to become authentic missionary disciples of Jesus Christ.

A Suitable Partner

In the story of the creation of the first woman, the Hebrew word *ezer* is used to describe her relationship with the first man. Many Bibles translate that word as "helper" or "helpmate," thus making the woman an addition to the man. The *Lectionary* translates the word as "suitable partner," emphasizing mutuality rather than subservience. Since the word is generally used for divine assistance, it certainly does not imply inferiority.

Another important Hebrew word is *bad*, usually translated as "alone." A common meaning is "separated from," implying incompleteness in a relationship. This incompleteness is remedied when the man is given a suitable partner, one who is as intimate a companion to him as are his bones.

The intimacy of this relationship of mutuality is found in the Gospel passage as well. There the focus is

on the endurance of the relationship. Jesus insists that the bond that joins the couple together must not be severed. Many today might find this ruling too rigid. Things can happen in intimate relationships; partners can grow apart; staying together could become dangerous. While these are valid concerns today, women in the patriarchal society of the time would see Jesus' interpretation of the law as protecting them. By law only men could divorce their wives, and reasons for doing so could be as trivial as poor cooking.

Today's readings remind us of our need for intimate relationships of mutuality. They further underscore how important it is to cherish such relationships and to nurture them by respecting our partners.

Un socio adecuado

En la historia de la creación de la primera mujer, la obra hebrea *ezer* se usa para describir su relación con el primer hombre. Muchas Biblias traducen esa palabra como "ayudante" o "ayudante", lo que convierte a la mujer en una adición al hombre. El Leccionario traduce la palabra como "socio adecuado", enfatizando la reciprocidad en lugar de la servidumbre. Dado que la palabra se usa generalmente para la asistencia divina, ciertamente no implica inferioridad. Otra palabra hebrea importante es *mala*, generalmente traducida como "solo". Un significado común es "separado de", lo que implica que una relación está incompleta. Esta falta de plenitud se remedia cuando se le da al hombre un compañero adecuado, uno que sea un compañero tan íntimo para él como sus huesos. La intimidad de esta relación de reciprocidad se encuentra también en el pasaje del Evangelio. Allí, la atención se centra en la resistencia de la relación. Jesús insiste en que el vínculo que une a la pareja no debe romperse. Hoy en día, muchos podrían encontrar esta regla demasiado rígida. Pueden suceder cosas en las relaciones íntimas; los socios pueden separarse; permanecer juntos podría volverse peligroso. Si bien estas son preocupaciones válidas hoy en día, las mujeres en la sociedad patriarcal de la época verían que la interpretación de Jesús de la ley las protege. Por ley, solo los hombres podían divorciarse de sus esposas, y las razones para hacerlo podían ser tan triviales como una mala cocina. Las lecturas de hoy nos recuerdan nuestra necesidad de relaciones íntimas de reciprocidad. Además, subrayan lo importante que es apreciar esas relaciones y nutrir las respetando a nuestros socios.

In today's climate of COVID-19 many may have over purchased items back in 2020 that are not perishable (dry beans, pastas, canned goods). Your intentions for purchasing those items were to eat them. If they are still in on your shelf unopened don't toss them before reading this first.

DECIIPHERING DATES ON PRODUCTS



Food date labels have little to do with safety and are only loosely related to quality. Many foods will still be good to eat well after those dates.

Here's how to sort out just what those dates mean:

BEST IF USED BY/ BEST BEFORE

These dates refer to peak quality or freshness. They do not mean the food is spoiled or unsafe. Food with these dates should be safe to eat after the date has passed.

SELL BY

Ignore these dates as they are meant for store staff. They actually build in quality so that if the food is sold by that date, you will have top-quality shelf life once it's home.

FREEZE BY

One way to extend the life of food beyond its date is to freeze it. It's like pushing the pause button on your food.

BEWARE THE DANGER ZONE

The main criterion for evaluating food safety is the amount of time food spends in the temperature "danger zone" (40 - 120°F). Food left in a hot car for too long could be unsafe even before the date on the package. Also, be sure your fridge is kept below 40°F.

USE YOUR EYES AND NOSE

For the most part, you can trust your senses to know when food has gone bad. The products to be careful with are those that pregnant women are told to avoid.
