Mary says 'Yes' to God

The Solemnity of **The Annunciation of the Lord** on Tuesday, March 25, celebrates the visit of the Archangel Gabriel to the Virgin Mary to announce the special mission God chose for her.

The angel tells Mary that by the Holy Spirit she would conceive and bear the Son of God. It marks the beginning of Jesus' earthly life and the fulfillment of God's promise to send a savior.

Mary asks what this message means. Then she says 'yes' to God. Mary believes and trusts His plan, knowing that nothing is impossible for Him.

From The Angelus

The Angel of the Lord declared to Mary:

And she conceived of the Holy Spirit.

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee; blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.



FATHER JIM'S WEEKLY REFLECTIONS

Third Sunday of Lent

In our first reading today, God charges Moses from the burning bush to lead the enslaved Hebrew people in Egypt to the Promised Land in what will become Israel. Lent is a call for us to renounce the slavery of sin and to embrace the true freedom that comes from Christ. The parable of the fig tree in the Gospel this Sunday speaks of the patience of God who desires that the gifts we have bear fruit for ourselves and others. If not, the fig tree is to be cut down. By going to the sacrament of confession, we cut out the sin in our life so that the fruit of God's Divine Grace can be harvested.

Annunciation of the Lord

We celebrate this **Tuesday, March 25**, the announcement that the Archangel Gabriel brought to Mary that she would conceive the child Jesus by the Holy Spirit. The early Church Fathers often referred to Mary as the New Eve, in which she would respond generously and faithfully to God. Mary teaches us how to discern and respond to the Divine Grace of God who so generously blesses us.

LENTEN SEASON

Encountering the Healing Power of God

Divine Grace parishioners filled the Holy Redeemer Catholic Center on Saint Patrick's Day to kick off the **Lenten Parish Mission**, and the celebration kept on going Tuesday and Wednesday. Evangelist **Sonja Corbitt** shared her conversion story of growing up Baptist in North Carolina, angry with her father, and upset that her congregation split—twice.

After moving to Tennessee, Sonja joined another Baptist church, teaching Bible Study and Sunday School. Then a young friend introduced her to the Catholic faith. She attended an Easter Vigil Mass, but wasn't a believer until she picked up the Catechism of the Catholic Church, beginning a journey that first led Sonja to the faith, then her two children, and lastly her husband.

Exploring the mission theme, "Encountering the Healing Power of God," she described how Jesus helped heal her through the Greatest Commandment, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. (Matthew 22:37-40)"

"Lent for us used to be about preparing for Easter, and giving up things," says **Joyce Gaydosz**. "Lent was very basic. Now we're trying to learn more about our Catholic faith every day."

Her husband **Michael** has steadily grown in his faith, attending daily Mass, making the First Saturdays devotion, praying the Angelus and listening to Catholic podcasts.

Michael has been involved in parish evangelization efforts and men's fellowship with **Father Joe Freedy**, his college roommate and good friend. Joyce serves on the pastoral council and is an extraordinary minister of Holy Communion.

Their three daughters have been involved in the parish and in Saint Gregory School. **Myah**, 15, who graduated last year and is in a Catholic high school, attends Mass regularly, prays the rosary daily, is an altar server and cantor, and participates in youth ministry. **Bella**, two years younger, is an altar server and likes to attend Mass before school with her father.

Norah, 6, came home from school last month and announced, "I know what I'm going to do for Lent. I'm going to be nice to everyone!"

"We try to balance church, school and family time," Joyce says. "We're not perfect. We just love our faith and are working on it."

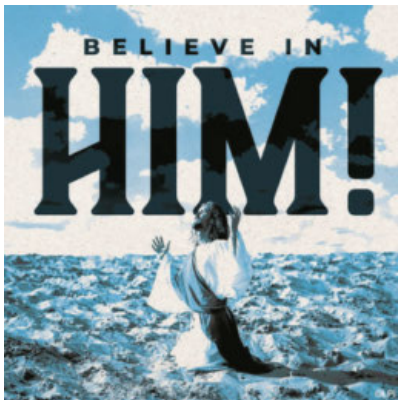

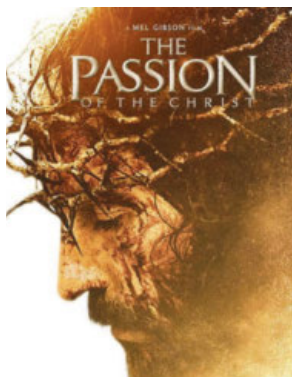

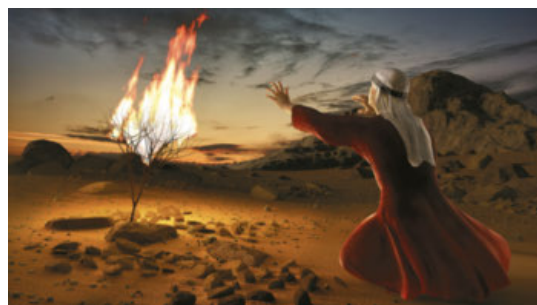
Unpacking the Word

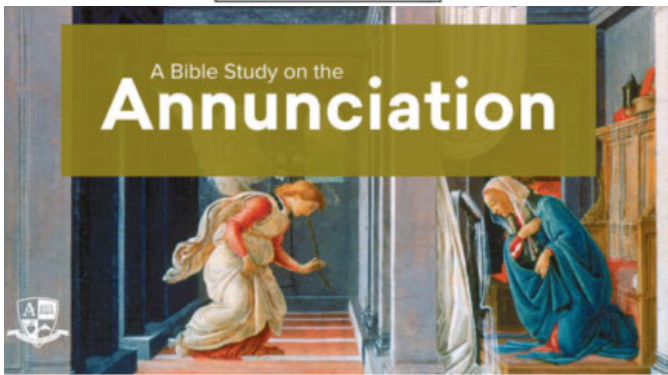
Exodus 3:1–8a, 13–15

Last week’s first reading presented the Abraham phase of salvation history through one of the Lord’s covenants with the great patriarch. This week, the focus shifts to the Moses phase, where the Lord fulfills one of his covenant promises to Abraham that his countless descendants would inherit the Promised Land. The famous burning bush passage that we read this week marks the beginning of the Lord’s interventions in history to bring about the Exodus and its liturgical remembrance in the Passover.

When the Lord appears to Moses, he is tending sheep. In the middle of the ordinary hustle and bustle of life, the Lord bursts onto the scene in a flaming, speaking bush. Despite his otherworldliness, he says, “I know well what [my people] are suffering.” He is personally invested in them, in us, even revealing his name: I AM. It is a form of the Hebrew verb “to be.” God is the One who exists. He has no beginning and no end. He is existence itself, the only Necessary Being, which a greater cannot be thought. Because this sacred name cannot be spoken without taking it upon oneself—“I am,” not “he is”—the Jewish people would not speak it. In the Scriptures, it is rendered as LORD in all capital letters. When we as Christians refer to Jesus as Lord, we refer to this name. Jesus himself applies the divine name to himself on several occasions: “Before Abraham was, I AM” (John 8:58).

The Spirit reminds us that the One who always exists, the One who must exist, knows well what you are suffering. He wants to show up in the ordinary places of your life, indeed within your suffering, not simply to take it away but to elevate it, to give it eternal value by uniting it to his own suffering to bring about the redemption of the world. May this Lent remind us of our need for a Savior and of the value of bearing wrongs patiently and offering up our suffering.

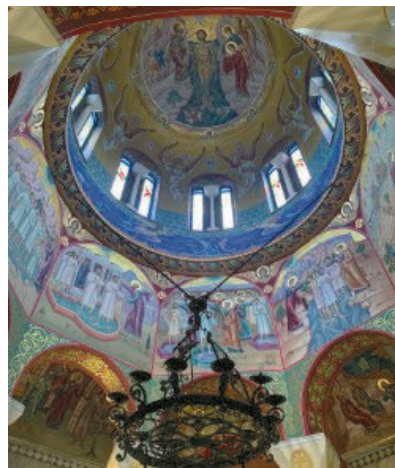
FOLLOWING THE FOOTSTEPS OF SAINT PAUL

Seminarians **Erik Pintar** and **Chris Baker** have returned from their *Footsteps of Saint Paul Pilgrimage to Greece and Turkey*. The following is excerpted from Chris's reflection.



After 10 days, nine flights and over 13,800 miles of travel, it is good to be home—but what an experience! On February 28 our group flew to Chicago, then Frankfurt, Germany, before arriving in **Thessaloniki, Greece**, where Saint Paul wrote his letters to the Thessalonians. We toured the ancient Agora Square, the Amphitheater, and an underground Roman road.

The next day I spent a Holy Hour in the Greek Orthodox Holy Church of All Saints, then traveled to the Holy Church of Saint Demetrius, a 4th century Christian martyr. We also stopped in **Kalambaka**, site of the Meteora Monasteries which were built into rock. Later we prayed in the Church of the Dormission of Mary. Before leaving Thessaloniki we went for a run up to the Monastery of the Holy Trinity, then went to **Philippi**.

Our visit to **Ephesus, Turkey**, was amazing. We saw ancient ruins of a city inhabited long before the Romans founded a colony in the 2nd century B.C, along with the old library and the largest amphitheater in the world, only part of which is unearthed. We were moved to tears while visiting the house of the Blessed Virgin Mary, where she lived with the Beloved Disciple, John.

Traveling to **Athens**, the highlight was the Acropolis lit up at night.

We sampled many foods, toured holy sites, saw beautiful iconography and prayed constantly. Thank you for your prayers.

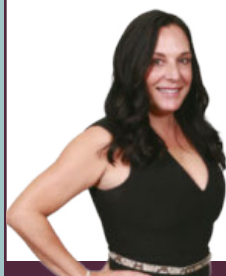

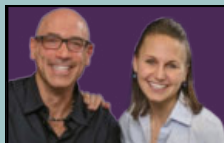
