



Saying 'Yes' to Jesus

With the College of Cardinals preparing to choose a successor to Pope Francis, Saint John's Gospel describing how Jesus revealed himself at the Sea of Tiberias provides a powerful witness to the importance of leadership in the Church.

Jesus shows mercy and forgiveness towards Peter who had denied him three times, asking him to shepherd His people. It is a call for Peter and all disciples to follow the Lord and share the Good News, no matter how great the cost.

As we continue our Easter journey, may we always be ready to say 'yes' to Jesus.

FATHER JIM'S WEEKLY REFLECTIONS

Third Sunday of Easter

In the Gospel for this weekend, Jesus appears the third time to the apostles while they were fishing in the Sea of Tiberias. When Peter recognized Jesus standing on the shore, he jumped from the boat and ran towards him. This is an aspect of our spirituality as Catholics – we run to encounter Jesus at Mass in the Holy Eucharist. Peter then answers three questions Jesus asks about Peter's love for Him. In Peter, Jesus gives the mission to the Church to feed His sheep.

Pray with the Cardinals

God has already chosen the new Pope – the cardinals must now pray and discern the Providence of the Lord as they participate in the conclave to elect the new Pope. The Church prays for the cardinals to receive the Divine Grace of God to carry out their sacred duties. The conclave will begin on Wednesday, May 7, with one ballot taking place in the afternoon. If the Pope is not elected on Wednesday, there will be 4 ballots a day until the new Pope is elected by two-thirds majority.



Brother Ryan Schmeltzer, OFM Cap., a lifelong member of Saint Ferdinand Church who joined the Capuchins as a seminarian, was ordained to the Order of Deacon on **Saturday, May 3**. 
Applications for the **Rachel A. Mogielski Scholarship** are now available. This \$2,000 federal and state-recognized scholarship is open to all graduating high school seniors.

PITTSBURGH'S CONCLAVE CONNECTION



In the Vatican conclave that will discern who will succeed Pope Francis, four cardinals have close connections to Pittsburgh. Father Jim Wehner described the cardinals in his presentation, *The Death of a Pope – The Election of a Pope*. Those under age 80 are eligible to vote for the new pope.

Cardinal Daniel N. DiNardo, 75, who recently retired as prelate of the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston, grew up in Castle Shannon and was ordained in the Diocese of Pittsburgh in 1977. He served as the founding pastor of Saints John & Paul in Franklin Park.

Cardinal Sean P. O'Malley, 80, retired from the Archdiocese of Boston, also lived in the South Hills and was graduated from Saint Fidelis High School Seminary in Herman. He was ordained to the Order of Friars Minor Capuchin in Lawrenceville in 1970.

Cardinal Adam J. Maida, 95, retired leader of the Archdiocese of Detroit, attended Saint Vincent College and was ordained in the Diocese of Pittsburgh in 1956. A canon lawyer, he taught law at Duquesne University and theology at LaRoche College.

Cardinal Donald W. Wuerl, 84, was ordained in 1966 and was consecrated as auxiliary bishop of Seattle in 1985. Three years later he was named Bishop of Pittsburgh and in 2006 was assigned as Archbishop of Washington, D.C. Elevated to cardinal in 2010, he retired seven years ago.

Unpacking the Word

Acts 5:27-32, 40b-41

The early chapters of the Acts of the Apostles showcase Peter's role as the leader of Jesus' Church. Our reading this week comes from the second time he was imprisoned with the Apostles for preaching. This time was a bit comical as angels broke them out of their cells in the middle of the night, and so when the chief priests sent for them in the morning, they couldn't find them. Eventually they discovered Peter and the others preaching in the Temple area, the same act for which they were arrested in the first place.

In this power struggle between the old priestly leadership of the Sanhedran and the new priestly leadership of Peter and the Apostles, Peter articulates a key principle for all of us: We must obey God rather than men. Throughout history, followers of Jesus have felt pressure to obey human authority rather than divine authority. Sometimes it's from a supervisor or a spouse, and others it's from your kid's soccer coach or your best friend. Wherever the pressure comes from, the principle holds true: we must obey God above all others. As Christians, it is our duty to bring the laws, rules, regulations, and practices around us into harmony with divine law, and to make a difficult stand for the Gospel if that fails.

We sometimes miss that this is the very same Sanhedrin who little more than a month before arranged for Jesus' crucifixion. Peter and the Apostles must have realized that they were in mortal danger and may even have expected to die. And yet they were excited to suffer dishonor for being Christians, seeing it as something they had to be worthy of. Are you excited for your neighbors to think you're a bit strange because you follow Jesus and refuse to miss Mass on Sunday? Are you worthy of your family members thinking you're a religious fanatic because you're into all this God stuff?






