

Unpacking the Word

Deuteronomy 26:4-10

With the beginning of the Lenten Season, the first readings at Mass will retell the story of salvation history through its key events and with a special emphasis on the Passover. This week's reading summarizes the period of the Patriarchs–Jacob is the "wandering Armenian" whose descendants "went down to Egypt" according to the Lord's promise to Abraham as recounted in Genesis–through the events of the Exodus. The passage from Deuteronomy comes from the end of the section of covenant stipulations (5:1-26:19), just before the covenant ceremony in 27:1-14.

Our reading this week also, presents Moses' instruction for a one-time offering to the Lord of one tenth of the produce of the land, held in the "basket," as a special act of gratitude for the gift of the Promised Land. This is similar to but also in addition to the annual offering of first fruits detailed in 18:4. Moses instructs the Israelites to come to the Temple regularly to worship the Lord and to make a gratitude offering from the fruits of their labors, from compensation of their work. Part of the worship involves recounting salvation history and the great actions of the Lord. Remembrance is important in worship, as Jesus also highlights while instituting the Eucharist as an act of remembrance. Recalling our covenant stories, offering the Lord a portion of our money, and praise in his presence as a community are the key elements of the worship that we owe to the Lord.

As Lent begins again, the Spirit reminds us of these important details that will make this season more fruitful. Remember the great deeds of the Lord from salvation history as well as from your own history. What have been the highs and lows of your walk with the Lord?
